Visitors are welcome - we ask for a contribution of £5 per visit.



In a speech at the Lambeth Conference held in August, the Archbishop of York (Stephen Cottrell) said this:

McDonalds make hamburgers. Cadburys make chocolate. Starbucks make coffee.

The Simon Bolivar Youth Orchestra of

Venezuela make music. Heineken make beer.

Tovota make cars. Rolex make watches.

And sisters and brothers, the Church of Jesus Christ makes disciples.

That is our core business. That is what we are about.

Not just converts. Jesus doesn't say 'go into the world and make converts.' He doesn't say 'go into the world and make churchgoers.' He says 'make disciples.' Followers of Jesus.

St Andrew's Oxshott is committed to disciple-making (as well as serving our community). This might begin with baptism/christening, and it has been a thrill for Patrick and me to have conducted a good number of these this year, often on a Sunday afternoon, with family and friends gathered in support and celebration. In the service, we say that: 'In baptism (this child) begins his/her journey in faith.'

The journey has just begun, and we regard it as our privilege that, as your church, we can help to foster the growth of young disciples by offering opportunities for families to learn together on a Sunday afternoon at St Andrew's @4 or through weekly activities at the 10am service.

For adults, we offer courses such as Alpha and Christianity Explored. Patrick (Davies) will run this latter during the autumn as a way of preparing adults and teenagers for confirmation. Life Groups - which meet weekly or fortnightly in people's homes or at church - are designed to help all of us to grow as disciples; for more information please email Patrick Fleming at: lifegroups@standrewsoxshott.org.uk

Whoever you are, whatever your age or background, you are warmly invited to come and find out more, to let us help you grow as a follower of Jesus, because we believe - like the Archbishop of York - that is what God's church is all about.

## 'Questions for God'

As **Jolyon Trickey** outlines, the upcoming teaching series is in response to the questions on people's hearts and minds today...

he unusual title, 'Questions for God', refers to the St Andrew's sermons and Life Group studies for the early autumn, 11 September to 4 October. These arose out of a concern in the ministry team (our preachers and services leaders, lay and ordained) that we tackle some things on people's minds at the moment.

Consultation produced a very long list of topics and questions! A few have been shaped into this series and others will be tackled in other series over the coming year.

Psalm 139 is beautiful. It describes how we are known, uniquely formed and held in God, whatever our circumstances. Near the end, the Psalmist writes: *Search me O God, and know my heart, test me and know my anxious thoughts.* He wonderfully captures the way in which even those

with faith are troubled by their thoughts and reactions to things in life and in the world. He implies that we can bring even these to God.

At the moment these might include the experience and impacts of the pandemic, the prospect of a looming economic crisis and the reality of war in Ukraine (and elsewhere).



We have therefore chosen this as a theme verse and the Psalm as a setting for our reflections. We will also use other Psalms and a New Testament reading each week to underpin our reflections.

The four questions we will address are:

11 September	Why do I feel so downhearted?
18 September	What am I to make of all the war in the world?
25 September	How am I to respond to an economic crisis?
2 October (Harvest)	Is there hope when things seem hopeless?

We hope the families enjoy meeting up!


It's Ride & Stride time again: this year: 10 September.



## Inspiration at Send

The MU has long had links with HMP Send, and **Rosalind Ebbutt- Hadman** was thrilled to attend an Art Exhibition there...

t the end of June I went to an extraordinary art exhibition at HMP Send, which is a closed female training prison, south of Ripley. The exhibition was called 'Our Time', and was organised by Sally Varah, the Chairman of the Michael Varah Memorial Fund, which, together with the Watts Gallery, organises art classes for inmates at the prison.



Once there - I went with Antonia Wilson, former MU diocesan President -

and through very minimal security, since we were all expected, having signed up beforehand, we went into an exhibition of quite outstanding painting, drawing and sculpture.

The artists were nearly all present, and talked to us as we went round about their projects.

Sally Varah also gave a presentation, and most of the artists gave a brief summary of their work, and the effect these weekly lessons have had on their view of life, and how to deal with their many problems.

