

Looking inside

Dear Friends

St Andrew's Church has stood at the centre of village life in Oxshott for more than 100 years.

A temporary church building was built in 1907, sited where the church car park is today, before the permanent stone-built church was completed in 1914. More than 50 years ago, the hall, vestibule, kitchen, offices and toilets were added.



And most recently, nearly 10 years ago, the interior of the Church worship space was reordered - with great success - in what was known as 'Phase 1' of two anticipated phases of work.

'God looks at the heart.' 1 Samuel 16.7

In the account of King David's life in the Bible, we are reminded that it is not outward appearance which matters most to God, but what is going on on the inside.

Throughout the last 100+ years, the church buildings have served the life of the community in so many ways. Alongside worship and prayer, St Andrew's has hosted plays, films, lunches, parties, concerts, a nursery school, meetings, children's groups, exercise classes, clubs and so much more.

Serving the life of the church and community is the heart of this project - it's what is going on on the inside that really matters!

As Ron Stewart explains (page 7), with the exciting news of planning permission for our Building Your Church project, there will be some disruption to the usual activities and services this Autumn - but we aim to take a creative approach in this season, and to maintain as much as possible of what is really at the heart of our buildings: the life of the church and community.

Alleluia! Planning permission received!

It's celebrations all round, as we get good news on our planning application, as **Ron Stewart** explains......

reat news! In the week of the King's Coronation we were thrilled to hear from Elmbridge Council that planning permission had been given for our Building Your Church (BYC) project - the major refurbishment of our ancillary buildings (especially the hall and vestibule) here at St Andrew's.

As you will have read, in his Curate's letter Patrick sets out the history of our buildings; having completed Phase 1, which was a major reordering of the church itself, it is great that we can now improve the whole of the rest of our site, making it more welcoming, accessible, comfortable and open to our village community.

There was a concert at the Royal Albert Hall during the Coronation weekend, and the words of one of the songs really struck a chord; the final verse echoes:

Faithful to govern ever may we be Selfless in service, loving constantly In everything may your authority Transform, revive and heal society

Our prayer is that these new buildings will help and support those callings on us as Christians.

Being creative: managing the changes

The Steering group are actively meeting with our project advisors in drawing up the technical drawings necessary for us to get quotes from contractors, as well as in finalising the designs for the kitchen and toilets.

We anticipate that the main building work will start in the Autumn and a lot of planning will be necessary in the coming weeks to enable that to happen!

Having building work in the last quarter of the year means we will have to be very creative about many of the important activities that we currently run each week, because the ancillary buildings will obviously be closed.

But we are very excited, as we can now move towards making these transformational changes a reality. As always, we ask for your continued prayers of support.

Stories from the front line...

In February, **Patrick Fleming** visited Garden Route Children's Trust (GRCT) projects in the Western and Eastern Cape. The trip was both distressing and inspiring...

atrick visited ten of the GRCT projects in the Western and Eastern Cape, including three new ones which were started in the past year. He found the situation on the ground even more distressing than a year ago, with a weak economy and lengthy power outages having a significant impact on many people, especially the most vulnerable.

Unemployment and poverty are major problems leading to a high incidence of alcohol and drug abuse which, in turn, has led to more domestic violence.

On a positive note, he came away inspired by the dedication of our partners who, week in and week out, do so much for the children they work with, sometimes in dangerous situations.

Two in particular made a marked impression on him.

Johann's story

 Imagine losing your young son to cancer and asking God what he wants you to do. And when the answer is, "Start a school for children of the same age", you

put up a notice in a dangerous community saying that if there are children wanting to come to school, they should go to the community hall on Monday morning. Then when you go there and find 30 children waiting, you start the school.

- Ten years later, you are running a school operating out of shipping containers with over 100 children. Oh, and by the way, you never ask for money and you don't get any salary yourself.
- Not content with that, you get into your little truck once a month and take food to help people in the Karoo (places like Laingsburg).
- WOW!



The GRCT funds the provision of e'Pap, a highly nutritious porridge, for 8,000 children every school day.

Most of the children are aged between 3 and 6, and come from exceptionally needy families. For more information, do visit www.grct.org.uk

Jacky's story

- Imagine living in a very poor community on the outskirts of Despatch where there is no preschool. I think I would probably have done nothing. Not Jacky!
- You feel sorry for the many hungry children so you start feeding them (even teenagers who are also hungry) from your little house with a kitchen

the size of a postage stamp. With the help of the Dutch Reformed Church, you expand until you are feeding about 350 children three days a week. And you want to start a pre-school and you are not going to give up even though you have reached normal retirement age.

WOW again!

