



Bursting with joy...

Dear Friends

If you have children (or even if you don't!) you may have watched the 2015 Disney Pixar film *Inside Out*, which follows the inner workings of the mind of Riley, a five-year-old girl, and her five emotions – Joy, Sadness, Anger, Fear and Disgust – whom we meet as characters. The more recent *Inside Out 2* picks up the

story ten years later, with a teenage Riley and few more emotions added to the cast: Anxiety, Envy, Ennui and Embarrassment – even Nostalgia makes a brief appearance!

The character 'Joy' is most central to the story – and as Joy's own story progresses, she questions her ongoing purpose in Riley's life, at one point saying: "Maybe this is what happens when you grow up – you feel less joy."

As the film portrays, it's all too easy for joy to be sidelined amongst the concerns and responsibilities of adult life. Joy, however, comes to realise that amongst the growing and varied cast of Riley's emotions, she has a very important ongoing place in Riley's life.

Do we expect to find joy in the church...and not just in the children's groups?

A friend of mine, on telling his young daughter that he had been appointed to lead a church, received the baffled response: "But Dad, you're too silly to be a vicar!"

Yet, life-long joy is not only allowed, but actively encouraged in the realm of faith!

C.S. Lewis wrote that "joy is the serious business of heaven". Joy is a Fruit of the Spirit – something which God wants to grow in our lives. The Bible is filled with experiences of joy! Growing up - especially in faith - certainly doesn't mean less joy.

At St Andrew's we want to be a joyful church, bringing joy in our community. It is my hope that this Autumn, as we share and celebrate at Harvest, remember together in October and November, and expectantly wait through Advent for the 'good news of great joy' at Christmas, we will experience together a joy which is more than a simple happiness – the joy of knowing ourselves loved by God.

What is the Nicene Creed?

As Christianity spread across the known world, it was found useful to write down a formal summary of core beliefs, known as a Creed (from the Latin credo 'I believe'). The Nicene Creed first arose from the First Council of Nicaea in 325...

he First Council of Nicaea was a council of over 200 Christian bishops convened in the city of Nicaea (now İznik, Turkey) by the Roman Emperor Constantine I. It was the first time that any attempt had been made to summon a general council of the whole church at which, at least in theory, the church in every part of the Roman Empire should be represented.

The Council met from May until the end of July 325, and among its many outcomes was the original Nicene Creed...

"For Christians, the Nicene Creed is one of the most enduring statements of faith. It unites believers across time and space in a shared confession of who God is and what he has done in Jesus Christ. It is recited week by week in worship, but it is much more than a formula; it is a declaration of faith, hope and love, binding us to the communion of saints and to Christ himself."

> Quote taken from The Church of England's booklet published in celebration of the 1,700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed.

Back in June, we took part in an A Rocha scheme to count and record the wonders of the natural



world that live their abundant lives in the grounds of churches around the UK.

So here at St Andrew's we had three counts of the nature that was living in our church garden and not just

those critters that have made their home in our very own bug hotel (pictured above). It was great to be joined by some of the children that attend ABC as they were much better at getting down to the ground and making friends with the mini-beasties in the garden.

Lalso discovered that I had a lot to learn from most of the grown-ups that joined the counts, as they helped identify a number of beautiful plants that are thriving in the wild garden behind the church.

Now that our building works are complete, we are thinking through how best we can make it easier for the whole parish to enjoy the wonderful space that the church has been given responsibility to nurture for the benefit of all.

The many guises of a good breakfast...

We all enjoy a good breakfast. But not all breakfasts are the same, as we discovered from **Ruth Burns**...

n the first Sunday in July a great Breakfast for Breakfasts™ was held at St Andrew's Oxshott (right), before the morning service. We enjoyed a lovely feast of fruit, muesli and yoghurt, together with pastries from Munch and Wiggles.



The GRCT trustees are very grateful to the St Andrew's for their continued generosity and for all the individual contributions that morning, which helped raise £1.800 to fund e'Pap breakfasts for children.

