


Be prepared...

Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have.

(1 Peter 3.15)

Dear Friends,

During my time at university, I was asked to lead the student Christian Union as President. At the time, I was living in a student house about ten minutes bus ride from where my regular lectures took place. One morning,



The perfect opportunity: ten minutes to share about my faith in Jesus in response to a genuine, unprompted question! But, sadly, I found I couldn't do it! I just wasn't sure where to start, how to explain what Christian faith meant, what I believed, and how it all impacted my life. I tried to give something of an answer, but, in reality, I am not sure it was very helpful or clear!

For most of us, the confidence to share faith with others about is not something that just happens automatically. Most often we have to work on it, prepare, and think it through. Living and speaking for Jesus is not always easy - but by preparing we can become ready to respond when opportunities come our way.

During Lent, at St Andrew's we will be doing some of this preparation together. Over 40 days, using LICC's 'Confidence' resources*, we will think about the reason for the hope we have as Christians, and grow in our confidence and readiness to live and speak for Jesus.

If you are curious to find out more about the Christian hope, Lent and Easter are great opportunities to explore this. Perhaps start by talking to a Christian you know... a friend, a neighbour, or me!

After Easter we plan to run a short, 3-week course called 'Hope Explored' which looks at the life, death and resurrection of Jesus through Luke's gospel. If you would like to find out more about this course, do please be in touch.

Celebrating mothering

Join us here at St Andrew's as we celebrate Mothering Sunday this month; but did you know why we do so?...

n 19 March most churches, like St Andrew's, will celebrate their 'mothers'. £millions will be spent on Mother's Day gifts and cards, and children will give flowers to women in church. It's a joy to honour mothers for their love and caring, but our blessings are lessened when we forget the Day's original purpose.

The Mother's Day we know today began on 12 May 1907, in America,



when a woman called Anna Jarvis held a service in her late mother's church to honour her work of organising women's groups to promote friendship and health. The idea spread, and in 1914 Mother's Day was declared an official celebration.

But the European Mothering Sunday goes back to the 16th century, and was altogether more faith-based. On the fourth Sunday of Lent people went 'a-mothering', going to their 'mother' church, the main church in the region, for a special service.

In those days domestic servants rarely had free days, but they were given a day off during

Lent, so they could go along with their mothers and families. Times changed, and by the 1900s Mothering Sunday had largely changed into Mother's Day – a celebration of mothers more than mother churches.

The value of Nurturing

Many Scriptures describe the mothering qualities of God, for example Isaiah 66.13 – 'As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you.'

We also see it in women without children. I remember a spinster head teacher in a poor district in Wales mothering and bringing the best out of 'her' children.

We see it in our housing and care homes, in older women who have never been mothers as well as those who have, as they comfort a carer who has had a miscarriage, or who needs encouragement. We see it in pastors, and in men who nurture others.

Let's thank God for His gift of 'mothering', wherever we find it. *Louise Morse, via Parish Pump*

Please arrive at 5pm to be seated by 5.15pm.


Then on the following day, Wednesday 8 March, the BBC will broadcast

Shining the light in South Africa

Our Mission Partners in Cape Town, Dean and Paula Finnie, are optimistic – despite the trials they and their congregation have living in the face of multiple pressures. **Paula Finnie** explains why...

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it (John 1:5)

ike everywhere else in the world, life is very tough for South Africans right now. We truly live in a dark world and we are so grateful to God

for our mandate as Christians to go and make disciples, telling them about Jesus, the Light of the World, the only One who can bring about the transformation in lives that we all so desperately need.

The Gathering continues to see the full impact of years of Government corruption, the Covid-19 pandemic, loss of livelihoods, inability to pay school fees, clothe and feed children, look after the elderly, meet medical needs, the destructive influence of drugs and alcohol, domestic abuse, unemployment figures through the roof and loss of hope.

