

Alpha Online!

St Andrew's Church will soon be hosting Alpha Online, on Sunday evenings from 12 September. **Patrick Davies** explains ...

e are delighted to announce that we will be hosting the well-respected Alpha course here in Oxshott.
You may have heard of Alpha already –it involves a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith, each one looking at a different question around faith and is designed to create conversation.

Alpha is run all around the globe, and everyone is welcome. It runs in cafés, churches, universities, homes - you name it. No two Alphas look the same, but here are the answers to some of the questions you might have:

What? Alpha is a chance to explore life and the Christian faith in a friendly, open and informal environment.

Why? We all have some big questions about life, faith and meaning – maybe especially at the moment! Alpha gives us a chance to explore the big questions together, hearing each other's thoughts.

Who? Alpha is for anyone and everyone. You don't need to have been to church before, and people generally have pretty diverse points of view, which can lead to great discussions!

How? With 'Alpha Online' we meet together via zoom, to watch an episode about questions around the Christian faith, and have a chance to chat about it afterwards. There's no pressure, no follow-up and no charge.

When? 7.45pm-9pm, Sundays, from 12 September 2021. There are 11 sessions, so the course will finish toward the end of November.

Where? You can join us on zoom from wherever you are! Let us know you'd like to join us, and you will receive the zoom link by email.


Big Questions meeting near you. Justin Welby is visiting the Diocese of Guildford on 25 & 26 September and will engage with local communities at a series of Big Questions events.

Patrick: ordained as Priest

We are delighted that in July our curate here at St Andrew's, **Patrick Davies**, was ordained Priest. We asked Patrick what that means, both broadly and to him in particular...

Vou may be thinking "Didn't that happen last year. Did something not work the first time round?" If you are, you're partly right! You're not imagining it - I was ordained last year! On 10 October 2020 I was ordained a Deacon in the Church of England at a small service at Holy Trinity, Claygate - with very limited numbers present in person due to the restrictions in place at the time.

The role of a Deacon is to 'serve' - and it is said of those who are ordained: 'Once a Deacon, always a Deacon' - that is, we never stop being called first to serve. But on 3 July I was ordained a Priest as well. The service took place this time at Guildford Cathedral, with slightly less limited numbers!

Being ordained Priest means I have been commissioned by God and the church to do a slightly different role, as well as still being a Deacon. Being a Priest means a bit more leadership within the church, and at times being a representative for God, for the church and for the community of faith. It means I can lead at services of Holy Communion, pronounce God's blessing, and proclaim the truth of God's forgiveness for people.

Being ordained a Priest is not a 'promotion' or elevation, and does not mean I am any more or less than I was before - but it's a specific role I believe God has called me to, and ordination is the church simply affirming

that call, and praying that God by his Holy Spirit would help me to step into it well.

God calls us all - primarily to follow Jesus, but to be and do many other things as well. Some are called by God to be teachers, accountants, managers, musicians, business people, partners, parents - the list could go on and on - and it would be wonderful to learn to recognise the call of God in each of us.

It is my prayer that whatever God has called *you* to, you would know his blessing and the help of his Holy Spirit as you step into it.

If you have any questions about exploring the way in which God is calling you, or about what it means to follow Jesus, I would love to chat with you over a coffee sometime!

Becoming new

Change can feel worrying. But not necessarily...

Then a caterpillar changes into a butterfly, it's hard to believe it's the same creature. But at both stages of its life, it has a body that is perfectly suited to living in a particular environment.

This insect can help us understand the afterlife and the significance of the resurrected Jesus. Paul, on his journeys, discovered that some members of the church in Corinth were confused about life after death. So Paul wrote a lengthy letter to them to explain the importance of the resurrection of Jesus, and how it affects our future existence.

Paul doesn't mention caterpillars and butterflies but describes a seed becoming a plant. By just looking at an individual seed there is no knowing what it is going to look like! But out of its death comes a beautiful new life form.

Paul points out that all living beings have a body that enables them to live in a particular environment. There are earthly bodies for living in a physical world and a spiritual body for living in the heavenly realms. And so God will give to us a new spiritual body to enable us to live with Him in heaven.

Of course, all butterflies eventually die, but in our resurrected body we will not be subject to decay or death. How do we know this? Jesus said: "Because I live, you also will live" (John 14.19). Jesus pioneered the way for us. He died on the cross, arose from the grave, and so opened up the way for all believers in Him to go to Heaven.

Thanks be to God!

ne day several weeks ago, Frances asked the Life Group leaders if any of their groups would like to take over one of the summer series of services on the Psalms. We raised this challenge with our Monday Evening group at our next meeting, and there was an enthusiastic response, perhaps inspired by characters from the "Les Misérables" study series we were doing at the time!


The allocated Psalm for Sunday, 15 August was Psalm 63, one of several Psalms King David wrote whilst fleeing Jerusalem from his son, Absalom. He poured out his heart and soul as he sought in the loneliness of the wilderness of Judah, but through it all he held fast to his praise and worship of God for all the blessings that had taken place in his life.

