

The Monthly Letter

Finding the battery!

Dear Friends,

How are your New Year's resolutions for 2022 going? If they are anything like mine, they have ground to a halt and are almost forgotten. Good for you if, on the contrary, yours are being well and truly fulfilled!

Many people view living life as a Christian in a similar way to making resolutions, perhaps promising themselves that this time, they will try harder and be more disciplined. In my own experience it never lasts; and, indeed, the Bible tells us it's not what we should be attempting.


Trying to live life as a Christian by trying harder is like giving a child an electric toy car but without the battery: although it looks like a car and can be pushed about, it will never do what it was intended to do. The battery-less car will never race along bringing joy and a sense of dynamism.

So, what is the Christian equivalent of the battery in this toy car? It's the Holy Spirit - sometimes unhelpfully referred to as the 'Holy Ghost', which can create unfortunate misconceptions.

The Holy Spirit is the dynamic member of the Trinity - along with God the Father and Jesus Christ, God's Son. In the Old Testament the (Hebrew) word for the Holy Spirit is 'ruach'- the breath of God. In the Greek of the New Testament, it is 'dunamis' (power), from which our word 'dynamic' is derived. Neither of these has anything to do with ghosts and everything to do with life and movement.

From 1 May at St Andrew's, we will be learning more about how to live as Christians using the power of God's Holy Spirit and we would love you to join us. The series includes talks at services and time to mull things over in a Life Group – a small group who typically meet in one another's homes to reflect on and try to apply what we learn. You and your children are most welcome on any Sunday at 10am* as we look at how to be empowered to live as Christians rather than simply 'try harder'.

BYC - it's been quite a year!

There have been some interesting, challenging and exciting developments on Building Your Church (BYC), our project that will radically refresh the buildings here at St Andrew's. **Jill Mengham** updates us...

Back in January 2021, when we shared a video of the then-current plans, we had lots of positive feedback and enthusiasm that the project was underway, and some very helpful suggestions about how we might make the buildings even better for everyone in the community.

We also had some new requirements from the DAC - the Diocesan Advisory Committee - who must grant approval for any changes to church buildings.

We are so grateful for all the feedback, which we feel has led us to an even better way forward.

One of the main challenges from the DAC was to assess the carbon cost of

our plan to fully demolish the ancillary buildings and construct everything new. So, over the last 15 months, we have been working with our architect, structural engineer and quantity surveyors to understand the carbon impact of the project. We are really excited by the new design and floor plans, which can use more of the existing foundations, and also aid phasing of the work, which would help us be able to use part of the new building earlier. We are eager to share those plans with you in the next issue of the magazine and on display boards at church.

Amazingly, if all goes according to plan, we could commence building work in January 2023, providing we have the necessary funds in place. We will share more about our fundraising aspirations in the next issue of the magazine, and how you might get involved. Meanwhile, please do support our bid for CIL funding if you get the opportunity.

'Building Your Church' is much broader than the buildings, and so we have been developing exciting plans to expand the activities we offer. There will be more to tell you about this in the coming months too.

This month we start our refreshed Sunday morning service called 'St Andrew's at 10'.

During the pandemic we offered 'Listen & Pray', a 10am service alternating each week between two service styles. And now we want to retain aspects that many of us have enjoyed about that temporary Listen & Pray service, such as meeting together as one big Church Family, and coming to church mid-morning.

So the new service 'St Andrew's at 10' combines the very best of both styles and, importantly, allows us to come together as one big Church Family before God. Communion will be celebrated every week, sometimes integrated into the service and sometimes offered as an addition (as it was for Listen & Pray).

We aim to continue to live stream the service, and are grateful to the technical team who have enabled everyone - online or in the church to join together.

And we are planning to offer two other services over the next few months – a service for families with primary-aged children (see page 9), and an informal time of musical worship, prayer and study for our young people and everyone who enjoys this style.

We hope the way forward reflects three priorities - integration, simplicity and families & children do join us!

Our very own Hannah Fast, whom many of you will know, has recently published her first book of poems, entitled *Finding God in the Midst of Depression*.


A talented writer and creative thinker, Hannah started writing to inspire and help others. In 2019, when at the lowest point in her life, she began to reconnect with God, writing

Carina Moffat 1952-2022

Friend and Fellow Musician

It was with tremendous sorrow that we heard of Carina's passing after a long and determined battle against cancer. She was incredibly brave and gave her 'all' right to the end.

