

The Monthly Letter

In an 'in between' time...

Dear Friends,

As I write this letter the schools have returned and, judging by how full the car park at Oxshott Station is, many have returned to work in the office. And yet, we are still a long way from feeling things are 'back to normal.' At St Andrew's Church (in common with many groups in the village), we are taking careful steps towards reopening ministries

and activities, but are a long way off from that state of things which will likely be our 'new normal'.

It's a strange time: it would be lovely just to ignore the news headlines and government warnings, pretend that Covid-19 did not exist and go back to normal: there is a sense that this has gone on long enough! However, realistically, we continue to need to live in the tension between the 'now and not yet', which is hard.

The term for this 'in between' time is liminality. And it is a major theme in Christian thinking. Christians believe that God did at one momentous time in human history send his son Jesus to be our Saviour (which we celebrate at Christmas). That same Saviour has returned to his Father, but one day in the future will return as King and Judge of all the world and all things will be put right. So, we live in the 'now and not yet' place where nothing is quite as it should be. Crucially, the Father has sent his Holy Spirit to be our companion on this journey and of course, we have one another.

Whether you share these beliefs or not, we continue to need one another as we travel this frustrating road towards the new normal we all crave. So, let's continue to act as a community, especially to support those who are continuing to find life tough. If you need help, please do speak to someone whom you can trust or let me know at St Andrew's via the office email. All such communications are treated as confidential.

Finally, Jesus reminds us in Matthew 28.20:

'...remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

For the time being, we are continuing to hold one service on Sundays, at 10am, alternating in style between Traditional and Contemporary as before. And for the present, current guidelines (for example, wearing masks for singing, etc) will remain.

But we are pleased to have now restarted three elements of our normal Sunday pattern:

- Providing children's activities every Sunday
- Each 'style' of service will have more of its distinct character including live music!
- Enjoying post-service refreshments.

Our mid-week Communion services, on Wednesdays at 11.30am, have restarted. These are 'said', quiet, fully socially-distanced services, using traditional liturgy.



New Chair for Christian Aid

he Rt Revd & Rt Hon Dr John Sentamu (right), the former Archbishop of



Dr Sentamu – who has been outspoken on issues of poverty and justice in the UK and globally for many years – served as the Archbishop of York from 2005 until 2020. He is a member of the House of Lords. Born in Kampala, Uganda, Dr Sentamu will be the first person of African descent to take up the position of Chair in Christian Aid's 75-year history.

Announcing the appointment, Christian Aid's CEO Amanda Khozi Mukwashi said, "This is wonderful news for Christian Aid. Dr Sentamu brings with him a passion and energy for global justice, a deep love of the Church and a profound theological understanding that will be able to speak into the crises of climate change, Covid, conflict and debt that are affecting the world's poorest communities. We look forward to welcoming him to the Christian Aid family."

Paying the price

For the first time, the leaders of the Roman Catholic Church, the Eastern Orthodox Church and the Anglican Communion have jointly warned of the urgency of environmental sustainability, ahead of COP26...

Pope Francis, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew and the Archbishop of Canterbury have joined together for the first time in an urgent appeal for the future of the planet, urging everyone to play their part in 'choosing life' for the future of the planet.







In a joint statement on 1 September, the Christian leaders called on people to pray, in this Christian season of Creation, for world leaders ahead of COP26 this November. The statement reads: 'We call on everyone, whatever their belief or worldview, to endeavour to listen to the cry of the earth and of people who are poor, examining their behaviour and pledging meaningful sacrifices for the sake of the earth which God has given us.'

The joint declaration strikes a clear warning - 'Today, we are paying the price...Tomorrow could be worse' and that: 'This is a critical moment. Our children's future and the future of our common home depend on it.'

The three Christian leaders spoke against injustice and inequality, saying: 'We stand before a harsh justice: biodiversity loss, environmental degradation and climate change are the inevitable consequences of our actions, since we have greedily consumed more of the earth's resources than the planet can endure. But we also face a profound injustice: the people bearing the most catastrophic consequences of these abuses are the poorest on the planet and have been the least responsible for causing them.'

The statement calls on people to:

- Pray for world leaders ahead of COP26.
- For individuals: To make meaningful sacrifices for the sake of the planet, working together and taking responsibility for how we use our resources.
- For those with far-reaching responsibilities: To choose peoplecentred profits and lead the transition to just and sustainable economies.

Go for a padel at OVSC!

Padel is a form of tennis that is easy to play, fun and very sociable, and can be played in groups of mixed ages and abilities - as previewed in our June issue. As **Fiona Stephen** reports, you can now play in Oxshott...

adel, which is claimed to be the fastest growing sport in the world at the moment, has arrived in our leafy corner of Surrey, and Oxshott Village Sports Club has opened two brand new state-of-the-art courts at our site in Steels Lane.

The game is a mix between tennis and squash and is most commonly played in doubles. Courts are enclosed, surrounded by walls of glass and metal mesh and the scoring is the same as in a game of tennis.

The rules are broadly the same as for tennis, although you serve underarm and the walls are used as part of the game, with the ball allowed to bounce off them. The rackets are very

different to tennis rackets - being stringless, much thicker and shorter and with holes.

Being easier and quicker to pick up than tennis, padel can be played by all ages and abilities, making it the ideal family game as well as providing some fiercely contested games amongst regular players.

The courts were opened on a sunny Saturday in August, with local resident, OVSC member and TV presenter Andrew Castle playing in an exhibition match in front of a large crowd of current and prospective new members.

Cheapside Hoard

In her latest recollection of past Arts Society visits, Nicky Orlebar explains the extraordinary background to a rare collection...



etween the 1640s Civil War and the 1666 Fire of London, someone hid a cache of jewels and gemstones in a wooden box in the cellar of a London shop near the Thames.

The jewels lay unclaimed, lost and forgotten until 1912 when, during the demolition of a 17th century building in an area known for its craft shops, an astounding 400 items of jewellery were unearthed. Now called the Cheapside Hoard (in Anglo-Saxon cheap means market), this rare



collection of beautiful artefacts demonstrates the exquisite craftsmanship of Elizabethan and Jacobean gold and silversmiths. Amongst the treasures were rings, brooches, crosses, fan holders, earrings and a salt cellar.

Before touring the *Cheapside Hoard* exhibition at the Museum of London, an ASCO party (The Arts Society of Cobham and Oxshott) attended a lecture where the speaker confirmed that modern archaeologists are quite undecided about the Hoard's secret background. Questions remain as to the name of the shop owner, when and why so many items were hidden and why they were never retrieved.

Exceptional quality

London at that time was a hugely important sea trading centre, where decorative commissions from royalty and the aristocracy required jewels imported from Colombia, Sri Lanka and India. These would be crafted into fine pieces of decorative art as seen in contemporary portraits and in the exhibition display cabinets. Amongst such exceptional quality we were able to admire a brooch of emeralds, gold and diamonds in the shape of a salamander and a watch set in a lidded emerald crystal.

A mock-up suggested what a jeweller's workshop might have looked like, while a ratchet secured to a wooden bench showed how gold twine was stretched into thin strands for necklaces. As if to confirm the priceless nature of the Hoard, Gurkha soldiers stood guard over the exhibits.