There are many other stories Patrick can tell but these pictures capture the work of the GRCT just as powerfully as words would do, possibly even more so:

Those pesky weeds...

Gardening can make you think; Rebecca Mayhew explains...

have always loved raspberries. My Grannie had them in 2 rows by her back gate, and my brother and I were allowed as many as we could eat. When I was pregnant, it is raspberries I was buying from Waitrose out of season late at night to fulfil my craving.

When we moved here 24 years ago, we planted 2 rows of raspberry canes. All they require is a sturdy frame with wires along to tie the growing canes to, plenty of water to plump up the fruits, soil, and sunshine. I enjoy my raspberry harvest right up to late November. I pick about 6 per day that late in the season – 4 for my porridge and 2 for my dog Rolo. Sublime. Joy.

However, there is a garden weed, ground elder, that my Grannie pointed out to me at our first marital home. She told me I had to remove every bit of the root, or it would appear again.

Leave it a bit...

When I first saw ground elder in amongst my raspberry canes, I removed some, but decided not to disturb the raspberry cane roots during the growing season. I left it more than one year. This February I pruned my raspberries right down. In April. I saw the green buds BUT ALSO lots of ground elder leaves. I decided that this year I will work hard on removing the pesky ground elder and resolved to spend 15 minutes per day digging away and disposing of the roots in the garden bin the council takes away. (It is difficult to spend more time on my hands and knees, because I have a replacement knee).

At the weekend, as I tackled some more with the lovely spring sun on my back, I reflected that this largely unseen root MUST have affected the fruitfulness of my

fruitfulness of my raspberry canes. This weed will have used nutrients and water from the soil, entwining its way around the roots of the canes. I have filled the wheelbarrow twice with this weed.

Being fruitful

I now have the best of intentions to find 15 minutes several times a week to dig out and safely dispose of this largely invisible, quick-growing weed. I hope the raspberry canes flourish.

As I sat down with a cup of tea to relax afterwards, I was reflecting on the idea of my faith being represented by the raspberry canes: if I have largely invisible (but growing) weeds in my life, then my fruitfulness will not be as good as it could be. Do I need to spend 15 minutes a day reflecting on those things I am doing which are not helping me grow spiritually and are reducing my ability to be fruitful (fruit of the Spirit, Galatians 5.22-23)? Do I need to root out those habits/thoughts/feelings (my paraphrase of Galatians 5.19-21) and dispose of them safely?

Work in progress...

Worshipping online looks set to carry on; recent viewing figures for the CofE's national online services reveal that they alone continue to receive about 150,000 views a week. Overall, in 2022, they attracted more than eight million views.






Pupils at **Danes Hill School** embarked on an exciting day of fundraising for the Brompton Fountain Charity, and raised a spectacular £3,774.80.

Most members had a good idea as to what to do, but there were a few points which required clarification, particularly around the need to ensure that plastics, cardboard and other materials are clean before being placed for recycling. Simple but necessary if we want to achieve our objective.

Betjeman's 'Cathedral of Middlesex'

This month, Nicky Orlebar tells us of an ASCO (Arts Society of Cobham & Oxshott) visit to an ancient medieval building...

hen plans were afoot for a proposed third runway at Heathrow airport, the north west boundary would have come perilously close to Grade 1 listed Harmondsworth Barn.

It was time for our local Arts Society (ASCO) to book a coach and investigate.

At nearly 600 years old, the Barn is considered to be the least altered medieval building in Britain. Surrounded by fields, the impressive rectangular wooden structure stands on a low wall of Reigate sandstone, with three large barn doors along the south wall.

Visiting on a hot day, ASCO members eagerly entered the cool of the 1426 interior and were amazed at its sheer size. The Barn is nearly 60 metres long, has a height of 11 metres and width of 12 metres. The building's complex carpentry so impressed Sir John Betjeman that he called it the 'Cathedral of Middlesex'.


Massive oak trusses hold up the roof, and the floor is divided by upright posts into twelve bays. This wood has been identified as sourced from a forest near Kingston upon Thames. By the

1970s, the Barn had become run-down, until it was renovated by English Heritage.

'Heremod's enclosure'

The village of Harmondsworth itself is mentioned in Domesday (1086) as a farmstead or enclosure ('worth') belonging to a man called Heremod, while from 1391 a barn and surrounding land belonged to Winchester College. Later, in 1426, the Harmondsworth Barn was constructed on the site of the old building.

En route to our pub lunch, we came across historic St Mary's Church, with its Norman door. Here in the churchyard, we found the grave of Richard Cox (1776-1845), a keen gardener whose seedlings resulted in our favourite Cox's Orange Pippin apples.