Their art teacher, who works for the Watts Gallery, also spoke.

#### An astonishing standard

Nearly all the inspiration and examples are from photographs, which she has taught her students to interpret through a variety of mediums to an astonishing standard. One section of the exhibition was work from an artist who left Send four years ago, and is now a professional commercial artist.

We were able to buy any of the works, or commission a further version of one already sold. The prices were just to cover costs of materials. There were also cards of various types - also available at the Watts Gallery.

It was so inspiring to see how an idea like this, with thought and help, could turn lives around.

There should be another exhibition next summer, in 2023, and I'll certainly go if I can. It's easy to apply - I would so encourage others to go as well.

## Practical partnership with A Rocha (UK)

A Rocha is our newest national mission partner, focussed on care for creation. We gave them over £3,000 in 2021. Our hands-on link is with Wolf Fields, just 20 miles away – close enough to visit!

n Wednesday 22 June, three members of Carl Jackson's Life Group travelled to Southall to join the A Rocha working party at Wolf

Fields. We continued with preparation of the plot set aside for a wild flower meadow. We have now cleared 50 sq metres of both large roots and smaller weeds. We raked this level and cleared a section of a large quantity of stones ready for some demonstration sowing at the open day.

The remainder of the plot, about 250 sq metres, is now cleared of surface brambles and is being covered with a horticultural fabric to suppress further growth. The ground is currently 'rock hard', so further digging must await the rain to soften the soil. In the autumn, additional volunteers will be very welcome to tackle the hard work in this substantial area.

On 25 June, A Rocha held their Act for *Nature* open day at Wolf Fields, attended by

about 27 people, including 3 from St Andrew's. The Wolf Fields manager, Kailean Khongsi, led a tour around the site, explaining the purpose of the various features including a pond, a sensory garden, a tactile garden, an area of wild flower and a fruit tree orchard. A bee-keeper gave a very informative talk at the site beehive on bees, their habits, lifecycle etc. She recommended reading the government's *The National Pollinator Strategy:* for bees and other pollinators in England.

Andy Atkins, the A Rocha CEO, then gave a talk on the history of A Rocha and its aspirations - its aim is to protect and restore the natural world in conjunction with reducing the impact of climate change, through various strands of activity, including a Wild Christian scheme, Eco Church (to which St Andrew's, and 5,000 other churches, now belong) and *Partners* in Action, a collaborative network of Christian land managers demonstrating active care for the natural world.

## Signs of real progress

FEDORA believe they have seen tangible progress in a number of their initiatives, as **Anthony Wolfe** reports...

ollowing a meeting on 30 June 2022 of Elmbridge Borough Council's Local Spending Board for Cobham & Downside, Oxshott and Stoke D'Abernon, it is a pleasure to report that Oxshott has secured funding for a number of road and safety initiatives. This is especially true as

it was the first time for a very long time that such funding has been secured for Oxshott.

The funding was in connection with three specific initiatives:



#### • A 20 mph limit for the village centre

20 mph speed limit for the centre of the village has now been given the go-ahead and in this case the agreed funding is to be provided by Surrey Highways. This covers both the A244 and Oakshade Road. Further details will follow in the next issue of the FEDORA magazine.

• A new pathway past The Victoria and Surrey Hills Butchers
A new pathway is planned to provide a continuous footway on the east side of the High Street, outside The Victoria pub and Surrey Hills
Butchers. Although there are a number of steps required to turn intent into legal agreements so that the path can be built, this scheme would supplement the 20mph limit for the A244 in the village centre, which is already scheduled for 2022-23.

#### Installation of average speed cameras

A significant financial contribution from the Local Spending Board has been allocated for the installation of two average speed cameras on the A244 Leatherhead Road, with their locations to be set at the village gateway to the south and the area between The Bear and the access to Danes Hill School to the north. However, further funding has yet to be identified.

