

Talks take place monthly from October to June. They start at 8pm, and last for an hour, and are usually attended by 50 to 60 members of the Cercle.



Dear Friends

As we approach Valentine's Day, perhaps you are thinking of how to show love to those close to you...?

Maybe you've already booked a restaurant, or bought a thoughtful gift...or maybe this is your reminder to do so!

In our services at St Andrew's Church we are looking at the Old Testament book of Ruth, which explores the theme of 'love' in a particular way - 'loving kindness'.

Ruth's story is both very ordinary, and truly extraordinary. In a short period of time she experiences the death of all the male members of her family, leaving her with her sister-in-law and mother-in-law together in a very challenging situation of bereavement and hardship. Yet, despite the repeated temptation (and encouragements) to prioritise her own wellbeing, Ruth consistently acts selflessly and prioritises the well-being of others. In doing so, she discovers great blessing herself!

It's amazing (and maybe a little counter-intuitive) that it is when we turn our thoughts and actions outward, away from ourselves and toward others, that we often find the greatest joy!

Ruth's story reminds us that the way of 'loving kindness' is truly satisfying, and how God calls us to live - and shows us himself, especially in Jesus.

So, away from all the hearts, flowers and romance of Valentine's Day, in our day-to-day lives, how might we live with loving kindness toward others? It's in those consistent little acts of loving kindness that we build our ordinary life into one of extraordinary love.

It is my prayer that, as Ruth's life shows, it is in doing so we may find true joy, security and peace amid all life's pains and joys.


'self-isolation', due to their shop being shut following the Government's updated 'Work from Home' guidance!



What is Candlemas?

You may notice that Candlemas appears in the Church Services this month at St Andrew's, on 2 February. But what is it for?



In fact, there are three reasons for this festival, which is held each year on the second of February.

First, it's the halfway point between the shortest day and the Spring Equinox, so from that date on the daylight hours get longer. In pre-Christian times, this day was known as the 'Feast of Lights' and celebrated the increased strength of the life-giving sun as Winter gave way to Spring.

Second, it's when we remember Mary and Joseph taking their baby Jesus to the Temple, forty days after His birth.

And the third reason? It's directly linked to the name of the feast – Candlemas - so named because on that day each year all the candles for the coming year were brought into the church to be blessed at a 'mass'.

Remember that candles were important in those days, not only because there were no electric lights; people thought they gave protection against plague and illness and famine.

In many churches on this feast there will be a procession of the whole congregation with lighted candles – often inside the whole building, going into every 'dark' corner. Everyone carries their own lighted candle, which they are encouraged to take home and light there also.

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the universe. You make our darkness to be light.

Desmond Tutu: five famous quotes



The recent death of Archbishop Desmond Tutu was mourned around the world. Here are five of his more famous quotes, which show why he was so especially honoured for his justice and reconciliation work in South Africa...

- **1.** "Do your little bit of good where you are; it's those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world."
- **2.** "If you are neutral in situations of injustice, you have chosen the side of the oppressor. If an elephant has its foot on the tail of a mouse, and you say that you are neutral, the mouse will not appreciate your neutrality."
- **3.** "Don't raise your voice, improve your argument. Good sense does not always lie with the loudest shouters, nor can we say that a large, unruly crowd is always the best arbiter of what is right."
- **4.** "Forgiving is not forgetting; it's actually remembering remembering and not using your right to hit back. It's a second chance for a new beginning. And the remembering part is particularly important. Especially if you don't want to repeat what happened."
- **5.** "Differences are not intended to separate, to alienate. We are different precisely in order to realise our need of one another."

Looking towards a greener future...

...for 2022 and beyond! Have your New Year resolutions included efforts to care for our planet and its environment? **Raymond Coe** proposes how to proceed...

et's determine that 2022 shall be a year when, individually and collectively, in Oxshott, Surrey, the UK and the world we really make positive and measurable strides towards a greener future.

Two major areas that Surrey County Council is asking us all to address are transport and consumption.

Looking at transport

On transport, is there anything we can do to reduce our use of a car? How about resolving not to use it for at least one day each week? Could we walk or cycle to the shops? Do we drive our children to school or do they use a school bus service? Could we share transport for school or shopping?

