Remember, Remember...

Dear Friends.

I wonder how you best 'remember'? Perhaps you have certain mnemonics which help you with particular things? Or maybe you are someone who likes to keep mementoes, or souvenirs to remember holidays, people or places? Or perhaps, most menially, a list helps to make sure nothing is forgotten at the supermarket?



The end of October and beginning of November are a season of Remembering.

At the end of October, near All Souls' Day, we hold a special service here at St Andrew's, to remember those we have loved who have recently died; our annual Memorial Service is a time to remember, reflect, and bring before God all the feelings and thoughts which surround loss; sadness, anger, confusion, thankfulness, hope...

On the 5th November, we 'remember' something quite different - bonfires and fireworks remind us about Guy Fawkes (and his co-plotters) and the events of the Gunpowder Plot of 1605.

And each year, on the Sunday close to Armistice Day, this year 12th November, in services at Church (10am) and at the War Memorial on Oxshott Heath (12noon) we remember all those who have died in war - particularly the First and Second World Wars, but including all wars and conflicts.

Remembering - first and foremost, it is about 'not forgetting'. But, often it is much more significant than making sure a particular item of shopping is not missed. To 'remember' means to 'call to mind again' and when we mark significant events year after year the rituals of 'remembering' help us both to 'not forget' - but also, to think deeply about the significance of that which we are 'calling to mind'.

Into the future

Remembering is not nostalgia; it is not looking back and imagining 'things were better then'. But, as we draw events and people from the past into our mind in the present, we take them with us into the future. Our 'calling to mind' gives us resolve to act differently and better beyond today.

It is my prayer that this season of Remembering would move us all to work toward a grateful, loving and peaceful future for our world, and within our community and families.


Keeping busy at St Andrew's @4 ...



Remembrance in 2023

Remembrance Sunday is as relevant as ever, and as usual there will be a variety of opportunities in Oxshott to mark the day...

emembrace Sunday this year falls on 12 November, and our 10am service here at St Andrew's will include singing from the choir, a communion and the reading of the names of those who gave their lives. A trumpeter will play the Last Post and Reveille. The service will be live streamed as usual, and of course can also be watched later; you can do so via the church website.

Also that day, at noon, there will be the usual short service at the War Memorial on the Heath. Wreaths will be laid by local representatives, and a trumpeter will again play the Last Post and Reveille.

In the afternoon, we have our regular St Andrew's @4, designed to be accessible and enjoyable for everyone – especially those of primary school age and younger. We offer a relaxed environment to connect with one another and with God, and this time we will have special recognition that it is Remembrance Sunday.

The aim was to reduce the use of single-use plastic, and the new poppy design has a 40% smaller carbon footprint, and is made from 'bespoke red and green paper.' The paper comes from a blend of renewable fibres, 50 per cent of which has been recovered from the waste used in the production of coffee cups.

The remaining stocks of the current poppy will be used, to reduce any waste. Older-style poppies, containing single-use plastic, can be returned to Sainsbury's stores for recycling.

The War Memorial (left) within St Andrew's is on a pillar, in the form of a triptych. The left-hand panel lists the 1914-1918 dead, the central panel shows the dedication and lists the 1939-45 Canadian Forces dead among those who were camped on Oxshott Heath, and the right-hand panel lists the 1939-45 dead.

Parishes are still "at our very heart"

"Parishes are at the very heart of the Church of England's mission" - this was the C of E's response to a recent article in *The Sunday Telegraph*...

The short comment above was provided as a response to an article that had appeared in *The Sunday Telegraph* newspaper on 'parish closures.' William Nye, the Church of England's Secretary General, said: "Local parish

churches are at the very heart of the Church of England's mission and over the next nine years we are investing £3.6 billion of Church Commissioners funds in front-line ministry up and down the land, particularly on those communities most in need.

"It is early days, but we are seeing our efforts bear fruit - and local projects funded by the national church have already brought new people into our congregations.