You might wonder why funding e'Pap in particular is so important to the GRCT...



e'Pap is made from wholegrain maize and soya beans and contains 22 vitamins, minerals and sorghum and amino acids and chelates, tailored for absorption. It has high "bio-efficacy" - which means that e'Pap will be absorbed into the body more effectively. e'Pap addresses the issue of 'hidden hunger' and micronutrient

deficiencies, which can compromise the immune system and interfere with focus and concentration at school.

Mary Elizabeth Hilborne 1931-2025

The lovely Mary Hilborne passed away earlier this year, and we invited her long-standing friend **Margaret North** to look back at Mary's long life...

y earliest memory of Mary was as we both waited for the bus bringing our daughters home from school - it was the start of conversations which persisted for more than 40 years. We were kindred spirits in many ways, not least the fact that both of us were social workers in the mental health field and we were 'only children': we each had 3 children and actually lived during all those years just round the corner.


I recall a very busy lady, with a demanding full-time job, whilst running her home, at one point caring for her elderly father-in-law, engaging fully in the activities of her church, St Andrew's Oxshott, and doing lots of other things connected with her strong Christian faith. For many years she was a Pastoral Assistant at St Andrew's: she was part of the weekly Bible Groups, she would read the lesson, she would organise 'away weekends' (Retreats) and each year was a fervent organiser of collections for Christian Aid. On a more academic front she attended courses relating to religious history at Birkbeck College, London and to my amazement even managed to write essays!

Mary and her husband Derek were keen walkers, most usually covering long stretches at Polesden Lacey. At a more modest level, she often joined me dogwalking on Oxshott Heath, with what became further conversation opportunities. With Derek she took part each week in Scottish dancing. They were ardent campers with their foldaway caravan and at quite a mature age embarked on cycling tours in France and The Netherlands, which really did impress. I also remember Mary would swim regularly at the nearby Reed's School pool. She always demonstrated a lot of energy, until more recent years, when health problems sadly began to impact.

Our shared interests were invariably current affairs and social issues, with countless discussions on issues we had either read about or heard on the radio. The theatre and drama were hugely important to her; she enjoyed music, read avidly and always the daily papers. I have lovely memories of attending the Proms and visits to the Orange Theatre with Mary and Derek. She loved Shakespeare, and took great pleasure in sharing readings with both friends and family.

Reflecting on the vibrant personality that was the Mary I first knew, her patient uncomplaining demeanour when her health caused life to became extremely limiting, filled me with admiration; she seemed to have an inner calm, an acceptance. I never once heard her utter any word of complaint and I was always greeted with her lovely smile. We never discussed it, but I do believe that it was her unwavering Christian faith that sustained her during those final years. Mary was my very dear friend, whose presence and support I shall always miss.

Aspects of France...

Esher Franch Circle concluded its 2024-25 season with two talks from regular lecturers on aspects of French life, culture and history, as **Peter Prowse** reports...

anielle John's talk to Esher French Circle on 21 May explored the world of disappearing jobs in France. Danielle recalled how in her childhood village, local washerwomen, mattress-stuffers, umbrella-repairers, and even itinerant knife-sharpeners and pot-menders were all part of everyday life.

Today, many such skills would be at risk of disappearing completely, if it were not for pockets of dedicated enthusiasts who work hard to keep some of these traditional jobs alive.

Our talk on 18 June was on Ernest Hébert (1817-1908), the French painter, by our regular speaker Thierry Viennois.

Born in Grenoble during the Romantic period, Hébert (right) started painting just as the new school of Realism was taking hold. After classical training at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris, he rose to fame with *La Mal'aria* at the Salon of 1850.

Sought after for his portraits of Parisian high society, Hébert was an engaging, cultured, and music-loving man and his sociable temperament earned him lasting friendships with many personalities.

Esher French Circle offers monthly talks - in French - by native or fluent French speakers, for anybody interested in keeping up or improving their French; there is ample opportunity to mingle and chat over refreshments before the talk starts at 7.30pm. Proposals for Green Belt developments

The Green Belt continues to be a hot topic locally, as **Ian Dilks**, a Director of FEDORA - The Voice for Oxshott, reports...

Back in June, I explained why the Green Belt sites around Oxshott are under threat of development. The two principal reasons are i) changes in central government policy to promote more home building, in particular the redesignation of some Green Belt as Grey Belt which can be built on; and ii) that Elmbridge does not have an approved Local Plan which would act as a defence against speculative development applications.