Bus services are not good in Oxshott, but what about the Chatterbus - there are two services which stop in Oakshade Road. As the Leader of SCC said 'It's very easy for all of us to say we'll leave that to somebody else...but we all have got to change our behaviours and even if it's just in a little way.'

Consumption

Consumption in this context is what we eat, what we wear, what we consume; have we really considered the carbon footprint for the products we purchase?

Fruit and vegetables that are imported over thousands of miles, do we really need them, is there not a locally-grown alternative?

Where has our clothing been made, what is it made from and where did

the fibres originate from? There are tee shirts made in Asia using cotton imported from the American continent and the finished product shipped to Europe. This is hardly responsible and sustainable.



And there's more...

If we are insulating our loft, look at wool-based products (75% sheep's wool and 25% recycled fibres) rather than glass fibre.

When we arrange our holidays can we consider the impact on our planet of the mode of transport and the location chosen.

Can we manage to reuse, re-purpose or recycle more products and packaging than we did in 2021?

How are we doing with plastics? 2021 saw some increase in the range of plastic packaging materials that can be recycled, although in some cases determination is required to discover how.

Cans of paint can now be recycled at Guildford Community Recycling Centre (CRC) located in the Slyfield Industrial Estate on Moorfield Road, GU1 1RU. Look at Terracycle (www.terracycle.com/en-GB/) to find arrangements for those difficult to recycle items. If you are confused about what can be recycled have a look at https://www.surreycc.gov.uk/people-and-community/surrey-matters/recycling/confused-about-recycling and why not try the recycling game with your children at https://www.surreyep.org.uk/what-to-do-with-an-item/

France has just introduced a law banning plastic packaging for many fruits and vegetables; could we lobby our government or supermarkets to do the same?

Have you tried Ecovibe (https://ecovibe.co.uk) cleaning products? The coconut fibre scouring pads work well, don't scratch and are biodegradable.

I hope there are at least some ideas here that you can try out, and make a difference in some way – Happy New Year!

Jolyon Trickey wonders how important family is to you? And how wide your definition is of family, and how readily others are welcomed into

Por three years we have been looking to make Tanka Subedi, who lives and works in Kathmandu in Nepal, feel like a part of the St Andrew's church family. This is our aspiration for all our mission partners. For this reason, each partner is linked to a Life Group of about 10 people, who try to foster links and pray.

In Tanka's case this is a Friday morning group of women who meet each week and regularly remember him in prayer.

Recently when Guy Harper, from one of our long-standing church families, set off to climb in the Himalayas, he also met up with Tanka and his wife Rita (pictured left) in Kathmandu and delivered some small gifts from the Life Group and from us.

Family is important to Tanka too. He and his wife, Rita have three daughters: Nishma, Charisma & Rhema. In 2019, Rhema, the eldest, went to Canada to study

astrophysics, and financial constraints and Covid had prevented her returning. She has struggled both physically and mentally and we pray for her and them often. Just before Christmas she was rushed home to be loved, cared for and given the medical attention she needs.

Family is important to Tanka and we rejoice that for the first time in three years they were all together (see the photo above).

Over Christmas we received the photo below and warm greetings from another family for which Tanka is responsible: the 70-strong Family of God Church congregation that he leads.

This is one of five for which Tanka is responsible - and Rhema was able to sing as part of their celebrations!



Looking at the image above, we do well to recall that gathering in such numbers and proclaiming the Christian gospel in Nepal are illegal!

Over the last 20 years Tanka has grown another family - a family of churches and church leaders all across Nepal. Through translating courses that equip and empower ordinary Christian and setting up an organisation called ITEEN, Tanka has met and supports many churches and their leaders. When Nepal was hit by a huge wave of Covid last summer, Tanka and ITEEN sought to offer practical and financial help to these churches and church leaders.

The St Andrew's church family responded in love to the needs of this wider family, raising £4,000 to assist with access to medical care and support for the bereaved.

Mission Par/ners

We know that we still have a long way to go in making Tanka and his family feel part of the St Andrew's family. Yet we are encouraged to be making progress!



Despite the disruption of Covid, Oxshott Art & Crafts Society has continued undaunted, as reported by Miranda Fuller...