Most members of the group participated in the service; some leading, two as preachers, three others acting - taking the roles of an interviewer, Absalom and King David - to provide a different and poignant context to where and when King David wrote this Psalm. There were prayers to compose, a musical excerpt in Urdu to reference our Mission Partner connection with Sialkot in Pakistan, a video introduction from one of John Stott's books on the Psalms and even new images to a worship song.

We prayed the whole would bring glory to God and were grateful for the opportunity to serve in this way.

Our prayer is that the hearts of some who watched and heard, whether in church or online, captured the depth of David's faith to seek and reach out to God in confidence and believe too for themselves that however you are feeling, God is always faithful.

A brief update on roads...

FEDORA has been looking to improve a number of issues concerning the roads of Oxshott, as lan Dilks now reports...



Purther to our updates in the previous editions of the magazine, we are pleased to report that there is continuing albeit slow progress on all of our requests, i.e. a night time HGV ban in the village, the deployment of average speed cameras on the A244, speed restrictions in the centre of the village and continuous pavement access to the High Street from the south of the village.

Design work

Surrey Highways is currently analysing the results of the recent traffic monitoring exercise, which will inform design options, and initial design work on all projects should commence later this year or early next. Cobham residents have expressed concerns about the risk of an HGV ban diverting vehicles into Cobham, and whilst we think this is unlikely, it will complicate the design work.



We are also in discussions with Surrey and our councillors about modifying the parking restrictions in the lay-by in the High Street.

I'm pleased to report that good progress is being made to establish an Oxshott Community SpeedWatch.

Further details will be presented at the upcoming AGM (see below).

The Arts Society is on the move!

An important change is about to happen to The Arts Society Cobham and Oxshott (ASCO). **Ionis Thompson**, Acting Chair, explains...

The have recently had concerns – like many other Arts Societies – about a drop in our membership which made our future look precarious. So we were delighted when Claremont Arts Society approached us with a view to merging our two societies as they, too, were finding their numbers had dropped away in recent years.

A merger made sense as their membership is from an area similar to ours, they also meet on the second

Wednesday of the month (though currently in the evenings) and they use the lovely Yehudi Menuhin Hall in Stoke d'Abernon for their lectures.

Exciting plans for 2022!

We have now agreed to merge in January 2022, to move our lectures to the

Menuhin Hall and to continue meeting on the same day of the month in the afternoons. We will be called **The Arts Society Claremont and Oxshott** (or ASCO for short, the same acronym as we have now). This move will ensure good sizes of audience and sufficient income to continue operating.

We'll continue to hold 10 lectures a year with a Summer and a Christmas lunch and many Visits to interesting places. The annual membership fee will continue to be £45. The Menuhin Hall, which many readers will already know well, is a most attractive, well equipped hall with plenty of space and lovely grounds. Crucially it has ample room to park, so there will no longer be competition for limited parking slots when arriving for a talk. We feel this will be a great enhancement of our present position.

For the rest of this year, until the merger, we will continue to meet in Oxshott Village Hall. We are all longing to meet again 'live' after a year of zoom lectures and plan to hold our first talk of the autumn season in the Hall. This will be on 8 September at 2pm (our postponed AGM will be held

before the talk): it is being given by Clive Stewart-Lockhart on *The Orientalists: Artist Travellers to the Near East.* If there is another surge of the virus, we will, of course, revert to holding the talk and the AGM virtually.

The year of talks that ended this summer, all given by zoom, has

covered a wide range of subjects. The story of the Nutcracker was our topic in March

and Central Asian Nomads and been shown how plants can heal. In the next few months we will be hearing about the artist Vermeer

and will end the year with a jolly talk on the cartoonist, Giles.

Dilettanti Dashwoods

Nicky Orlebar, who has organised the excursions of The Arts Society Cobham and Oxshott (ASCO) for many years, still has time to recollect one of their guided visits...

SCO (The Arts Society Cobham & Oxshott) members immersed themselves in the life and times of the Dashwood family when visiting Atheir church, caves, house and park in the village of West Wycombe, Buckinghamshire.

Everything about the Dashwoods comes over as slightly eccentric, in both life and death.

Originally London silk merchants, the second baronet and MP Sir Francis Dashwood (1708-81) lived life to the full travelling as far as Constantinople and Russia before returning to England to make enthusiastic improvements to his house in the 1740s.


Our guided visit began with their hilltop church overlooking the estate. Lavishly decorated inside in the



Palmyra style inspired by a Grand Tour, the tower is topped by a golden ball visible for miles around and originally used for Dashwood parties. Their roofless, hexagonal mausoleum stands nearby. Literally below these buildings and inside the chalk hills are the Hell-Fire caves excavated by farm workers when the harvests failed. Extending some 400m

underground, the lit tunnels cross the 'River Styx' to the 'Inner Temple' where the Dashwood Dilettanti Society met.

