





A true inspiration



Since I last wrote a letter for the magazine, we have collectively mourned the loss of our late Sovereign, Queen Elizabeth II. Perhaps you travelled into London to pay your respects either at the lying-in state or at the funeral itself. Many more of us watched as events unfolded upon our television screens.



One of the memorable prayers we heard used in her majesty's funeral service was this:

 ${\it O Lord, support us all the day long of this troublous life,}\\$

Until the shades lengthen and the evening comes,

The busy world is hushed, the fever of life is over, and our work is done; Then Lord, in thy mercy, grant us safe lodging, a holy rest, and peace at last; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Many clergy use a version of this prayer in funerals as a reminder to us all that, however much we may resist the idea, our lives will - like Her Majesty's - one day come to an end.

The late Queen Elizabeth was certain about finding a 'safe lodging, a holy rest and peace at last', not because of the way she had lived her life - a life marked by a sense of duty, hard work, and service - but because she had put her trust in Jesus as her Saviour. Her Majesty expressed her relationship in this Christmas Day message from 2014, for example:

'For me, the life of Jesus Christ...is an inspiration and anchor in my life.'

For our late queen, attending church (which she did every weekend even into old age) was the outworking of a personal, daily intimacy with God. And it's the same for us here at St Andrew's Oxshott: we come together to worship, pray to and learn about God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit and share what he has been doing in every day of our lives.

What's happening with BYC?

Things may seem to have gone quiet on the 'Building Your Church' (BYC) project at St Andrew's, but trust us, a great deal of work and prayer has been going on behind the scenes. This has been both on the 'people' side of the project as well as the 'building' side, because BYC is much more than just bricks and mortar. Frances and Ron explain...

n the 'people' side of BYC, 2022 has seen the very successful introduction of ABC for Adults, Babies and young Children, alongside the re-starting of other ministries, such as Lunch Club, Craft Group, Life Groups, Open the Book at RKS, and St Andrew's @4, a monthly afternoon service for those with primary-school aged children and younger.

We love being able to welcome and serve the community of Oxshott once again, and we are delighted to announce that Patrick Davies will be staying at St Andrew's for another 3 years at the end of his time as curate to lead much of this work.

Transformational

On the building side of BYC, we have faced a few setbacks, not least a rejection of some of our plans at pre-planning stage, which has caused us to re-imagine the space we already have in creative ways, and at a more achievable cost. This new approach has also been driven by the deferral of any CIL (see right) contribution until 2023 and the inevitable

pressure on funding in the current economic climate.

Nonetheless, with an extremely generous offer from a donor connected to church and a planned programme of further fundraising, added to our existing funds, we are confident that we will have the means to make changes to our buildings that will be transformational, better enabling us to serve our local community.

During November, we will be sharing more of our Vision and plans in church on Sundays and in presentations at other times. Please see the website and Weekly News for details of when these will take place.

We value every aspect of your support as we embark on this exciting chapter in the life of St Andrew's.





Empowering Christians in Nepal

The Church has more outlets in more countries and in more local communities than Starbucks. Vastly more!

As **Jolyon Trickey** reminds us, Tanka and Rita Subedi, our Mission Partners in Nepal, have spent 30 years growing churches, equipping leaders and multiplying 'outlets'...

anka and Rita Subedi have been at the forefront of church growth and church planting in a Hindu nation; between 8% and 10% of Nepali people now profess a

Christian faith. One of the keys to this exponential growth for Tanka & Rita has been use of TEE (Theological Education by Extension).

The model and materials they have used were originally written for the indigenous peoples of South America and are now available in nearly 100

languages. In Nepal, Rita was the first to translate them into Nepali, her English being better than Tanka's at that point. Their genius is that they offer programmed and applied learning, delivered in small groups. This eq

and applied learning, delivered in small groups. This equips ordinary people to be disciples and even to lead Churches.

Many who undertake these courses, even in remote villages are more biblically literate, theologically grounded and formed in Christian living than ordinary Christians in the UK. It is a wonderfully empowering, cascade model, which also multiplies church leaders and provides them with a means of growing their local, often remote, churches.

It is this TEE that Tanka and Rita have used in their own local 'Family of God' Church, now with five congregations, and is offered to churches and church leaders all across Nepal, whom Tanka and Rita are often travelling to meet and encourage. On one such trip early in 2022, Tanka encouraged a pastor and all his youth study groups with bibles and certificates, and nearby he baptised another group of young believers in the local river course (see below left).



together, train and encourage Church leaders from across Nepal. In September, they led this gathering for 150 Church Leaders in Chitwan, 6 hours from Kathmandu.

Our regular financial contributions of at least £3,000 each year make a big difference to Christians in Nepal through Tanka and Rita's active ministry.

Equally important to Tanka and Rita is the personal support we offer; they have two teenage daughters, and the economy and cost of living in Nepal are challenging. They both have (sometimes expensive) health issues - as I write. Tanka is recovering at home from dengue fever. This is

common, but can have severe complications. His platelet levels are normal, but his exhaustion may take weeks to clear.

Our confidential prayer support is therefore vital – offered by the Ladies Life Group that meets on Friday mornings and also by the church as a whole. If you pray, please remember them in your prayers.