"Of course, churches do sometimes close – but the truth is that the number of closures is the lowest it has been for 50 years, and we are starting new worshipping communities all the time. In fact, earlier this summer General Synod formally committed the Church to revitalising our parishes."

In fact, the number of consecrated churches closed has actually decreased in each of the last five decades. The figures provided to *The Sunday Telegraph*, who

omitted them, were: 1969-1979: 760 1980-1989: 485 1990-1999: 274 2000-2009: 243 2010-2019: 209

This year has been particularly challenging for the Leadership Academy of the Palestinian Bible Society (PBS) in Jericho. Escalating violence in the West Bank has led to the closure of roads and

The Palestinian Bible Society (PBS), a partner of Embrace the Middle East, works to make the Word of God available to people living in the Holy Land, and runs the centre for children and mothers in Jericho, which provides a safe space to learn valuable life skills and have fun.



Academy has had to postpone some of the training sessions. It has also led to some of the trainees becoming too afraid to travel to the Academy's training centre.

However, despite these challenges the team at PBS have managed to increase the reach of the Leadership Academy in particular, and the work of the PBS more generally. They are now offering training programmes in Jenin, Nablus, Ramallah, Birzeit, Bethlehem and Hebron as well as in Jericho and Jerusalem.

The recent focus had been on developing the leadership abilities of young adults in their local communities so that they can play an increasingly

influential role that is modelled on the life and ministry of Jesus. The Academy team are so thankful that further doors are opening to train members of Scout troops, church youth groups, schools and other community-based organizations.

A lasting effect

The programme doesn't just impact communities. It has a lasting effect on the participants as we can see from this account from one of the young women enrolled in the Academy:

This program has affected me positively in many areas.

I once thought I could never acquire the skills to lead people to anything. Today, I know that leading someone is not an unachievable task but rather a strong vision that helps impact individuals. This small idea has completely changed the way I

look at certain situations.

Being a young girl in society can be overwhelming. I found it really hard to reach people, but this program has helped me grow in knowledge.

I learned the power of communicating. A leader needs individuals and individuals need a leader. This small concept can be applied in any community. When everyone works as a team to achieve a goal, the task becomes so simple. Today I use those skills and knowledge I learned to help me in my daily life. I volunteer as a kids' Sunday school teacher and this program has helped me build my adaptability, patience, and influence towards the younger generation. I'm hoping to continue to grow more in the leadership field. Having a positive influence on people can be such a beautiful thing. Encouraging others to help

As we go press (mid-October), we are all overwhelmed by news from Israel and Gaza, of horrible massacres and horrific retaliation.

Our Mission Partners, Embrace the Middle East, report that in both Israel and Palestine the situation is worse than any of them can ever remember.



reach a certain vision demonstrates its advantages. Challenges are always going to be an obstacle however learning to overcome them is the bigger goal.

Our particular links are with Palestinian Bible Society (PBS) and Elias, leading Embrace Jericho in the West Bank. He writes:

'Hamas rockets have reached as far as Tel Aviv and just outside Bethlehem, with a Palestinian school needing to be evacuated. All West Bank towns and villages have been locked down with their gates closed. This means that children who were at school in another village to their own, cannot now get home. Palestinians have been shot dead in the West Bank and Israelis shot dead inside Egypt. Hamas militants have taken over a kibbutz in southern Israel and Hezbollah have sent mortars into northern Israel from southern Lebanon. The tinder box has ignited, and no one knows how this is going to end. The only sure and certain thing is that Gaza will be hit harder than ever before, and the death toll is going to rise. Israel has cut off the electricity supply to Gaza and closed the goods crossing – even for food.'

Helping with a firm foundation

Nicki Galazka looks forward to the annual Coffee Morning and Sale in aid of the Garden Route Childrens Trust, this year in a new venue...

es, it's that time again! As we set our eyes on preparing for Christmas and all that goes with making it a special celebration, it's a sobering thought that there are still so many in our world without basic needs.

