

Challenges and Changes

The Cobham Area Foodbank, one of St Andrew's Mission Partners, has seen some changes - as **Christina van Roest**, Trustee and General Manager, explains...

e all go through difficult times, but there are people in our community who really suffer.

The 'cost of living crisis' involves not only the financial aspect of lacking the money to pay the bills, but also coping with sudden redundancies, fighting

Covid-19 and flu, which are still circulating, and 'simply' putting food on the table.

Clients find themselves without enough money, even when they are employed. That is the very sad situation for many families. Rents, food and utility prices have gone up to such levels

that there is no realistic chance for the clients to be able to improve their finances by themselves in the short term, even when they have a job.

have a job. Facing these challenges, many suffer serious mental health situations.

Thanks to the generosity of many donors, especially from St Andrew's Oxshott and many individuals, we have sufficient funding and stock in the warehouse to help all clients who come to us for help. However, we must not get complacent, because we reached the point again that more kilograms of food go out than come in: in February 2023 we received 2,168 kg from our all our collection points, but 3,029 kg went to 67 families. (In comparison, 4,067 kg came in and 2,923 kg went out in the month of December 2022.) We were

able to be very generous with treats and special Christmas food for all our clients. Many thanks for your

generous contributions, both financial and food donations. From April 2022 to March 2023, St Andrew's food donations were 485kg.



An holistic approach

We continue to subscribe to the Trussell Trust and we follow a holistic approach offering 'More than just food', signposting our clients to many organisations offering support to their specific situation.

We have fed 2,298 people since April

2022 (955 children and 1,343 adults).

This number is not much higher than the previous year, but the big difference is that in the last two months we are now helping more adults who have full time jobs but need our help at the Foodbank due to their low income, debt, and deprivation.

We do not dare to mention any predictions for the rest of this year, as the 'Cost of Living Crisis' can hit anyone in our society at any time. We are very grateful to our volunteers (numbering about 80) who make it all possible, with your donations, to help the large number of clients in need.

We will keep supporting our clients in Cobham, Oxshott, Stoke D'Abernon, Downside, East & West Horsley, and Effingham with your continuing generous help.

Christian Aid Week

As a background to this year's Christian Aid Week, **Mark Currie** outlines the scale of the work being done...

hristian Aid was founded in 1945 by the British and Irish churches to help refugees following the Second World War. For more than 75 years Christian Aid has provided humanitarian relief and long-term development support for poor communities worldwide, while highlighting suffering, tackling injustice and championing people's rights regardless of their faith.

2022 was a big year for supporting refugees in the Ukraine, and the ripple effects of that conflict have spread far and wide.

Escalated by the war in Ukraine and the relentless drought, children in East Africa are caught in the middle. **Millions of children are going hungry**. Without access to nutritious food and safe water, 1.5 million children across Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia are at risk of severe acute malnutrition. Christian Aid is working in Ethiopia, Kenya and South Sudan to help those





suffering but they need your help to do more. Christian Aid is also working in

Malawi in East Africa where Cyclone Freddy has damaged half the country. Families like Esther Saizi's *(see above)* will need help to get back on the road to self-sufficiency, which they had achieved through work carried out by a partner of Christian Aid,

the Nandolo Farmers Association of Malawi, who has built a pigeon pea farming collective to improve the livelihood of small-scale pigeon pea farmers.

Please mind the gap!

Let's talk about teenagers...

on't worry, we are not talking about the London Underground. "Mind the Gap" is a local community informal support group for parents of teenage children who are concerned for their child's mental health.

In the last few years, fuelled by the pandemic, we have seen an explosion of children and adolescents suffering from mental health problems such as depression, anxiety and behavioural disorders, self-harm and in severe situations, even suicides.

Whilst there have been supporting bodies such as the NHS CAMHS, ChildLine, MIND, etc. that are set up to focus on supporting the teenager (and by the way, the waiting list to even get an initial consultation is long), very often, parents are left to manage the rest by themselves.

As a parent of two teenagers, I have had first-hand experience with the emotional distress and helplessness this brings. There can be real pressure put on parents to understand what is happening with their teenagers; the ability to notice when things are not right and not just normal teenage angst. Husband and wife may argue about different ways to try and fix the situation, causing heightened tension and endless worry in the whole family.

So, I was pleased when a few of us (all parents with teenagers) decide to form "Mind the Gap". We are no experts by any means, but it is somewhere where we can sit, share, and support each other. We meet every second Monday of the month in the evening in Oxshott. So far, we have had parents and grandparents who have joined us. I have certainly found it helpful to talk about things and learn about each other's progress.

Oxshott Coronation Weekend, 6-8th May!

There has been a lot of planning across Oxshott for the forthcoming Coronation weekend, as **Anthony Wolfe** reports...

group of members from across the community have been mapping out a plan for the Coronation weekend. At the time of writing the outline for the weekend is as follows:

Saturday, 6th May – the Coronation

St Andrew's Church will be open that morning, showing the Coronation on a large screen in the church itself for those who might wish to enjoy the historic event with other members of the community.



Sunday, 7th **May** – a special service will be held at St Andrew's Church in the morning at 10am to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III. The Scouts will be there to add a bit of pomp and circumstance.