After our lunch in a conveniently sited nearby garden centre, we entered the park. This consists of a Capability Brown landscape around the Greek Revival house. A footpath follows the attractive ochre-coloured walls to the south front with its double colonnade added in 1756 and now much appreciated by film makers.

Keeping it natural...

What do you consider to be 'beautiful countryside'?

ccording to Natural England, thorny scrubs and floodplains should be seen as more beautiful than manicured fields.

Tony Juniper, chair of Natural England, which is the government's adviser for the natural environment, has said a 'cultural revolution' is necessary to help people appreciate the beauty of a messy countryside.

He has said that the "orderliness" of much of our British countryside, with neat stone walls, sheep-grazed fields and villages has often created "ecological deserts" for wildlife, who starve. "To ensure our future security, it will be necessary for us to let nature take back some control."

'Rewilding' can be healing

So Tony Juniper strongly supports the increasing popularity of 'rewilding' projects which have become a popular way for land managers to give

nature a chance. He believes that rewilding can help to heal degraded landscapes and provide better habitat for wildlife.

A post-Brexit plan to reward farmers and other land managers for improving water quality and helping plants and wildlife is expected to replace the EU's Common Agricultural Policy.



Local Recovery Strategies

In a separate initiative, the Government has recently (on 10 August) opened a consultation on plans for new Local Nature Recovery Strategies across England, as part of the landmark Environment Bill.

The consultation launch follows successful Local Nature Recovery Strategies pilots in Cornwall, Buckinghamshire, Greater Manchester, Northumberland and Cumbria which showed how local groups can work collaboratively together to produce their strategies. Managed by Natural England in conjunction with the local partner organisations, the pilots have informed the policy development and next steps.

For Natural England, Tony Juniper said, "Restoring our natural world after years of decline will bring a wealth of benefits to people, our environment and our economy. We're pleased to support the consultation, which will allow our partners to feed into how the Local Nature Recovery Strategies will run.

"Natural England has played a key role in developing the Local Nature Recovery Strategies, including running the pilots which used an evidencebased, locally led, collaborative approach."

The Nature Recovery Network plans to create or restore 500,000 hectares of wildlife habitat outside protected sites and help species thrive, more effectively linking existing protected sites and landscapes, as well as urban green infrastructure, such as trees, hedgerows, parks, fields, forests, and urban blue infrastructure, such as rainwater tanks, bioswales, rivers, canals, ponds, wetlands, and floodplains.

Make sure Oxshott's voice is heard: the consultation will be open online on Citizen Space for a period of 12 weeks, closing on Tuesday 2 November.

Our special new gastropub

The Victoria was visited by **Andrew & Ruth Burns**, who review the experience for us here...



he Victoria Oxshott has finally reopened, but in a new guise as a gastropub – the brainchild of some entrepreneurs who learned their craft under chefs such as Gordon Ramsey and Heston Blumenthal. The layout of the bar and restaurant area will be familiar to regulars, but the original woodwork has been revealed and repainted. We were given a sneak preview just before the official opening – greeted warmly at the door by Simon, one of the founders and Matt, the head chef. Their young staff produced some exciting pre-dinner cocktails – including an elegant French Martini and a refreshing Garden Tonic.

There are two new private dining areas, but our table looked out on the attractive replanted garden and terrace at the rear. The menu was not overly long, but everything looked mouth-watering – the four of us agreed that we could have picked anything. We started with a beer-battered oyster each with delicate seaweed mayonnaise – the beginning of what was an adventure for our senses. The starters were superb – particularly the Mushroom Parfait – with its intense flavours - and the beautiful and subtly cooked Torched Mackerel. We were a bit uncertain about the sound and look of the Crispy Pigs Head – but the taste of the soft pork with the crunch of the surrounding breadcrumbs was utterly delicious.

The wine list was high quality - with some eye-wateringly expensive wines at the top end for the special occasion. We were recommended a nice red Burgundy to have with some wonderful mains – the best were perhaps the Bavette cooked on the charcoal grill or the Brill with Mussels tasting as if they had just come out of the sea. The dark horse dishes were the Pork Chop – succulent and bursting with flavour - and the Halibut fish and chips in the lightest, crispest batter we had ever tasted. Little dishes of carrots, potatoes and thick chips completed the table.

The portions were not tiny, but we bravely made room for desserts and so shared a Chocolate Parfait and a slightly gooey Passion Fruit Pavlova. The star was a small glass of a red Montecappone dessert wine which was like a mouthful of sweet cherries. We were made to feel very welcome and it is clear that the owners are keen to be a core part of the life of the Oxshott village and community, sourcing some of their key ingredients locally. Their new staff were enthusiastic – all smiles and plainly enjoying their work – we were well looked after by assistant managers, Louise and Emilia.

The four of us agreed that the whole evening was excellent – the prices were high end, as you would expect, but the food, drink and ambience were all a truly top-quality experience. We will be back and soon.