FEDORA has created a section on its website to keep people updated on developments. This includes the policy on the role FEDORA will play. Go to https://fedora.org.uk/green-belt/



FEDORA members and supporters also receive regular email updates.

Two key local proposals

Two sites are currently in play, and developments of the scale proposed would place a burden on already stretched infrastructure.

The outline application to develop the site in Stoke D'Abernon known as The Paddocks is now under consideration by Elmbridge planning officials and we should know their recommendations to councillors in the next few weeks.

Less well known and visible is the site of 23 hectares (57 acres) at Clouds Hill Farm to the south of Oxshott (see map opposite). The initial proposal was for half of


SANG:

A Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace (SANG) is a designated area of green, open space designed to reduce the recreational impact of new housing developments on protected natural area. this to be designated a Suitable Alternative Natural Green Space (SANG) and half developed to accommodate 250/300 new homes of which half will be "affordable".

An application for the SANG was provisionally approved earlier this year; as we go to press, we are expecting to see an outline application for the housing development shortly.

A development of this scale, in addition to other approved developments, would have a significant impact on road safety and air quality affecting all residents. FEDORA is therefore leading the approach to these concerns and has employed an independent traffic consultant. We have also met

with and offered to support several residents who have concerns about the



development and its impact on the local community. They are currently considering what approach they wish to take.




Art & Crafts is thriving!

On 14 October we will welcome back Kim Page, to give us an *Abstract Flower Composition* in acrylic and collage.


Our Autumn workshop, 'Printmaking with Collage' by Vicky Oldfield, will take place on Saturday 25 October.

Picture this: a bustling hub where the sound of clicking cogs and whirring drills is serenaded by the soft hum of conversation.

a time when things were built to last – bestow their wisdom on the masses.

Often armed with little more than screwdrivers, glue, and a steely determination, these heroes tackle everything from faulty fuses to fractured furniture.

It's a lot like that popular TV show *The Repair Shop*, but with a twist: it's all about the everyday items that life has a habit of breaking. Bring in your broken toasters, moth-eaten jumpers, and even punctured bike tires – no task is too trivial.

And if you think it's just about fixing stuff, think again! We weigh each and every repaired item to keep track of how much we've diverted from the landfill – giving Mother Earth a much-needed break as part of the Net Zero initiative.

Royal Tunbridge Wells


Members of ASCO (The Arts Society of Claremont & Oxshott) discovered medicinal waters and fine buildings in the town Princess Victoria loved to visit, as described by **Nicky Orlebar**...

n Arts Society coach group arrived in Royal Tunbridge Wells, eager to explore this historic spa town in the Weald of Kent. Our Blue Badge guide soon joined us for coffee along The Pantiles. This attractive white colonnaded walkway - previously known as Upper Walk - is above the former High Street where in bygone

times, local gentry could promenade and be seen. Some four hundred years later, today's shoppers enjoy the boutiques and cafés.

The word 'pantiles' derives from the tiles baked in a pan before being used to pave the walks.

At one end of The Pantiles is the Chalybeate Spring (pronounced Chayley-beat), discovered in 1606. Over the centuries, those seeking a medicinal



cure would visit the town to drink the water, which was thought to contain iron and still bubbles away today. Soon, attractive Georgian, Regency and Victorian houses were built, many of the latter designed by Decimus Burton.

Our guide explained that Tunbridge was given the Royal prefix because Edward VII knew his late mother Queen Victoria had enjoyed her visits to the town.

Entering the Church of King Charles the Martyr (some saw the execution of Charles I as a martyrdom), the dark pews contrasted with the cream paintwork. Above us, the exceptional ceiling of shallow domes was designed in 1679 by none other than Sir Christopher Wren's chief plasterer. With rows of round-topped, plain glass windows, the Grade 1 listed church is called the jewel of the Pantiles. In the upper gallery, a plaque indicates where the young Princess Victoria sat for services.

Our guide next led us to The Grove, the oldest park in Royal Tunbridge Wells, dating from 1703. With mature birch, oak and beech trees surrounding a bandstand, the open space is appreciated as a pleasant retreat from the bustle of The Pantiles.