This year, why not meet old friends and new over a coffee and cake and shop for some lovely Christmas

gifts as well as the chance to win a fabulous raffle prize, whilst also having a



major impact on the lives of children in need? The GRCT's (Garden Route Childrens Trust) annual coffee morning and sale is on 28 November in the Oxshott Village Centre (see opposite for details). Last year's event raised over £3,000 –enough to fund a feeding project for a whole school year.

Wellington is based just north of Cape Town and the area has been challenged in so many ways; an incredibly cold wet winter, spiralling prices and continuing unemployment all leading to significant poverty and social issues including rioting. The Ma's vir project is set in the heart of this disadvantaged area but continues to flourish thanks to the dedication of an inspiring Christian community group. The project focuses on children between the formative ages of 3 and 6 years. With a

sound foundation, these children have a better chance to be school ready and to flourish. Funded by the GRCT, a nutritious e'Pap meal is provided every morning to over 120 children, fills tummies helping children to concentrate and therefore to learn.

One helper sums it up: 'Our children are hungry. It's heartbreaking to see these kids going without the most basic of their needs fulfilled. Some even come for 3rd and 4th helpings.'



It is a sobering thought that just £20 buys a nutritious e'Pap breakfast for a child for an entire school year. If you would like to help feed a child, please join us on the 28th and bring friends. With your generosity, we hope to feed even more hungry children going forward!

Christmas Crafts

How a young Oxshott resident has shown resilience through adversity by setting up a small business...

Mimi Paxton is a remarkable young woman who has grown up and still lives in Oxshott with her family. Her dream of qualifying and working as a psychologist has had to be put on hold shortly after completing her degree at Kent University in very difficult circumstances.

Sadly, she has been bed-bound all this year due to a combination of debilitating and life-changing health conditions. Undeterred, she said, "I found my life shaping in a very different direction to the one I hoped - becoming a psychologist. To fill the time and have some hobbies I took up arts and crafts; I now make personalised things such as tops and bags, as well as now doing personalised stockings and Christmas trays for Santa and cards."

Mimi's resilience and determination have found an outlet in these high- quality crafts and she is now taking orders for fabulous Christmas cards and other handmade items sold online through her Facebook site: 'Cool Mimi: Personalised Items.' Due to her health condition, production and delivery times are longer than normal, so she is already taking orders via the Facebook page or 07990 712034.



Judith Elizabeth "Liz" Owler 1944-2023

A long-standing resident of Oxshott, and fully involved in local activities, Liz Owler died at home in Cobham on 19 August

Surrey born and bred, Liz moved to Danescourt Cottages on Leatherhead Road, Oxshott with her new husband John Moore in 1969. Their son Philip arrived in 1977 around the time they moved to "Cooks House" by the level crossing in Blundel Lane.

Membership of the 'baby-sitting circle' soon lead to the Royal Kent School, with School Gate and PTA activity until, at the time of the Great Storm in October 1987, Liz was working in the Royal Kent admin office. On that morning, in the absence of the Head Teacher, Liz was tasked with 'Closing the School' as staff and pupils alike could not get to work!



John died suddenly in 1998 and Liz became a single parent, with Philip away at Portsmouth University. "Pick yourself up, dust yourself off, and start all over again" was her mantra, but with three further deaths in the family, her involvement with local activities such as the Oxshott Evening WI and Oxshott Flower Arrangement Society had to be cut back. Philip took a year out from uni' to spend more time at home and was a 'tower of strength' to her. Her circle of friends, ever-widening particularly with her flower-arranging skills, lead her to foreign travel and international flower-arranging competitions in Boston MA and elsewhere.

When we became 'a couple' in 2011 Liz brought with her the picture shown below. I cannot claim that my house was immaculate either, and somehow over the next 12 years we never seemed to have time to create "immaculateness", being busy

competing in car rallies, hill climbs and sprints in the UK and France. At 70+ Liz obtained a driving licence to allow her to drive our 5-tonne motorhome with the two race cars on the doubledeck trailer!

