

Autumn Harvest!



Dear Friends,

Anyone for sloe gin? It's that time of year when people are making good use of both the wild harvest on the heath and those from the garden or allotment. With world-wide interest in growing vegetables and fruit reaching new heights during lockdown the harvest in 2020 may be especially significant. Personally, it has been a mixed year,



As St Andrew's we will thank God for this year's harvest on Sunday 4 October at 10am in church (please see our website for details of how to join us). And once again, we want to encourage everyone who lives in Oxshott to be a part of the festival of thanksgiving by donating goods to the Cobham Area Foodbank. In this way we can not only express our gratitude to God for his provision to us, but also continue to serve our community.

The need to support the foodbank has, sadly, never been greater. According to their website:

In the six-month period from January to June 2020 the average weekly distribution of food and supplies has increased from 600 kilos to 1,000 kilos.

With furlough almost at an end and job losses likely to continue to soar over the winter, this need is not going to diminish any time soon.

There are two different methods by which private individuals can contribute: one is to deposit food in the temporary foodbank crates we will have at St Andrew's church (during our restricted opening hours), and the other is by transferring money direct. Instructions for both methods and a list of goods most needed are found on page 13 of this magazine. In addition, if you are the owner of a business there is a way to offer corporate support (see the foodbank website).

Please let's be as generous as we can to those in our community who are finding life tough as we celebrate God's provision for another year.

Rocha is a Christian charity working for the restoration and protection of the natural world. on 4 October we will celebrate Harvest here at St Andrew's, and A Rocha's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Andy Atkins (right) will be our 'visiting' speaker. He will challenge us all to put our faith into practice through active care for our environment.


Activities for children & families (StAks@home) that weekend will have a similar focus, involving generous sharing of gifts with the local Foodbank, learning more about climate change and our environment,

and going home with ideas about how we can each make a difference.

The decision to link with A Rocha (UK) reflects the PCC's concern that we 'strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth' – this is the fifth of the Anglican Communion's 'Five Marks of Mission' (see panel on page 7).

For this reason, St Andrew's has also registered as an 'EcoChurch', which means we are now part of a growing network of over 2,000 churches learning more about the environmental implications of our Christian faith and

being inspired to take action. Raymond & Lilian Coe have conducted a thorough audit and identified a few challenges for St Andrew's, not least (continued on page 7)

Where does the name 'A Rocha' come from?

'A Rocha' is the Portuguese for 'the rock' – because back in 1983, **A Rocha Trust** was set up as a UK charity to establish a Christian field study centre in the Algarve.

A Rocha is now an international network of environmental organisations with a Christian ethos, and is present in 21 countries around the world.

Autumn plans for StAks!

StAks is the name for St Andrew's Kids' church, and StAks@home is just what it sounds – bringing some of what we might usually do on Sunday into our homes, whilst we can't meet together.

Over about 20 minutes of online video we share songs, stories, some thoughts about faith and life, and prayer, at a level accessible for primary school aged children (4-11 years old), but we hope with wider appeal too! You can find the StAks@home videos on the St Andrew's website: www.standrewsoxshott.org.uk/staks-at-home/

We are also now beginning to plan some interactive, 'real life' events, to take place over the Autumn term, which we hope will give us a bit more of an opportunity to be 'together', though we remain apart. These events will happen in a variety of ways, but will all be very carefully managed to ensure they are Covid safe.

The first of these will take place at Harvest. On 4 October, as we thank God for all he gives us, we will create a number of non-contact prayer stations with activities themed around Creation and our

care for the natural world. We will invite people to safely engage with these in the church gardens across the day, as well as offering some Creation Care ideas and challenges to try out at home.

Around the end of October, as the evenings start to draw in, we will think about Light and Darkness with bonfires and toasted marshmallows, and some fun at-home activities which we can share with our families, and 'virtually' together.

For Remembrance, we will help people create a space and time for remembrance in their own gardens as families, allowing many small acts and markers of remembrance to be spread across the whole village.

We do hope these events might be refreshing and enlivening

to our faith life over the Autumn, and might offer

something different to the online and on-screen activities with which we have all become familiar.

