

#### We are the church

Dear Friends,

I was sent the picture below by someone who works for the Anglican Communion (the organisation which represents the Church of England worldwide). It is one of several symbols in the public domain along the same lines (see Dave Walker's cartoon for the *Church Times*, for example).

The design makes us think, because it plays on a common misconception which, in many cases, the Church itself has done little to clarify. This misconception is that by church, we mean a building, called the church. In fact, the church building would be the more accurate way of describing it.

'The church' is a term that really refers to the people who worship inside it; in other words, the community of worshippers who regularly meet in the church building. It is in this sense that 'The church does not close, only the building.'





The Church of St Andrew's Oxshott is spread out locally, living within this and other nearby communities. Part of our church's published vision is that we want to 'serve the community.' We know we are not alone in these efforts, but currently we have people praying for all whose lives have been disrupted by this ghastly virus; listening to the lonely, ill and bereaved; phoning lonely people for chats on a regular basis; delivering prescriptions and shopping to those isolating themselves; helping run the Cobham Area foodbank; and members meeting, preaching, praying and learning together via Zoom (see our website for other activities). We long to do more.

If you have any suggestions for how we can help anyone in these difficult times, or you yourself would like to volunteer or, conversely, would appreciate some help, please ring us on 01372 842071: we would love to hear from you.

## Easter with a difference

Covid-19 is affecting every part of our lives, not least how we worship together. **Jill Mengham** reflects on a very strange Easter...

verything is different at the moment – how we work, how we shop, how we socialise, how we live! And the same was true of how we celebrated Easter at St Andrew's. Yet, as Frances suggested in her Easter message (*Listen & Pray Easter Sunday* on the St Andrew's website), perhaps this Easter was a much closer experience to how the first Easter would have been, when the disciples were afraid, confused, locked away for fear of 'the enemy'.

Faced with all of the above emotions, I found the Holy Week Reflections and Easter Day services very comforting. Yes, they were different, but it really made me appreciate how blessed we are to be able to celebrate our Christian faith so openly in 'normal' times. Of course I missed singing my heart out; the outburst of joy at 'He is risen indeed, alleluia'; the fellowship and feeling of community. But there was joy of a different kind.

In previous years, we have held the Holy Week Reflections in the Chancel – in the heart of God's house, seated around his table, reflecting together on all that Christ has done for us. This year, as we followed Frances' reflections from the website recordings, I felt that God was in each of *our* houses, seated at *our* tables, reflecting with each of us *personally* on all that Christ has done for us. I know that God is with us always, but this new, 'individual' Holy Week and Easter experience made the closeness of God all the more poignant.

Would I want to continue worshipping this way? No, of course not. I long for the days when we can rejoice *together* in all things. But out of every difficult situation, God brings good, and I pray that each of us is able to feel an extra sense of closeness to God as we go through this very difficult time. Being isolated with God makes being isolated so much more bearable. *[ill Mengham]*

We seek his kingdom and values in our homes & community. We ask for daily bread, for all. We practice forgiveness – for impatience in the home and the inequality



exposed by this coronavirus. We pray to a powerful God for deliverance and that our lives may bring him glory.

Here in Oxshott, St Andrew's will therefore do all we can to join in with the global call to pray *Thy Kingdom Come!* We invite you to join us as we do so between Ascension, 21 May, and Pentecost, 31 May.

  critical time for:
  - o Our 30 local businesses & shops 9.45 to 11.15am on Wed. 27 May
  - Our local schools and community groups 2pm to 3.30pm on Thurs.
     28 May
- Encourage everyone to pray as they take their daily exercise, for the homes, people and places they see.



an you believe it's 10 years since Josey Wisdom joined St Andrew's as Youth and Children's Pastor? Where does one even start to cover the huge impact she has had on so many?

Josey's work with children, families and young people has evolved greatly over the 10 years, reflecting the need to address social and churchgoing trends, and enabling her to build strong relationships with young people both at St Andrew's and in the wider community.

As well as leading regular Sunday programmes and services, Josey has been instrumental in introducing the informal and popular Oxshott Family Praise service on the first Sunday of each month, and the more recent 'familes@4' initiative, where children are encouraged to bring their parents



to an 'Open the Book' style gathering on a Saturday afternoon followed by pizza! In the community, Josey has been especially committed to working with schools to build strong relationships with St Andrew's and spread the Word amongst young people.