On the cushions on the settee are other mottos: "A clean house is the sign of a mis-spent life", and "Creative minds are rarely tidy".

Perhaps none of these sayings is 'PC', but they are the converse of our own sayings: "This is not a rehearsal", "You don't get a second chance to make a first impression" and "When did you last do something for the first time?"

She has time to rest now! RIP, Dearest Liz.



Miranda Fuller updates us on the thriving art scene based here in the village...





Christine demonstrate her technique, which makes her work so distinctive and popular.

Beginning by drawing an irregular grid on mount board, Christine then glues small pieces of newsprint, music or patterned paper into just a few of the shapes formed by the grid and then coats the board with PVA. Next, she scrunches a sheet of tissue, which she then smooths out and rolls firmly onto the glued board, ensuring no bubbles remain.

With coloured wax crayon she then outlines features such as doors and windows and colours these in with ink or diluted acrylic paint, before outlining the features with black, using the edge of a piece of card.

The finished effect is delightfully crisp, colourful and quirky and the artist is shown here *(left)* with her picture.

Following the workshop, on the 10th we were pleased

to welcome back artist Max Hale, who gave us a demonstration of *A Still Life in Water Mixable Oils*, details of which will be given in the next issue.


Looking ahead...

How to make a roundabout work

More on the improvements to the A3/M25 junction: This month, how and why the roundabout will be enlarged...

ne feature of the re-configured Junction 10 is the enlargement of the roundabout. This is currently small for the size of the junction, and is quite a bottleneck. But earlier proposals to improve things, which included a grandiose 'spaghetti junction'-type solution, were deemed too expensive and too destructive (for example, it would have placed a number of important trees at risk, including several Grade II and Grade II* Heritage Trees).

Two key features...

...and how it will

look from the air

To improve the traffic flow and safety at the junction, two new features will be:

- an elongated and widened roundabout to provide more capacity, and
- four new dedicated free-flow slip roads, to enable all left-turning traffic using Junction 10 to bypass the roundabout/traffic lights.

These new slip roads mean left-turning traffic won't have to negotiate the roundabout itself to join the road that they are aiming for.

The combined effect of the changes is expected to improve traffic flow and reduce queues.

these changes. And there may be an additional benefit to us, as traffic that currently uses Oxshott as a cut-through may use the new free-flowing Junction 10! Completion of the whole scheme is scheduled for summer 2025.


Fiery passion and drama

When an Arts Society group visited the Royal Albert Hall they were transported to Seville, as **Nicky Orlebar** recalls...

full coach of Arts Society members arrived at the Royal Albert Hall for a matinée performance of Bizet's *Carmen*, to be sung in English. First performed in Paris in 1875, *Carmen* was not initially well received (Saint-Saëns being especially critical), but little could dampen *our* anticipation.



Excitement grew as we found Door 3 before climbing the stairs looking for access to the auditorium. Our red seats were all together in the stalls with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra tuning up on our left, below the Father Willis organ. More and more visitors of all ages soon arrived to take their seats. As the lights dimmed, the orchestra transported us to 1820s Seville. We were on the edge of our seats - *Carmen* was about to begin in the oval performance arena before us.



The story unfolded of Carmen, a flirtatious gypsy, falling in love with the soldier Don José, then becoming infatuated with the toreador Escamillo, before being murdered in the last act by Don José. Jealousy and misguided affections together with a bad hand at cards were very much to the fore as we enjoyed the Toreador song and Habanera. Acrobats, fire juggling, tall trees and heads of bulls added considerably to the atmosphere during the crowd scenes. Fortunately, we were sufficiently close to the action to see the singers' faces yet raised enough to have an overall view of the performance in the round.

Was it the colour, music or surroundings which had made *Carmen* so exciting? Next day *The Times* Arts Critic considered our London production to be "Bizet's masterpiece brought thrillingly to life". We had certainly enjoyed every moment.