Monday, 8th May – a morning of volunteering followed by a picnic lunch at the Village Centre in the field by the doctors' surgery:

For the volunteering there will be a focus on two initiatives across the village. The plan is that they will start at 10am and finish at 12 noon:

It culminates in a 'bring-your-own' picnic, planned to start at 12.30pm with the community spreading out across the field on blankets to enjoy a picnic with friends and family. There will be a limited number of tables and chairs, that should accommodate 100 people.



Making do on wartime rations

The Oxshott Village WI thoroughly enjoyed their meeting in March, entitled *Surviving Wartime Rations*, as **Liz McGibbon** reports...

t our meeting in March, Gill Harris, dressed as a housewife of the period, gave an interesting and very informative account of the eating habits of residents in the UK during the Second World War. Ration books had been issued in 1939 and the quantity of food one could buy was very restricted. No branded goods and a very meagre diet. Many people kept chickens and children were given malt and cod liver oil to keep them as healthy as possible.



In 1940 there was glut of plums and Lord Walton asked members of the WI to pick the plums and make jam, in fact 1,600 tons of jam were made! - possibly the reason the WI is often thought of as 'Jam and Jerusalem'. And it was a big day in January 1946 when bananas went on sale.

In spite of the problems finding food, no one died of starvation in the UK compared to 2 million across the world. It was fascinating to learn of how hard it was during the war and made us realise how much our eating habits have changed.

Have you noticed the Easter toppers on local pillar boxes? The one in Blundel Lane is the work of a couple of ladies of Oxshott Village WI and we hope it made you smile.

Oxshott Art & Crafts Society have been busy again, as they gear up for their summer exhibition, as Miranda Fuller reports...

ACS were delighted to welcome back artist Chris Forsey in March, to demonstrate for us a coastal scene in mixed media.

A self-taught painter in watercolour, acrylics and all water-based media, Chris (right) is interested in land, town and seascapes and the swift changes in weather, light and atmosphere and their effect on scenery.

Having taught in Cornwall for over 20 years, Chris now considers it his second home: for his demonstration. he chose Tregardock Beach. With the wilder atmosphere of the north coast, huge rocks and dramatic tidal beach, it

suits Chris's free and expressive style and palette well and provided a colourful and action-packed demonstration.

Chris uses mount board with rough gesso, for an 'unpredictable surface' and 'serendipitous marks'; Cryla acrylic paints in just four colours - Cadmium vellow and orange, indigo and deep violet - and 'Rosemary' brushes. He applies a yellow and purple wash and oil pastels to 'destabilise the surface', and his initial marks are 'lumpy, bumpy and expressive'. He sketches out key lines and, mixing in some orange, starts with





darks; for extra texture, he 'messes up' the surface with a palette knife. For distance and the sky, he uses flatter, smoother brush strokes and, for the foreground, contrasting texture - random, haphazard lines, spread with a palette knife, to mimic the ruggedness of nature. With inks in burnt umber and Paynes grey, he applies calligraphic marks with a pipette and draws in orange oil pastel, for added texture and interest, but advises against overdecorating. By the end of the demonstration, we have the wonderfully dramatic seascape pictured here.

We have our workshop by Brendan Smith on 19 May, postponed from the autumn; at present, there are still places available – for full details, email sue.smith191@btinternet.com

The passion that is Highgrove

In the month that sees the Coronation of King Charles, **Nicky Orlebar** tells us of an ASCO (Arts Society of Cobham & Oxshott) visit to his gardens at Highgrove...

hen King Charles III, as Prince of Wales, bought Highgrove House, near Tetbury, Gloucestershire in 1980, his first project, ahead of decorating the House, was to

tackle the unimaginative Cotswold landscape. Such was our Arts Society's overwhelming interest in a visit to these gardens, a ballot was held, as only 25 members per group would be allowed in. Arriving at




HIGHGROVE

Highgrove's Back Drive, passports were checked and wearing 'sensible shoes for unmade paths and cobblestones', we met our volunteer guide by the Orchard Room.

In warm sunshine we first passed through the Laurel Tunnel underplanted with hostas (no slug pellets allowed) near the Lily Pool Garden. We glanced up at the Bronze Gladiator statue (complete with cork at the end of his sword – Health and

Safety Regulations) en route to the Stumpery of tree trunks and roots. In the middle of the Walled Garden was a pool containing koi carp – the fish a present from the late Yehudi Menuhin.

In the Arboretum, a Sanctuary built for private royal contemplation led towards the Tulip Walk. By the front door of the 1790s house we smelt choisya bushes, while the Sundial Garden was distinct with just black and white flowers. The



west-facing Terrace Garden had been overhung by a huge 200-year-old cedar tree but it sadly died and was felled in 2007, whereas the Carpet Garden thrives with plants and Eastern tiles cleverly copied from a Turkish carpet in the House.

A passion...

At Highgrove, King Charles has created spaces inspired by his passion for organic gardening. Alas, the box hedges dying of blight are a cause for concern, as they are only slowly responding to organic remedies. Sizeable terracotta pots given to him were cleverly sited, while the fragrant Thyme Walk *(above)* lived up to its name. Much curiosity was shown in the reed bed sewerage system.

By opening the Gardens, funds are raised for the Prince's Foundation. We came away pondering whether to give organic gardening a try – the creative gardens at Highgrove certainly show what can be achieved.