Many in RKS and Bevendean will recognize Josey from her regular 'Open the Book' assemblies,

bringing bible stories to life (though they are just as likely to know her in character as a shepherd, disciple, or even an animal!).

These children have also had the opportunity to delve deeper into Christian beliefs with the fun and interactive Christmas and Easter workshops, a huge amount of work on Josey's part, but another example of her dedication to her work with children. And amongst our warmest reflections of Josey are the many young people who have enjoyed the weekly Youth Club, OY, meeting together on Friday evenings for fun activities ranging from football to crafts, from cooking to water games.

Dealing with our current challenges in the UK is a strain...

...but we are still very fortunate

Whilst I was worried about whether I would get enough toilet roll on our next weekly shop

Patricia in Matopeni, Kenya, was giving thanks for the clean toilet block in her community and wishes all children like her in Matopeni were as lucky.

Whilst I was stressing about whether I could get my favourite type of pasta Fatima in Malawi (opposite) was rightly worried about whether she would be able to have any food to feed her family

Whilst I was stressing about whether I could still get my normal brand of sparkling water

Rose in Kenya was worrying whether she would find water at the water hole six miles from her home

Whilst I was worried what the supermarket shelves would look like after they had been stripped bare by a swarm of people

Joseph in Wamba, Kenya, was worrying about what how he would feed his family now that the locust swarms have destroyed all his crops

Whilst I worry about how the children will cope with their schooling via on-line lessons

Musah and Fatima in Ghana are wishing that more children like them had the opportunity to go to school

Whilst I worry about whether I'm the right distance from others when I take my daily exercise so I don't become a virus transmitter

Hassan, who is in a refugee camp in the Lebanon, knows he is too far from his mother and brother who are in Europe getting medical help and too close to the other refugees in the camp to provide safety from the coronavirus

Whilst we are finding things tough at the moment, please spare a thought for those in poverty in this world who face greater challenges each day of their lives than we face at the moment

#### Fatima's story

Fatima Baela, aged 43, is married, with five children.

She lives in Nsanje, Malawi, where Christian Aid's partner, Churches Action in Relief and Development (CARD), began supporting some 1,000 female-headed households with small cash transfers in August. Severe drought stunted Fatima's maize crops. She and her husband took odd jobs, but the family survived on one meal a day, made from lily tubers. As odd jobs grew scarce, Fatima thought her family would die of hunger.

"The cash transfer through CARD has transformed us. I received a monthly allowance of MK20,000 to buy a bag of maize, cooking oil and three packets of sugar. My family now eats three meals per day. This is a miracle to me. Thank you very much."

## Unprecedented

If there is one word that is working overtime at the present it is 'unprecedented'. We are tempted to think that what we fear and feel now has never been feared or felt before. It can be reassuring to learn that this is not the case. Humankind has been there before and got through it. And so, with God's help, can we.

Where is God in a coronavirus world? is the title of a short book (just over 50 pages) written to show how the Christian worldview can help us make sense of a pandemic that challenges so many of our certainties.

It's an easy read, well researched and the final chapter is very practical. The author, an Oxford professor, introduces the book in this way; "I would invite you, the reader, to view the book like this: we are sitting in a coffee shop (if only we could!) and you have asked me the question on the book cover. I put down my coffee cup and attempt to give you an honest answer. What follows is what I would try to say in order to convey some comfort, support and hope."




## Annual Parochial APCM Church Meeting

#### Sea view

n such a strange, unsettling period as we are all going through, OACS felt very fortunate to have been able to fit in our March demonstration before Covid-19 brought virtually everything to a halt!

Our demonstrator was popular local artist, Jim Hanlon (right), who was visiting us for the first time and, judging by the feedback later, not the last.

His brief was to produce a coastal scene for us in acrylic and, for this, Jim had chosen a cliff top view of Mullion Cove, near the Lizard in Cornwall – a popular choice with the members!

Working on board, primed with sienna acrylic, applied with a house painting brush, to give texture, and using a flat head brush, the artist sketched in his composition with burnt umber. Using a high position on a coastline, Jim finds, enables him

to adopt the 'zigzag' composition used by Baroque and Renaissance painters. To avoid too much detail, he used a large flat brush, beginning with the sea and dabbing white along the base of the cliffs, to define the shapes of the rocks. Next, he painted the sky, followed by the weathered strata of the cliffs, the rocks and closer water. And, finally, the cliff top. After a few minor additions and alterations, we had our delightful view of Mullion Cove.