Vision Matters!

Our vision for St Andrew's sets the tone for everything we do as a church - as we are about to explore in depth. Jill Mengham outlines the weeks ahead...

t is two years since the vision for St Andrew's Oxshott was launched, and it continues to provide the guiding principles for everything that we L do at St Andrew's – to be followers of Jesus Christ, growing in faith, growing in number, and serving the community in which we live and work.

Our autumn sermon series is designed to raise the profile of the vision once more and to challenge every member of the church to live it out personally, as well as to seek to express these values as a whole church. The series title really means what it says!

Four elements

The four different elements of the vision will be visited in turn, starting with 'Followers of Jesus Christ' and moving through 'Growing in Faith', 'Growing in Number' and 'Serving the

Community', spending two weeks on each of these four statements.

The first week of each of the four 'pairs' is subtitled: 'Taking it in', which will focus on the biblical







foundation for that particular strand of the vision. The second week of the pair is sub-titled 'Living it out', in which we will use our new-found technology skills to demonstrate ways in which we can respond to the challenge of that particular strand of the vision.

And to add further interest to the series, on 4 October - Harvest Sunday - we have invited Andy Atkins from A Rocha (our new Mission Partner, as you will have read on page 5) - who will speak about 'Living out being a follower of Jesus Christ', as it specifically relates to God's creation.

All-in-all, we hope this will be an inspiring series of talks and activities and that they will provide an encouragement to each one of us as we start to be able to meet together as a church in the physical sense, as well as the spiritual.

Building Your Church in Oxshott

The church buildings may have had to close during lockdown - but plenty has been going on behind the scenes as we continue to plan for improvements to those very buildings. Jill Mengham explains...

ith the church buildings closed during coronavirus, a wide range of pastoral care and online prayer and services have been offered. But the Parochial Church Council (PCC) has also taken the opportunity to quietly reflect on the ancillary buildings that wrap around the church, and to continue to make plans for their redevelopment.

The starting point was to revisit the findings from the detailed research carried out in 2013/14, when we held focus groups within both the church



family and the community. Many people took part in that research - to ascertain what worked about the buildings and what didn't, how the buildings are currently used and what changes/additions/uses people would like to see. And this

research fed directly into the refurbishment of the church interior.

completed in 2014.

Most of that research work is still highly relevant and useful to us now, as we consider how to improve the ancillary buildings, except that the preschool nursery that used to meet on the church premises will be meeting in the Royal Kent School from January 2021.


Our aim and our desire is to create a place where people want to come, and that enables safe hospitality, social

connections and community support; that provides a less formal entrée to church and, in the process to have buildings that are more sustainable, presentable, flexible, accessible, practical, welcoming and that honour God.

We have been working with an architect over the last 8 months and we will soon have plans that we can share with everyone. More information will be given at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) on 4 October. and presentations of the plans will be arranged later in the year.

We hope you are excited, as we are, about the prospect of having a multi-purpose building at the heart of the village!




UFOs over Oxshott?

Recording for an organ 'concert' in St Andrew's required a lot of equipment, and not just our splendid organ, as **Carina Moffat** explains...

s the sun rose over St Andrew's on 28 August a sharp-eyed observer peering out of their bedroom window would have been surprised to see a strange object buzzing overhead.

Not an invading Unidentified Flying Object, but a drone swooping through the sky taking a bird's eye view of St Andrew's.



Inside, the church had been transformed into a recording studio. The Makin organ was moved to the centre and batteries of microphones and cameras had been set up to record the action.

Because the ChurchOrganWorld Summer concerts were cancelled due to coronavirus, they were making a video recording of Shean Bowers (from Bath Abbey) playing a variety of pieces including the popular Bach "D minor Toccata and Fugue", and "Sleigh Ride" by Leroy Anderson, music expressly

designed to display the range of stops and sound 'colours' of the instrument.