Remembrance 2022



Remembrance is nearly upon us; as the names of those from Oxshott who died in the wars are read out once again, it is easy to forget they were individuals. **Patrick Davies** tells the story of just one of them...

rederick George Cotterell (pictured, right) was born in Cobham in 1895. His parents, James and Jessie, and their family lived in Littleheath Lane. He had three brothers, and eight sisters.

Fred worked as a gardener locally, and took a keen interest in the Church, and sang in the choir as a boy, as well as being a member of the Oxshott Men's Club.

Along with **Walter Akerman** (whose sister is pictured top row, second from left in the picture below),

Fred was amongst the first from our village to enlist, joining the 7th Battalion East Surrey Regiment. It was reported that both these young men 'acquitted themselves in a highly meritorious manner during all the months of training, and at the Front'.

In November 1915 it was reported by the War Office that a number from the 7th East Surrey were 'Missing, believed to have been killed' - and it later became clear that both Walter and Frederick had been killed in action on 13 October 1915, a day their Battalion had suffered very heavy losses.

At this time of Remembrance, we also asked Leon Reed for his personal thoughts, having taken a prominent part in the Remembrance Service for many years. This is what he wrote:

During the many years that I, and my late dear wife, have worshipped at St Andrew's, it has been my privilege, on a number of occasions, to have been asked to take an active part in the annual 'Service of Remembrance'

On the appointed day, I had no trouble in keeping my composure whilst reading out the names of ex-Oxshott residents who had perished in the two World Wars, and those of the Canadian forces (previously encamped in Oxshott Woods) who had met their end in the 1939-45 conflict.

Things took a different tack, however, when I commenced to recite the 'Prayer to the Common Memory' and by the time the Last Post was played, I could feel my eyes brimming over at the thought of the senseless waste of life - albeit on both sides.

This feeling lasted for the two minutes' silence, during which I tried to stand at attention as I had been drilled in the Navy (and before as a cadet) before being released from the tension by the sound of 'Reveille'.

As a result of 'baring my soul' here in this fashion, some of my friends might now realise that they never knew the 'inner me'. So be it!

Enjoying inspiration

Oxshott Art & Crafts Society members continue to be inspired, as Miranda Fuller reports...

OACS began its 2022/23 programme on 13 September with an excellent demonstration of a landscape in watercolour by artist Frank Walters, pictured

here, who teaches at Kew Art Studio and was visiting us for the first time. His use of an overhead projector and

screen enabled us to see clearly his every stroke; without any pencil sketch, he applies a light wash, followed by mid tones 'with quite punchy values' and, finally, the 'hard dark shadows', allowing each stage to dry first.

Although his style is fast, expressive, and loose, Frank emphasises the need for patience and to resist the urge to complete a painting

in one quick go. He also warns against the temptation to draw the subject carefully first, and paint within the lines, producing, he says, a 'painting by

numbers' picture. Figures in a landscape should be simple, 'carrot' figures, not detailed, and Frank reminds us to include their shadows, for which he recommends purple. He finishes with encouragement to relax, to give ourselves the freedom fully to enjoy painting; by the end of the evening, we had not one painting, but three - how easy he made it all look!

The Elmbridge Moving Art Exhibition, from 5 to 30 October at the Robert Phillips Gallery, Riverhouse Barn Arts Centre in Walton, featuring several of our members' work, was a lively, vibrant and varied exhibition, of a high standard. OACS member Janet Argent and I were at the exhibition's launch.

A visit to Lancaster House

Another historic London destination for an ASCO visit found members outside Lancaster House, as Nicky Orlebar recalls...

ancaster House (previously York, Stafford or Sutherland House, depending on the owner) is situated off the Mall, and overlooks Green Park towards Buckingham Palace.

Begun in 1825 for the Duke of York, second son of George Ill, it was built on land originally part of St James's Palace, the nearby road being called Stable Yard. Constructed of golden Bath stone in the Georgian style, the imposing building was three stories high. In the basement were the kitchens and staff rooms, the ground floor was for the family, on the first floor were the State rooms for soirées and society dinners, while bedrooms were found on the second floor.

It was in 1912 that the then owner Lord Leverhulme renamed the House after his home county of Lancaster, before presenting it to the Nation.

Richly decorated

Our knowledgeable guide Dr James Yorke led us into the entrance hall and up the elegant sweeping Grand Staircase (often used in films) to the suite of Louis IV-style State rooms.



These were richly decorated with much gold leaf and, in the extremely Long Gallery, we gazed in awe at the many paintings and portraits from the Government Art Collection. Sometimes these pictures are lent to our Embassies abroad. In the Music Room, Chopin played for Victoria and Albert. Architects Wyatt, Barry and Smirk all added to the opulence of the decoration, such that Queen Victoria was overheard remarking to the then owner Harriet, Duchess of Sutherland, "My dear, I have come from my house to your palace."

Lancaster House today belongs to HM Government and is only occasionally open to the public. We saw little or no furniture as this is brought in depending on the function the room is being used for, such as for official meetings, conferences or entertaining.

The Duke of York (1763-1827) for whom the House was built is remembered in the rhyme *Oh, the grand old Duke of York,* who, when not Commander in Chief of the British Army, spent a little of his time at Oatlands, his country residence near Weybridge, here in Surrey.