It's difficult to write, in a few words here, a fitting tribute to one with so many talents and interests! Most importantly of course, a great support and loving wife to Simon and mother to



Rowena and Lara, who when younger both gave their talents here in Oxshott, as members of brownies and guides and the church choir.

Carina was a very keen and knowledgeable gardener - being the 'Queen of Snowdrops' - a legacy from her father - and no one could ever guess how many different species of snowdrops existed until they had visited the special snowdrop bed in her garden. Indeed some have been transported to Wisley and displayed in a special greenhouse - with her name! Her care and expertise covered other gardens - for many years she led a group of devotees to take great care of the church gardens, clearing and planting up the beds to give a delightful show of year-round colour.

She was also a generous host, both at home and at St Andrew's, where she ran a team of ladies for the early 'Loner's Lunches' on Wednesdays in the church hall, producing food fit for royalty to many of our church family.

She loved nature and the natural world and travelled over oceans, seas and continents, from Antarctica to Galapagos, bird-watching and animal watching with the family - and very often sharing those experiences with close friends - I being one of those fortunate to have been on Safaris in Africa, in the rain forests of Costa Rica and amongst the ancient monuments in Egypt and the Incas in Peru.

Of course, her service to the church was outstanding. Her 'sweet playing on the organ' (and the piano) was her abiding passion and, when the church was refurbished, she spent hours in meetings and trying out various organs before finding the 'right' one to replace the old Makin.

She would practise for hours, muttering to herself and tut-tutting when she made mistakes, going over and over the passage until it was correct! She organised 'organ days' with Church Organ World who transported organs to St Andrew's, drawing organists from far and wide to try them out, with Carina, hosting, always at hand providing tea and cakes for attendees.

She was also a faithful and valued singing member of the Oxshott Choral Society, and I have worked with this wonderful 'little fire-cracker'(!)

for thirty years. Together we rehearsed Senior and Junior choirs through Christmas carols, Easter anthems, and plays and musicals such as 'Jonah Man Jazz', all memorable for the delight and fun we all had working together and making music. Many of those children were given theory lessons for exams, and were accompanied by Carina on their big exam days.

Weddings were fun! She was always keen to please - when young couples got married in the church, she would search far and wide to find appropriate exit music for them - 'Ski Sunday', or 'The World Cup', or the more traditional, such as 'Toccata' by Widor. She even played for her own daughter Lara's wedding; on that special occasion, all the choir could see of her was her beautiful pink hat sitting on top of the organ while she played!

A strong character and a stickler for high standards and perfection where possible, she was always reliable, always committed, always willing to help and always generous. She was my right arm in our church services and practices, a wonderful 'music partner' and a precious, much-cherished, friend. Right now she will be singing with the angels and, hopefully, they'll be a heavenly organ for her to play!

She will be sorely missed by everyone - not least by myself.

Kailean led us round the 3-acre site, explaining the development of each of the features including the orchards, the story-telling fire pit, the ponds, the beehive & demo area, bird watching area, bird nest cam and the sensory garden, with features for the deaf and the blind.



Our volunteering effort at our Mission Partner involved weeding around the fruit trees and digging an initial strip of the proposed wild flower meadow.

Our Mission Partners in Pakistan open our minds and hearts in numerous ways; Revd Jolyon Trickey explains, and brings us up to date...



Dause to imagine for a moment the implications of the following:

- Pakistan has Iran, Afghanistan, China and India as its neighbours....
- It is a Muslim-majority country of over 200 million, yet has a long history of Christian education and Christian hospitals that is highly valued and respected!
- The Pakistan Constitution (& Flag) embody religious freedom, yet it is the 8th most dangerous place in the world to live as a Christian! (See Open Doors Watch List 2022)

Sialkot District (in red) is

in the North East of

Pakistan, bordering India

Also, Pakistan is one of only nine countries with nuclear weapons, and as I write, the country is in political turmoil. Prime Minister Imran Khan, who had been fighting for his political life, has been forced to resign.

It is important for us to be informed, and the Bishop of Sialkot, The Rt Revd Alwin Samuel, has asked us to prav fervently 'for political stability' in Pakistan.

Sialkot Diocese. where we focus our attention. is world-renowned for its leather goods, footballs and medical instruments.

Yet the Covid pandemic has had a profound health and economic impact, especially upon the poorest.