All of this would be more than enough to cope with, but our nation continues to battle with daily electricity 'loadshedding', the power being cut off for 2 or 4 hour stretches twice or three times a day. The

power cuts are scheduled in advance, but can quite often increase with just a few minutes' notice. You can imagine the havoc this causes to family life, businesses, students, people on the roads travelling with no traffic lights, electrical appliances giving up as they are switched on and off regularly, etc.



Just one national power company supplies the grid, there is no competition and an awful lot of corruption. And the company have just confirmed that the current situation will continue daily for the next 2 years!

So, our outreach as a church continues to grow and morph with the general decline all around us. The numbers of people coming to

our weekly soup kitchen have increased

dramatically, and we are also seeing more and more people previously seen

as 'better off' attending alongside those who are really struggling.

We were thrilled, therefore, to be able to provide three very special soup kitchens over Christmas with donations from St Andrew's, where we made 140 litres of ham and pea soup (a real treat!), together with bread, noodles, peanut pastes and beautiful handmade cookies to take away, telling people of God's love for them, and assuring them that there is always a place they can call home at The Gathering.

More space to do more?

To try to help alleviate the above needs in our small way, we have found ourselves more often sourcing large quantities of food for the soup kitchen. The church is full to the brim with oats, pasta, noodles, peanut pastes, herbs and spices, as well as toiletries, sanitary pads for girls in the community so that they don't miss school, stationery and clothing!

We can barely move and therefore we long to acquire the whole row of buildings where The Gathering currently meet. We have made a very good



offer to the landlord and were hoping to sign an Offer to Purchase on 31 January. God has miraculously supplied all the money for us to make this offer and we believe that the buildings are ours. However, our landlord is now stalling, so it is currently a huge lesson in trust and faith for us all.

We cannot wait to move into all that we know God has spoken to us about. Some of our plans are to use the buildings to expand our Maths Homework Club, to start a literacy club, to set up a food and clothing bank, to offer debt relief services, to maybe house a clinic once a week and to have more opportunity to chat and pray with people, to start to meet regularly for women's and men's Bible study, to set up a Friday evening Youth and to use the small apartment at the back of the buildings as a women's refuge.

All of this as well as to have a much bigger meeting space on a Sunday, and for our weekly prayer meetings!

Sad news for all of us who have supported Traidcraft in the past...

raidcraft PLC – a Christian group that spent years campaigning for fair trade – has gone into administration. The stands were familiar to many churchgoers, with almost 3,000 churches in the country selling Traidcraft products at some point in their 40-year history.

The brand cited the coronavirus pandemic, the war in Ukraine and soaring energy prices as the reasons behind the severe financial difficulties.

Good things come to those who wait!

Oxshott Scouts and Guides has been awarded a Your Fund Surrey Grant to rebuild their dilapidated building, as an overjoyed Anja Davidson, Oxshott Group Scout Leader, reports...

t was back in spring of 2018, when I went to the then Guide Leader, Lina Heather, and said, "Isn't in a time we try and get this project off the ground once again?" I had recently taken over as Group Scout Leader. Our Scout and Guide buildings were falling down. We had had some **Scouts** roof leaks, finger-wide cracks were appearing and

claim. There had been work before to try to get the project started, but it didn't get very far. This time around, with my son in Scouts and my daughter in Guides, I felt we had a good leadership relationship on both the Guide and Scout side.

It was time to try to start again.

we had recently been successful on a subsidence



Lina and I got together a small group with the experience and commitment to take this project forward to the next level.

This is now 4½ years ago and there have been many ups and downs and hurdles along the way, including Covid, the increase in building costs and the cost-of-living crisis. Tragically, Lina passed away in 2021 and so is no longer with us to see her dream turn into reality.

In the summer of 2020 Covid happened and life changed in ways we couldn't have foreseen. We were struggling to obtain grant funding, with many bodies directing their funds towards Covid recovery. We had obtained a grant from Elmbridge through their Community Infrastructure Levy and we were grateful to be able to use it to either rebuild or repair our building. We were reaching the conclusion that we would have to repair, rather than rebuild, when Surrey County Council's Your Fund Surrey (YFS) project was announced, with a fund of £100 million to fund community projects over 5 years.

