Personally, it was especially significant that members of the 1st Oxshott Scout troop attended, as it was with them that I led my last official engagement as Vicar back in February 2023.

I want to thank every person for the part they played in providing all of us with this wonderful opportunity: Adele and the catering team, Patrick Davies, Val and all who enabled the service, the Churchwardens who oversaw all the logistics and everyone else involved whom I may not know of.

Thank you for all your prayers, good wishes and practical support through a very challenging year. Jolyon and I are more grateful than you can ever know to have lived here in Oxshott and for all the love and kindness you have shown us.

We bid Frances and Jolyon farewell

On Sunday 14 January we bid farewell to our Vicar, Revd Frances Trickey, and her husband Revd Jolyon Trickey, at a church service with communion, followed by a

lunch for the whole church family...

s most readers will be aware, our Vicar, Revd Frances Trickey retired through ill health at the end of December.

As Frances recalls in this month's Letter (page 5), 14 January saw a packed and emotional service in church. Frances presided at Communion, and her husband Jolyon preached the sermon.

The farewell service included an 'interview' of Frances and Jolyon by Patrick Fleming, in which they spoke frankly about Frances' diagnosis, their feelings about their time in Oxshott, and their plans for the future – which includes moving to the West Country, to be near other members of their family. Given the circumstances, Frances was amazing - composed and articulate, and always with a smile on her face.

After the service, a Farewell Lunch, with over 120 attending, was

held in the church hall, overflowing into the vestibule.

Looking back

Frances came to Oxshott as Vicar in 2017, and we were very pleased that Jolyon her husband joined us here as well. It was Frances' first role as a vicar, but Jolyon stood down as Rector of Nailsea, near Bristol, to make the move with her.

Frances had her Induction on 25 April 2017, and in short order, Jolyon was

licensed as an Associate Minister, which meant that he was able to take part in services and other roles here at St Andrew's. whilst having other church-related work outside the parish.

The life of the church continued fully for nearly three years, seeking to live as 'Followers of Jesus Christ, growing in faith and number and serving the community.' And during this time also giving full weight to the ongoing building project.

But Frances' time here was punctuated by unforeseen and impactful events the first of which was the pandemic...

Managing St Andrew's through Covid-19

The Covid-19 pandemic was monumentally disruptive for all of us. And Frances had

the additional responsibility of steering the church here in Oxshott though the myriad changes and guidance being received.

Lockdown started in March 2020: we did celebrate Easter, although, as Frances suggested in her Easter message, perhaps this Easter was a much closer experience to how the first Easter would have been, when the disciples were afraid, confused, locked away for fear of 'the enemy'.

With the church building closed, all activities went online; the first service back in church was not until 9 Covid: Difficult days...

August, and various elements of church life were gradually brought back into operation, often in a restricted way. We have Frances and the churchwardens to thank for steering us through this frustrating and stressful time.

The life of the church gradually returned, with continuing support for the parish and our Mission Partners, and a number of initiatives came to fruition, including support for individuals and for families on many fronts.

Then in February 2023 we heard that Frances had been taken seriously ill with a brain tumour. She underwent surgery followed by a period of recuperation, chemotherapy and radiotherapy. We tried to be as supportive as was needed, not least in our continuing and regular prayers for both Frances and Jolyon. After many months of sick leave, however, after discussions with the medics and the Diocese of Guildford, in November Frances announced her retirement through ill-health as the Vicar of St Andrew's, Oxshott, at the end of the year.

As Frances said in her announcement at the time, "It has been the privilege of my life to be the Vicar of this community and church. Thank you to all of you who have sent me good wishes throughout my treatment this year, for those who have prayed, the encouraging cards and for all the practical expressions of loving care.

"And a special thank you to my Church Family who have allowed me to lead them, despite my failings and inevitable mistakes, and for the love and joy we have shared as followers of Jesus Christ."

Looking ahead

Frances and Jolyon continued to live in the Vicarage into the New Year, but the firm plan is to move to the West Country. It goes without saying that they both go with our love, prayers and all good wishes for the future.

he link between Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day can be summed up in terms of the nature of real love! Lent, beginning on Ash Wednesday, focuses on learning to love God more, as we give Him space in our lives. This is what Jesus found when He was led into the desert by the Spirit to be tempted by Satan



(Luke 4.1-13). Real love for God does not put Him to the test, but wants to obey Him.