Over the last two years,

we at St Andrew's have made a material difference, with targeted gifts of nearly £5,000. This is over and above our annual commitment of £3,000 per year.

Revd Dr Qaiser Julius, Director of the Open Theological Seminary (OTS) in Lahore, is our main partner in promoting Christian education and discipleship in Sialkot Diocese. He also plays a key role in leading the Increase Association providing TEE (Tools that Equip and Empower) to

ordinary Christians in Asia. This is where two thirds of the world's population live and Christians are often a minority faith group. Qaiser is pictured here (right), in Turkey, at Increase's first in-

person gathering for over two years.

Our prayers and support for him, his influence and his family (wife Rahila, daughter Homila and son Hannan) are invaluable and led by one of St Andrew's Life Groups, led by Ron & Jackie Stewart.

A growing number

A recent report upon progress in Sialkot revealed that, by summer 2021, six OTS classes, three of them new, are now run through Sialkot Diocese, with 75 students. Each of these is being formed in Christian character and life, not merely knowledge about faith. A new Memorandum of Understanding with Sialkot Diocese was signed last year, aiming to build upon this.

There are also a growing number of other classes in the region and Teenager Programmes have started in three different areas. Total participants are already nearly 400, with an impact upon nearly 3,000 family members.

Oxshott Care: during and post Covid

Like many local organisations, Oxshott Care has had to adapt over recent months, as Margaret North explains...

here can be little doubt about the huge impact Covid has had on all our lives - it has certainly affected how we have operated Oxshott Care. Suddenly, all hospital and GP appointments ceased. Consultations began to take place online or by phone. Our friendly car service, manned as always by our volunteers, was no longer in demand. We had to re-think ourselves.

We had a number of people on our client list whom we knew lived alone, so we looked at ways in which we might be able to offer them support. We offered phone chats, perhaps a prescription needed collecting or some shopping; we even organised dog-walking for one of our clients. Possibly the phone calls were the most appreciated - we are all familiar with the sense of isolation that the lockdown periods visited on us.

We are now very much 'up and running' as face-to-face appointments return, so please do not hesitate to ask us to help with transport.

How you can help

Oxshott Care is a voluntary organisation and this is an opportunity to tell you that we always need more volunteers - we shall never turn you away!

You will not be asked to do more than one journey a month and the greater number of volunteers we have, the less frequently you will be asked to help.

drink and a delicious curry supper with members and guests. Peter Crossman, the Club coach, masterminded the event which was a great


success - great for squash, for the Club and for the Garden Route Children's Trust, which received £2,000 to help educate and feed South African children.

Tudor royal residence to Art Deco home

On another pre-Covid ASCO coach visit, a group visited Eltham Palace, south east of Greenwich Park. **Nicky Orlebar** tells all...

edieval in origin, the 1470 Great Hall with imposing oak hammerbeam roof was used as a dining hall for the court, the king sitting on a dais, with food brought in from behind an impressive carved wooden screen.

Eltham was a favourite Tudor royal residence where the future Henry VIII spent much of his childhood. But over the centuries, Eltham gradually fell into disrepair. The land became a farm using the Great Hall as a barn, depicted in a 1790 painting by JMW Turner.

In the 1930s, wealthy Stephen and Virginia Courtauld, of the successful rayon business, redeveloped the site to create an outstanding modern private house where they could invite their many society and artistic friends. Commissioning famous European designers, the ambitious restoration involved adding a spacious residential extension to blend in externally with the Great Hall. Inside, a highly fashionable Art Deco home emerged. The large entrance hall was lit by a large round, shallow domed ceiling window incorporating small circles of glass resembling cats' eyes. Together with exclusive hand-made furniture and huge circular rug in shades of brown, beige and fawn, the hall was perfect for entertaining. On the walls the marquetry wooden panels showing Venice and Stockholm, were likened to the 'ocean liner style'.


But it was in the dining room (right) that the Italian designer Peter Malacrida excelled himself. Above the long rectangular table, he recessed the ceiling and covered it with aluminium leaf, set against a blue background. With the concealed lights turned on, the ceiling was said to shimmer and twinkle above the guests.



The Courtaulds were all for incorporating 1930s mod-cons such as electric fires, an audio system to all rooms, and heated bathroom towel rails.

English Heritage has looked after the Great Hall since 1984, and in 1995 became responsible for restoring the whole Eltham Palace site to how it looked in the Courtaulds' time.