A virtual concert

Shean gave a brilliant and exciting performance, leaving those who were listening truly amazed at what he could do, especially as he had had only one week's notice to prepare the programme required, as the original organist was unwell. This recording will be combined with recordings of

the same programme from three other organists, in America and Holland, playing Johannus and Rogers instruments to produce a virtual ChurchOrganWorld 'concert' for Autumn and Christmas. St Andrew's will be given a copy when it becomes available.

The recording and video were organised by Shea Lolin, who is also a

qualified drone operator. It was fascinating to watch him manoeuvre the drone round the inside of the Church to get different view of the organist as he was playing.

The drone danced around the building avoiding the pillars and fittings, and Shea twiddled the knobs with effortless skill. No hanging lights were harmed during the making of this film!

The glorious summer we have had has given our members the perfect opportunity to get out and paint and I hope to be able to show some of their efforts next time.



Royal Kent: on track for the Ladybird!

The new Ladybird Nursery opens in January, after detailed preparations over the summer, as **Nigel Mengham** explains...

If you walked past the Royal Kent School on Oakshade Road at any time during the six weeks of the school holiday, you would have seen the builders hard at work.

The first phase was the sad removal of the Willow Tree that had been a landmark for many years, but the arboriculturists' prediction that the tree was rotting and unstable proved valid, and we were surprised just how far the rot had spread.

The second phase was the transformation of what had been the school library into a new classroom for the Ladybird Nursery. This included replacing the dilapidated conservatory-style roof, the addition of a new double-door

Ladybird Nursery will be a term-time only nursery available for 15 or 30 hours per week, where parents will be able to access Funded Early Education (FEE) for 3- and 4-year olds, as well as Funded Early Education for Two-year-olds (FEET funding).

At the time of going to press, there were still some spaces available for eligible children - interested parents are invited to submit their application for a place or places as soon as possible via the school office or website.

entrance and a complete refurbishment and decoration of the internal space.

Some of you may remember the fund-raising and construction of the library, which was completed in 1994 and has served the school well, and it is great that this space can now be re-used to house a new Nursery for Oxshott - generously funded by Elmbridge Borough Council.

The final phase of this summer's work was the construction of a new canopy and all-weather play area for the lucky Ladybird Class children. The external works are scheduled to be finished in the October half-term,

when a boundary fence and gates for the Nursery area will be constructed, together with a new access path for the Reception Class.

The school is now focussed on equipping the new Nursery and recruiting new staff in readiness for the opening in January 2021.



ASCO: greatest hits in 2020!

hile looking through the destinations visited by Cobham & Oxshott Arts Society members over the years, the sheer variety has surely offered something for everybody.

Popular destinations summarised below have ranged from Canterbury, Portsmouth and a museum near Chichester, to the BBC.



THE ARTS



St Augustine

Canterbury or Cantiacorum
was a Roman settlement along Watling Street. Guides
informed members that its importance grew in 597AD
when Pope Gregory sent a Benedictine missionary monk
to England to Christianise the pagan Anglo-Saxons.

His name was Augustine, and on arriving in Canterbury (the headquarters of the kings of Kent) he set about founding a monastery, later becoming England's first archbishop. His church, sited where the current nave is, was completely rebuilt by the Normans in 1070, with towers and vaulting added later.

The highlight for many at the **Portsmouth Naval Dockyard** was going aboard Vice-Admiral Lord Nelson's flagship HMS Victory. Low ceilinged decks were crammed with cannon either side of narrow planks of wood for

tables, below canvas bunks with yards of rope holding everything in place. The Battle of Trafalgar in 1805 proved a huge turning point in European history allowing Britain to rule the waves for a century.

Nearby, HMS Warrior dates from 1860 and at the time was the largest warship in the world. Once spied in the Channel, the French remained in their home waters with the result Warrior never fired a shot in anger.

Mention must be made of the Portsmouth Semaphore tower. In the 1820s, towers were built within sight of each other to send manually signalled messages from the Admiralty in London to the Portsmouth fleet. Our local semaphore link in the chain can still be visited on Chatley Heath, near Wisley gardens.

Not just a Repair Shop

The Weald and Downland Living Museum, which opened in 1970, is now famous as the location for *The Repair Shop*, a television programme where experts mend broken family treasures in a huge barn. Surrounded by the