We always welcome new members or guests to our meetings, whatever level of experience or expertise, and these are normally held at the Oxshott Village Hall on the second Tuesday of the month, from 7.45 to 9.45pm.

Unfortunately, our summer meetings in May and June have now had to be postponed until a later date, due to the coronavirus.



We were also very disappointed to have to cancel our Spring exhibition, on 25 and 26 April. This is always popular and includes a colourful variety of artwork and crafts, not to mention home baking!

We hope to be back to normal in September, and will publish further details nearer the time.


This influx had raised serious concerns over compliance with the government's rules on separation distances, to which many of our visitors did not appear to be adhering.







## Covid-19 slows Danes Hill progress

riends of Oxshott (FOX) continues to meet regularly with representatives of the School however progress on a number of things has inevitably been held up by COVID-19. At the date of writing, the School is closed at both sites as advised by the Government.

Provision was made to continue the on-site education of those children whose parents are key workers until the end of last term, but it is of course now the Easter holiday. As with other schools, it is unclear when it will be possible to reopen.

Nevertheless work on the Sports Hall continues. As Sarah Colenso noted in the April edition, work was continuing largely according to plan although it was running four weeks behind schedule as a result of delays caused by the heavy rain earlier this year. Construction is continuing now with workers required to observe safe distance rules, which will presumably also slow things down. Work ceased for a few days over the Easter weekend but recommenced on Tuesday 14 April. A number of residents have raised concerns about the visibility of the new building and we have passed these comments to the School and requested that this is dealt with by appropriate screening as soon as possible.

#### Access to the School

One of the most common causes of complaint is the unauthorised use of Wren's Hill to access the School's main site and related concerns expressed by residents about traffic volumes and speeding. The use of the car park and gate on Wren's Hill should be restricted to staff, although of course the number of cars that involved has increased significantly as the School has expanded. The School says it has asked parents not to use the Wren's Hill entrance at any time. However it is clear that some Danes Hill parents and perhaps more particularly, visiting parents from other schools attending sports events, are still trying to access the School via Wren's Hill. One solution may be for the gate to be locked at weekends to prevent its use by any parents, although that wouldn't prevent people trying.

The School has offered to fund reasonable safety and other improvements in the form of additional signage, lighting and speed management measures. However, since it is not their land they can obviously only do so once it is clear what measures would have the support of local residents. Individual local residents' views vary and we have received a number of suggestions. The School has therefore agreed to work with local residents in Wren's Hill and Knott Park to review the options available, potentially with the aid of an external consultant.

The chairs of the Wren's Hill and Knott Park Residents' Associations have met to consider options, but the COVID-19 lockdown has put on hold a meeting with the School and advisers to explore these options more fully. This will be recommenced once lockdown restrictions are eased sufficiently.

Since the beginning of the school year Sarah Colenso (their Local Community Liaison Officer) has helpfully provided regular updates of scheduled School events at both sites which FOX has been able to provide to its supporters in advance. Unfortunately, since the School was closed there have been a couple of instances of unexpected construction noise and traffic at the main site. The main problem was in fact caused by workmen on site employed by the electricity provider to repair a cable failure. The School took immediate action once the problems were reported, but we have asked if advance warning could in future be given of construction activity.

#### Signs of Spring

Hopefully you have all now noticed that the area in front of Broom Hall on the side of the A244, which was developed by Surrey CC at the request of the School two years ago, is now looking much better (see below). It is pleasing to see that many of the bulbs the School planted recently, which we thought would only flower next year, have in fact flowered this Spring.



## Cultural learning curve – in Italy

have always been interested in art history. On leaving school in 1968 my parents suggested a gap year in Florence studying at the British lacksquare Institute. But how to pay for these lessons? Mamoo suggested that I show visiting Americans the

sights of Florence ... once I had learnt my own way around! Big learning curve – always do a recce first ... as I now do before taking ASCO (The Arts Society Cobham & Oxshott) groups on a visit.

Next month – how I earned enough lira (1,483 to the £ in those days) to pay for those organ lessons.