Lent also teaches us how to live out the love of God in practical ways, and see this clearly demonstrated in the life and death of Saint Valentine; he was a Christian who demonstrated the importance of sharing God's love with others. We know little about him, except that he was a priest who lived in the 3rd Century AD and that he was martyred on 14 February.

Emperor Claudius felt that soldiers in the Roman Army were distracted from their duty by their wives, and so had attempted to outlaw marriage.

It is believed that Valentine married couples in secret, which is why today we celebrate our love for one another on his day.

What is a 'vacancy'?

St Andrew's is said to be 'in vacancy' as we go through the process of appointing a new Vicar.

Vacancy Q&As

So, who's in charge in the meantime?

Legally, during a vacancy, the area dean and churchwardens become 'sequestrators', i.e. the bishop's officers in the parish. Our area dean is Revd Renos Pittarides, but he is also the Rector of St Martin's Horsley, so in practice the churchwardens and others in the leadership team in the parish ensure that things continue as normal.

How long will the appointment process take?

The earliest date for making an appointment would be in May, but it often takes longer – and if notice has to be given to the appointee's existing position, three or so further months can easily elapse before our new Vicar arrives.

Why does it take so long?

There are two basic reasons; first, having a pause has traditionally been used to ensure that each parish and the diocese have time to assess what a parish now needs, and avoid a kneejerk reaction to 'solve' a vacancy. Remember also that a parish needs to be geared up to the process of choosing the new vicar. Second, and in larger part, it takes a long time because the 'due process' of the Church of England is set out by centuries of law and practice, in particular the Patronage (Benefices) Measure 1986 – you did ask!

A creative start to 2024

Oxshott Art & Crafts (OACS) have already kicked off 2024 in good form, as Miranda Fuller tells us...

ACS hope that 2024 has begun well for readers, as it has for us. For our first meeting of the New Year, on 9 January, we enjoyed presentations from two of our members - Avril O'Brien and Kleshna Handel.

Avril (right) had embroidered from childhood, but trained as a scientist and worked as a pharmacist, before deciding, as her four children left the nest, to become 'an enthusiastic amateur embroiderer'. She joined the Embroiderers' Guild and Woking Creative Stitchers (formerly the Woking Day Branch of the Guild), and attended courses at West Dean College in Sussex, Ochre Print Studio in Guildford and many others.

She showed us lovely examples of her work, featuring a huge range of stitches and dveing methods, and spoke with warmth of her first visit to Australia, from which she drew great inspiration, studying the aboriginal artwork and learning the meanings of its many signs and symbols. Due to this, back in England she and a group of fellow embroiderers won the South East Region Embroiderers' Guild competition, with the beautifully crafted 'Aboriginal Cloak', pictured here.

From exotic beads to poppies

, an expert bead jeweller, began in theatre, aged 15, where she spent eight years, before moving into marketing and advertising, then forming a PR company, from which she retired, to study at Chelsea Art College and, like Avril, West Dean College. Working with exotic shells and beads, she got her work accepted for the prestigious London Fashion Week, took part in trade shows and created jewellery for Swarovski.

She designed a special poppy for the Royal British Legion, auctioned for £6,000, and designed further poppies for them for 6 more years; her limited-edition poppies were much sought after, worn by celebrities such as Katherine Jenkins and appearing each year on TV programmes like *X Factor*. The National Army Museum have curated all the poppies Kleshna designed. She invented, amongst other things, a 'bead board' for 'pearl knotting' and her jewellery hung in various stores. At one trade show, Kleshna formed a working partnership, leading to the winning of the

'Product of the Year' award. and for several years. appearances on three different TV channels, showing jewellery and demonstrating the making of it.

Accustomed to speaking for five hours at a time to TV viewers, Kleshna can now confidently 'speak for England' and has gathered thousands of followers.

We saw a range of her jewellery and examples of the hundreds and thousands of beads, stitches and techniques that go into the making of such exquisite things, some of which are pictured here.

The train not arriving...

At least, not yet.