#### Furthermore...

### **Sandy Lane**

Another initiative that will be of interest to Oxshott residents was a submission made by Cobham & Downside RA to develop a scheme that reduces the speed limit along Sandy Lane from 40mph to 30mph without streetlights. This was following a survey that established that the top priority

for residents was to lower the speed limit. The Local Spending Board agreed to kick-start the project with some initial funding.

#### Other initiatives

We will look to update local residents on a broad range of other initiatives. These include:

- The concept of an HGV night-time ban.
- Paths outside Willow View and Oxshott Lodge on the A244.
- Reduction of speeds on Fairoak Lane.
- A crossing at the intersection of Steels Lane, Oakshade Road and Holtwood Road.

But common to all of them is that these projects will need to secure funding over at least the next two or three years.

## Portraits with panache

Oxshott Arts & Crafts Society completed its 2021/22 programme with an exciting demonstration, says **Miranda Fuller**...

ur guest on 14 June was well-known artist, Hashim Akib (pictured below), who describes his vibrant style as 'post-impressionistic'.

Working on a canvas, Hash lays down a base colour, such as pale jade green or lilac, and chooses the skin tone and the light and dark areas.

Jade green of this

Dampening his brush, Hash mixes his 'skin colours', such as yellow ochre, lemon, red, green and blue, on the palette. Using a broad flat brush, and without washing it between colours, he works in strong, vertical strokes, using thick, saturated colours, to avoid the duller effect that thinner layers can produce, and in this way avoids a formulaic look and enjoys a certain lack of control!

Using broad, dark strokes for the background and large carving marks, 'big slabs and little blobs', in no time at all he has produced a face and likeness and, by coffee break, has completed the first of two portraits!

Hash encourages strong, assertive strokes (easier said than done!) and, occasionally, a palette knife, for a less contrived effect. He uses white and

yellow, with the edge of the smallest brush, to bring out light on areas such

as the eyelids and nose. He never paints eyes or earrings in detail, suggesting them simply with touches of colour. Hair, he paints in broad, rectangular blocks and, surrounding the head with several dry blocks of colour, avoids it appearing 'contained'. Beards and moustaches, he paints with small, vertical strokes.

By the end of the demonstration, Hash had completed a second free and vibrant, yet quite recognisable portrait and, as usual, had shown us a very fresh and interesting

technique.

During the summer, members have continued their creative work and shown here (left) is Meryl Hayes's delightful watercolour of foxgloves.

## Wellington's home – Stratfield Saye

Looking for inspiration for a day out? **Nicky Orlebar** describes an interesting Arts Society visit to Wellington's country home...

tratfield Saye, in the Hampshire countryside, was originally a farmhouse dating from 1630. It was bought after the Battle of Waterloo (18 June 1815) for the first Duke of Wellington by a grateful British government now rid of Napoleon's antics.

Curiously, both Wellington and Napoleon were born in 1769.

Approached through the stable blocks, ASCO members observed how unpretentious the two-storey house appears. Despite being altered and extended by Wellington to create a manageable residence, its restraint contrasts with the lavish architecture of Blenheim Palace, built 100 years earlier for another military victor - the Duke of Marlborough.

Walking around a circular lawn in front of the house, we gazed at a statue of St George and the Dragon – a bit of a misnomer as the unfinished statue (*right*) only shows the dragon and a horse.

Inside House are displayed all the trappings of a gentleman's residence – silk wall hangings, family portraits, marble fireplaces and of course much furniture, paintings and china either gifted or bought at sales following the French Revolution.



The hall with pillars, balustrade and flags also has grey and beige geometrically patterned Roman mosaics in the floor from nearby Silchester.

Outside in the grounds, under a spreading Turkey Oak tree, stands the gravestone of Wellington's faithful stallion *Copenhagen* who carried him all day through the 1815 battle. In a nearby barn, members walked around the colossal black funeral carriage (made from captured then melted down French bronze cannons) used to convey Wellington's coffin to his state funeral and burial in St Paul's Cathedral.

Wellington's best pictures and furniture are now at Apsley House, his London residence, but it was at Stratfield Saye in Hampshire that Arthur Wellesley, 1st Duke of Wellington, established his comfortable family home.