We had yet another crisis meeting, and unanimously decided that as we had a project ready to go with full planning permission, we had to try to obtain funding from YFS. We registered our interest in late 2020 and started the application process. We did have some setbacks along the way, such as having to totally re-tender the project, as well as having to seek a new planning permission because the 3-year start period had expired...

And I am so overjoyed to be able to say we have finally, after 2½ years

of hard graft, meeting after meeting, form after form, been awarded the remaining full grant needed to be able to rebuild what will be known as the "Oxshott Community Hub", the home of Oxshott Scouts and Guides. We also look forward to a wide range of community groups using the wonderful new facility.

As I am writing this the planning application is going through its due process, with a

decision hopefully by the end of February 2023.

Demonstrators are therefore showing us how to use alternatives. These consisted of the good old-fashioned chicken wire and a new form of coated wire that is available in various colours. These can be reused and look more attractive.

Angela also arranged flowers in various containers she had made herself and as she said, 'plonked some flowers artfully in vases'. Her arrangements were accompanied by some beautiful pieces of music expertly organised by her husband.

Looking back at Oxshott Station

Here's a view you may not have seen, of Oxshott Station in the 1950s. And here we contrast it with the current scene. **Brian Cox** explains the background and some key features...

tation and tracks, the read on the left that goes up to the main read and the

station and tracks, the road on the left that goes up to the main road and the passenger footbridge.

Less obvious, perhaps, is that the station buildings are also little changed from when the station opened as "Oxshott & Fairmile" on 2 February 1885.



he picture above is taken from a film made sometime in the early 1950s, and even a casual look reveals several changes that have taken place since then. The most obvious are:

- The **signal box** on the right-hand side has long since gone, taken down soon after the film was recorded.
- There is a goods siding (that ends about where the bike storage now stands), and points allowing trains to cross from the main track to the siding. This third track actually extended all the way to the brickworks that were sited where Somerville Road now stands. You can still see evidence of this, in that the pedestrian bridge at Sheath Lane is overwide (to cover the three tracks), and the level crossing from Blundel Lane to Littleheath Lane has signs of an extra gate on the north side.
- The **platforms** were much shorter than they are now these were both extended on the 'down' side of the station, towards Cobham, in 2012.

A number of features are unchanged, of course: the general layout of the

The visual treasures of Strawberry Hill

For this month's Arts Society trip, Nicky Orlebar explores a 'gothick castle' very near to home...

n 1748, 30-year-old Horace Walpole (son of the first British Prime Minister, Sir Robert Walpole), unconvinced he wanted to enter Parliament, bought a rundown farmhouse near fashionable Twickenham. Not only was it a short two-hour coach ride from London, but it was beside the Thames, surrounded by countryside and when converted he envisaged a perfect summer retreat which he was to call Strawberry Hill.

Walpole set about making plans for 'a little gothick castle'. Having been on a Grand Tour, he decided he was not interested in anything as stylish as classicism or Palladianism. He rather fancied the Gothic style of pointed arches, quatrefoil windows often with coloured glass, and rib vaults as found in castles and cathedrals. To this end he gathered his friends and convened a Committee of Taste.

More theatrics...

Continuing the theatrics, the entrance to Strawberry Hill was via the 'gloomth' of a grey hall; but moving through the house, gradually each room grew brighter (such as the pink Round Drawing room and blue Tribune), eventually leading to the Gallery (right). Here the fan-vaulted white and gold ceiling (as copied from Westminster Abbey) set against deep red walls completely

surprised his visitors, both friends and those paying to be shown around by the housekeeper.

The original farmhouse was extended over the years in all directions and now included two towers, turrets, battlements, rows of chimneys and a cloister. From the garden, the white lime-

washed exterior walls (above) were likened to a wedding cake. His summer haven was now complete.

Just where does the name Strawberry Hill come from? When Walpole first found the site, people were calling the farmhouse Chopp'd Straw Hall because chopped straw was fed to the horses; only when checking earlier leases did Horace Walpole find the name Strawberry Hill mentioned.






