

The Monthly Letter

Getting reconnected

Dear Friends,

Community. What does this word mean to you? It might mean the tight-knit group of friends and family who have supported us through the last year or so. It might bring back fond images of Oxshott Village Days, or a great group of colleagues whom you have not seen for a year. For some it will represent a physical community, such as those



which exist locally at Sunrise, Gunters Mead or even Broom Hall.

At our annual away day (on zoom) for the church council, we were considering the current need expressed by many to experience a greater sense of community or 'connectedness' as we come out of this period of necessary isolation. Does this resonate with you?

Whether we are raging extroverts or introverts, we all need some sense of belonging, of community. Recent pictures of experimental capacity crowds for the Snooker World Championships and other events underline our desire for and our joy in connectedness and shared experiences.

Christians believe that God created us all with this innate need for connectedness. In the creation story in Genesis, God says, 'It is not good that the man should be alone...'

The crisis in poor mental health across all age groups as we emerge from the isolation of lockdown (especially among the elderly and young people) is evidence of this.

As a church we will be spending time in June, July and September looking at what the Bible teaches us about community: do join us if you wish, either in church or online (details are given elsewhere in this magazine and on our website).


However, the challenge is: what can we - you and I - do to re-create this sense of community so that no one is left out? Let's be prepared to start small but do something. Church ideas currently include adding more outside seating at the church, picnics, co-ordinated trips to the park and so on. If you have any ideas which you would like to share, please contact me via email. Let's be imaginative and aim for the whole community of Oxshott to become reconnected so that everyone flourishes.



Changes to Marriage Registrations

There was a poignant moment in church on 9 May, when Frances lead prayers of thanksgiving and blessing for all those whose weddings had been conducted in St Andrew's, Oxshott, and that had been registered in our historic, green registers. **Frances** explains why...


n 4 May 2021 the way in which all marriages are registered (whether conducted in church or elsewhere) changed. Government legislation now requires that, instead of the best man being entrusted with precious copies of the marriage certificates after the signing of the register (always a slightly nerve-racking moment!), all marriages are now to be registered on a single digital electronic Marriage Register operated by the GRO (General Register Office).

Making the change

Over the next few weeks, a representative from each of the churches (and other wedding venues) across the country is required to take all Marriage Registers and other documentation (including spare Marriage Certificates) in person to their local Registrar. Once the documents have been processed, each church is permitted to keep one of the two identical green Marriage Registers as an historic document.

As a church we will have a new Church Marriage Service Register, in which we will retain all details of church weddings. However, this is for

the record only; we will no longer be permitted to issue the usual Marriage Certificates.



However, there will actually be little change so far as couples marrying in church are concerned.

Banns will still be called (or licenses applied for, where relevant) by clergy, and a Marriage Document will be signed (and witnessed, with the opportunity for photographs) during the wedding service.

One positive aspect of this new legislation is that mothers' names and occupations are to be included in information provided (following the Registration of Marriage Bill, sponsored by the Bishop of St Albans). In addition, there will be opportunity for the bride and groom to add other

parents (in the case of adoptive and birth parents, for example, or a stepparent) to the form.

The couple will receive a certificate given by St Andrew's (or any local church) to say that the couple were married in the service on that historic day. Clergy are then responsible for sending in the

...the new rules are set out in the Registration of Marriages Regulations 2021, which essentially amend the procedures set out in the Marriage Act 1949.

copy (within 21 days) of the Marriage Document to the local Registrar, who will add the couple's details to a central digital Marriage Register.

The Superintendent Registrar will issue a Marriage Certificate at the request of the couple, but this will not be done automatically.


Looking forward

Cobham Area Foodbank

The foodbank is our Mission Partner, and we asked

Michael Flaxman, a Life Group member here
at St Andrew's, and a Foodbank Volunteer,
to update us on how things are going...


obham Area Foodbank is a project founded in 2013 by local churches and community groups, working together towards preventing hunger in our local area covering Cobham, Oxshott, Stoke D'Abernon, Downside, East & West Horsley, and Effingham.