South Western Railway (SWR) won the South Western franchise in March 2017, with a commitment to introduce new carriages - and in June 2017 they awarded a contract to Bombardier for 90 trains, to be introduced from mid-2019 at a cost of £895 million.

The plan was for the new trains to replace all of SWR's suburban fleets, including those we use at Oxshott, with improvements over the existing suburban trains, such as wi-fi, USB charging points, air conditioning, bike spaces and accessible toilets.

Long delays

There were delays, however: in January 2022, SWR said it was still waiting for Alstom (which acquired Bombardier in 2021) to "supply a train that performs to specification". In July 2022, SWR acknowledged that "continuing problems ... have delayed the programme of train acceptance".

But what now? SWR has reached an agreement with the unions allowing for a 'soft launch' of the new fleet.

The first Arterio unit entered service on 9 January 2024 - just one new train will run each day between London and Windsor, for four days as part of a trial...

We hope it goes well.

Phyllis May Fisher 1921-2023

Phyllis died in September, and **Jenny Mathieson** now recalls a long-term resident of Oxshott, closely linked to Bevendean School...

ast pupils of Bevendean School have paid tribute to one of their teachers, known to them as Miss Counsell, who died last September aged 102.

She and Miss Norah Brighton, her friend and colleague, taught in the tradition of the 1960s, when strict discipline was key. This did not mean that these two excellent and inspiring teachers did not have a soft side, nor did they lack a sense of humour. They lived 'above the shop' at Bevendean and when they retired they moved to Ben High, an upstairs flat in Pond Piece, off Sheath Lane.

After Miss Brighton died, Miss Counsell was supported by their friend and neighbour, Tony Fisher, whom she married in August 2002. They had 22 happy years together before his death.



Phyllis Fisher stayed on in Ben High, and enjoyed visits from her neighbours and friends, particularly those of Gordon Bond and his family and Peter Wolfson, both of whom became her Executors. Gordon, in his tribute at her Thanksgiving Service on 10 November, told of how appreciative she had been of the friendship of

his family. He said that tea at Ben High was always served using the best china. Phyllis was unfailingly interested in Gordon's children and how they were getting on in school. Peter, who lived in the flat below, did her shopping and helped with the garden, as well as looking after her finances.

Former pupil Claire King writes of her: "I remember Phyll as a teacher who clearly loved children and loved her job. She could be strict and brooked no nonsense,



Miss Counsell, as she then was, with her class in the 1970s. Perhaps you recognise someone?

but she was also warm and appreciated children as people. She would share a joke and have a proper conversation, even with a 7-year-old!"

As the mother of a couple of Bevendean pupils, I also have fond memories of the two friends who gave so many Oxshott children such a solid foundation to their education and values.

'If you seek his monument, look around you'

This month, **Nicky Orlebar** recalls a thrilling Arts Society visit for a very special Sung Eucharist in the City of London...

n ASCO visit to St Paul's Cathedral in the City of London coincided with The Feast of Candlemas, otherwise known as the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, forty days after His birth.

In AD 604 a building was dedicated to Paul the Apostle. Following the 1666 Great Fire of London, the architect Sir Christopher Wren constructed the current cathedral in Portland stone being the fifth place of worship on the site.

After lunch in the Crypt Café, our guides lead us around the magnificent architecture. We stared up in awe at Thornhill's painted dome depicting the life of St Paul and admired the wooden Quire and organ case carved by Grinling Gibbons. Near the West Door was a floor plaque to the St Paul's Watch, recognising both men and women volunteers who were on guard against fire during WWII. Descending into the crypt, we found memorials to Wren, Nelson and Wellington.

Just before 5pm, ASCO members, together with a small congregation, gathered in the nave for Sung Eucharist.

With dusk descending outside, the interior lighting lit up the tall stone arches and made the Victorian mosaics sparkle (some designed by GF Watts from Compton, outside Guildford).

The ushers indicated a circle of chairs under the dome where we

should sit. Then a candle handed to each of us was lit, as the Vicars Choral sang Palestrina's *Missa sine nomine*.

The atmosphere and acoustics made for a truly memorable experience. A plaque sums up Wren's efforts: 'Reader, if you seek his monument, look around you.' ASCO members did just that.