ACS concluded its second rather strange year with a cheerful Christmas social, well-attended despite the unwelcome latest Covid variant, Omicron. Festive drinks, savouries and mince pies were followed by a short AGM, before a showing of A Bigger Picture, the documentary on David Hockney. Filmed over three years, this captures Hockney's return from California, to paint the East Yorkshire landscapes of his childhood. by two of our members. Wendy Hale and Meryl Haves.


Mervl's lovely watercolour (right) is based on a holiday of hers in Northumberland last year, and Wendy has been creating eve-

Which is Oxshott's best Post Box?

Oxshott is blessed with plenty of Royal Mail post boxes – but how well do you know them? And which is your favourite?!...

re you aware of the wide variety of post boxes in Oxshott? By this we mean both the styles of them (pillar, wall-mounted, etc.) and the cypher (the monogram-like device of the reigning monarch). Many of them are quite historic.

The table below shows those that we believe lie within and on the borders of the parish. The majority of post boxes are cast iron, but in one case sheet steel has been used.

The oldest post box is built into the wall at the station. It is the only Victorian one in the village, with its 'VR' cypher; as the railway was opened in 1885, the post box must date from around then.

Most of the boxes are in very good condition, and in good decorative order, resplendent in red and black, and some have interesting detail in their casting.

The boxes can be valued as being part of a distinctively British landscape, with the obvious risk that modern communications mean they could go the same way as red telephone boxes; but we would then lose their history, with cyphers of five different reigning monarchs here in Oxshott.

Our favourite local box is the unusual Edward VII 'lamp'-style postbox on Queens Drive, shown on our cover this month; it is very small, just big enough to accept small letters, but in good order despite being over 100 years old, and sporting a very elegant cypher.

At the other end of the scale is the recently-relocated lamp box on the corner of Steels Lane and Sheath Lane – crudely made of sheet steel, it has a cheap-looking cypher in stainless steel seemingly glued to it. This box is not even the right 'Post Office red' colour!

Basildon Park revived

With Arts Society trips hopefully to be resumed, Nicky **Orlebar** tells the story of a house resurrected...

day spent at Basildon Park near Goring-on-Thames completely masks the tribulations of this elegant Palladian mansion in Berkshire. Built between 1776-1783 by John Carr of York for Sir Francis Sykes of the East India Company, the building exemplifies all that the Georgians found attractive – a central portico connected by single storey walls linking two pavilions (for kitchen and laundry). Each block of the Bath stone walls is bevelled and glows warmly in the sunshine.

Entrance for the family was via the ground floor, under the state rooms.

Guests arriving by coach and horses, however, would ascend outdoor flights of stairs before entering the first-floor hall behind the exterior pillars and pediment.

Old prints show the hall's magnificent proportions, where pilasters and pale-coloured plasterwork contributed to a truly impressive grand entrance.

However, all was not to last - money ran out and a succession of owners sold off panelling, door surrounds and fireplaces. During WWI the building was used as a convalescent home for officers and soldiers of the Berkshire regiments, while in WWII the mansion was again requisitioned by the Army, with resultant damage.

It was in 1952 that a newspaper proprietor and his wife Lord and Lady Iliffe (pronounced eye-liff) first encountered the dilapidated property, by now facing possible demolition. With utmost determination, they bought and set about renovating the entire property, replacing windows, ceilings, bookcases and much else. After WWII many country house owners were selling up, finding the rising costs of running a large property too prohibitive. Nothing daunted, Langton and Renée Illiffe traversed the country with tape measure, attending these country house sales and auctions. Together they bought Georgian carpets, curtains, pictures and furniture (including state beds) for their beloved Basildon, which, when installed, completely brought the house back to life. They even found doors which were the perfect size for Basildon but had been made for another

property.

The Iliffes' tour de force was renovating the expansive Great Staircase room, an area which links the first-floor hall through to the Octagon Drawing Room. The staircase is seemingly unsupported but, as our guide explained, is cantilevered such that each step stays in position due to stone



weights pressing down inside the wall. It is

considered to be one of builder John Carr's most significant interior spaces.

Outside, the 400 acres of landscaped parkland overlooking the Thames Valley were also in need of much attention. Originally planned as pleasure grounds, shrubberies and woods, the Illifes' vision ensured the grounds returned to a manageable state while closely resembling their 18th century lavout.

How indebted we were that Lord and Lady Iliffe should generously leave Basildon Park to the National Trust, for groups such as The Arts Society to visit and appreciate.