As one of our local Mission Partners, St Andrew's continues to provide support through both generous cash and food donations, as well as a regular focus of our prayers both in church and my Life Group.

As a Foodbank volunteer, amongst many from churches throughout our area, I get to hear first-hand the plight of so many in our local community.

Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy or family breakdown to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. A simple supply of food makes a big difference which, in addition to preventing hunger, can alleviate debt problems, crime, housing loss and mental health issues.

We do not think anyone in our community should have to face going hungry.



Increasing demand

Sadly however, as you can see from the graph (*left*), demand is only increasing.

In 2020 we collected over 43 tonnes of food, and gave 4,191 individuals (42% of whom were children) one week's emergency food supplies.

Each client is given a week's food for their whole family via a voucher system. The vouchers are issued by local agencies, some of

which can also provide long-term support to help address issues behind a client's crisis. We also receive client referrals from churches, schools, and surgeries.

Prior to Covid-19, we would welcome our clients at our pop-up café providing drinks and snacks while they waited for their order to be prepared in accordance with their family size and requirements.

We would chat to clients and we are trained to signpost them to other support, e.g. debt counselling from CAP, children's clothes and toys from B@titude, etc. Due to the pandemic, we have had to curtail some of that personal contact in order to keep our clients and volunteers safe.

Arranging distribution

We have collection bins in all the local churches (Covid restrictions permitting) as well as Oxshott Village Store, Waitrose and Sainsbury's Local in Cobham, etc. Donations are collected in our van and taken to the Foodbank warehouse in Leatherhead where they are weighed and sorted.

Every Tuesday morning the van delivers sufficient food for the week's expected requirements to the Foodbank's 'pop-up café' Distribution Centre.

This is currently kindly hosted by



a temporary home which will become unavailable in the future. A major challenge facing the trustees today is to find a suitable permanent location for our Client Distribution Centre.

Core values

FEDORA: a busy year, and the AGM

With Spring upon us and Covid vaccinations being received, life in Oxshott appears to have taken a positive turn. And FEDORA has continued to be busy...

his has been a very busy year for FEDORA. A full update of what we have been doing will be provided at the Annual General Meeting – see the meeting details overleaf. Our areas of focus have included:

- the emerging Local Plan and how to achieve a reduction in mandated targets from central Government;
- contentious planning applications around Oxshott;
- roads, in particular the A244 with the problems of increasing volumes of traffic, especially HGVs at night;
- flooding problems in some parts of Oxshott;
- clearing and maintenance of footpaths such as along Steels Lane from the Medical Centre to the A244 (see photo);
- enhancement of green spaces in and around Oxshott.

Membership of FEDORA

You can receive updates on what FEDORA is doing and matters of significance to Oxshott residents, by signing-up for emails using the side-panel on our website.

However, we do need more residents to demonstrate their support for FEDORA by becoming Members. With more members we can have more influence.

We distribute our semiannual magazine to 2,750 households, an estimated 5,500 adults. Our emails are sent to 600 recipients. Yet we have only 235 Members.

The meeting will include the election of Directors. An initial AGM notice, sent on 19 May to those on our email list, requested nominations for new Directors.

We are also inviting our newly-elected Elmbridge and Surrey Councillors to attend the AGM and hope that they will be able to join us.

If Covid regulations do not allow us to hold a face-to-face meeting, we will make alternative arrangements and Members will be updated by email.

Padel Tennis comes to OVSC!

Like a bear waking from its winter hibernation, emerging blinking in the sunlight, so Oxshott Village Sports Club is slowly waking from its long lockdown. **Sarah Murphy** tells all...

A fter the long lockdown imposed by the Covid restrictions, Tennis and Cricket are back – along with Bowls and Pétanque; Netball is also extending its season to make up for lost time – so it's full-blown action stations at Steels Lane, which is wonderful to see.



A small band of hugely-appreciated volunteers, working solo, or socially distanced as necessary, have spent valuable hours maintaining and repainting the Clubhouse and Bar, so as soon as inside service returns to complement the current outdoor service, our members and visitors will be able to enjoy the

refreshed décor along with a refreshing pint or two.

Further exciting news is that planning permission has been granted for the building of 2 new Padel Tennis courts, with work due to hopefully start towards the end of May.

Padel is a racquet sport, typically played in doubles on an enclosed court roughly 25% smaller than the size of a tennis court. Scoring is the same as normal tennis and the balls used are similar but with

a little less pressure. The main differences are that the court has walls and the balls can be played off them in a similar way as in the game of squash and that solid, stringless bats are used. It can be played in groups of mixed ages and abilities and is not power dominant.

Having originated in Mexico, Padel is hugely popular in Spain and other European countries as well as Hispanic American countries such as

Argentina. It is one of the fastest growing sports across continental Europe and is rapidly taking the UK by storm. Current members of OVSC will be able to add Padel Tennis to their membership for a small extra charge, and we are now also welcoming new members who may be interested in joining our newly formed Padel Section. Guerrilla Gardening in Oxshott

Work continues by groups of local residents to enhance our village environment, by the clearance of rubbish and installation of new planting; **Carmen and Alec Robinson** explain the progress...

The hope residents have enjoyed the spring daffodils that have been blooming around Oxshott. Some, such as on the Bevendean estate, were planted by those who wanted to enhance the area; other areas, such as the triangle at the top of Station Approach, were funded by Oxshott Village Day, and 1,500 daffodils were funded Danes Hill School, on the A244 opposite their entrance, planted by us with help from a volunteer.

A current project is to clear the brambles, dead trees and rubbish (barbed wire, concrete, tarmac, car parts, old road signs, bottles, etc,) on the A244 by Wren's Hill. The land is Surrey Highways' - who are supportive, but do not have the funds to do it themselves, although they taken away some of the rubbish. We have dug out over 10 bulk bags of rubbish so far.



In the photo above, the area is on the left; the work is being done by ourselves plus other volunteers from Wren's Hill, Knott Park and Chatsworth Place. We meet for two hours on Monday mornings to work on clearing, after which we will plant low-maintenance native trees and shrubs such as hawthorn. If you would like to help, please email us (see below).

We have now made access to the postbox much easier and uncovered tarmac footpaths that, according to one long-term resident, have not been seen in over 30 years! And it is safer, with much improved visibility for vehicles entering and leaving Wren's Hill. When we are finished there will be a much more attractive scene for everyone.

Education just for women

Royal Holloway College was the result of Jane persuading her husband, Dr Thomas Holloway (1800-1883), to spend his increasing fortune on a university college just for women. Fond of all things French,

Thomas despatched his architect W H Crossland to measure the *château de Chambord* on the Loire. The result back in Egham, 19 miles west of London, was Royal Holloway College, an impressive five story edifice, built around two large quadrangles with a roofline of turrets and towers set in 135 acres.

Constructed in pink
Bracknell brick with stone
ornamentation, Founder's
Building was opened in
1886 by Queen Victoria for
an initial 30 students.

Dr Thomas Holloway's patent medicines (it is questionable where his doctorate came from) included pills for both internal ailments and ointments for external use. Made off Oxford Street, they were advertised as containing ginger or perfume and sold worldwide. Such was his benevolence, that before commissioning the college, Thomas had already paid for the nearby Holloway Sanatorium at Virginia Water, its tower still visible from the M25. This building is now converted into apartments.

Later in life, Dr Holloway collected paintings by such artists as Landseer, Millais and Frith. He attended London auction houses and frequently out-bid those present. The college curator explained that the recently renovated Picture Gallery has over 70 paintings on the walls, showing Holloway's preference for contemporary life rather than religious scenes. So large were some of the works purchased that it was necessary to remove a few of the gallery's pilasters to provide hanging space.

Today over 11,000 students benefit from Dr Thomas Holloway's Victorian philanthropy at Royal Holloway College, now part of London University.






