



Harvest...

Dear Friends

Though we do still have a few old farmhouses around Oxshott, most of us in our village are not farmers – so, the festival 'Harvest' each autumn perhaps feels like those old farmhouses - something a little unusual, an agrarian anomaly, to be preserved and treasured, but, really a leftover from an age-gone-by.



Welcome

However, I believe the celebration of Harvest reminds us of some really important things, which are as relevant today as they have ever been: that everything we have is given to us by God, and we are to be thankful for it, to enjoy it, and to share it.

Thankfulness – in a world where we take so much for granted, it is important to be thankful. Psychologically and spiritually, thankfulness is the root of happiness. When we recognise how blessed we are, strengthen our personal well-being, as well growing in compassion for those less fortunate – both of which are a good thing! Thanking God for his goodness to us is at the heart of Harvest.

Enjoyment – The Bible tells us that God loves giving good gifts, which he wants us to enjoy! The poetic account of creation in Genesis shows that God made the world and populated it with the wonderful diversity of plants and creatures - and made a 'garden' for humankind to occupy and enjoy with him. The deepest and most full enjoyment is found when we don't keep the good things to ourselves – but enjoy and share them with one another, and with God.

Sharing – Loneliness is one of the most prevalent difficulties facing our society today. Yet, the world works best when we are not each living 'independently', but inter-dependently - recognising our need of one another, and God. True interdependence means that everyone contributes uniquely and meaningfully, and no one is left alone or in need. Counterintuitively perhaps, (and certainly countermathematically!) sharing multiplies joy, rather than dividing it.

So, this Harvest time, might I encourage us to become thankful for all we have (whether much, or a little) and to enjoy, and share these good things with one another, and with God.

Cobham Area Foodbank: still going strong after 12 years - what a shame!

As Michael Flaxman reports, the challenge the Foodbank faced when they opened in December 2013 has got far greater in the years since...

n 2025, the impact of price rises and benefit changes casts a dark shadow over many of our families – already struggling, some fear that the future is even bleaker which can have both a physical and mental toll on families who are already very fragile. The foodbank continues to provide a basic food and necessities package which can help them juggle their other outgoings (and very often, growing debts) for a little while longer while they try to find a way out of their difficulties. But we love to hear clients say "we won't be back next week"!

This year we have seen an increase in working men and women who, despite earning a wage, cannot afford the combination of rent, energy and food, forcing them to seek help from the foodbank.

We rely on constant donations of food and necessities from all around the area with donation points at supermarkets, churches and Cobham Rugby Club. We also are thankful for generous



financial donations which cover our running costs such as rent, van expenses and importantly allow us to purchase those items we run short of from your donations. This ensures we deliver a consistent, complete and nutritionally balanced food pack to every client we see.

Our clients...

Our clients come through local referral agencies such as Cobham Centre for the Community, PA Housing, Oasis, Esher Citizens Advice Bureau, Weybridge Job Centre Plus, churches and others who play a vital role in identifying those in crisis and

helping them access the support they need.

The last financial year, we received nearly 30 tons of food and essentials, with distributions supporting an average of nearly 40 people a week. Approximately 40% were children.

Our last Collection Day at

Waitrose was successful even if the amount of donations was 25% less than

previous years - a phenomenon experienced throughout the country as many donors tighten their belts to afford even their own needs.

Oxshott had their own summer food drive in June organised by St Andrew's and collected 180 kg of food items and over £1,000 in financial donations for which we



are very grateful. We look forward to the Harvest season which is upon us. providing much needed donations from schools and churches.

We were proud to be chosen as Squires Garden Centres Cobham's Charity of the Year for the past two years, and as this partnership comes to a close, we

want to thank everyone for their support.

Finally, none of this would be possible without a dedicated team of cheerful, compassionate and flexible volunteers who work tirelessly to pick up, sort, pack, and deliver food packs throughout the year and of course thank you for your continuing generosity.

William Tyndale...

This month, the 500th anniversary of the start of the Reformation, is a good time to pay tribute to an outstanding English scholar...

illiam Tyndale (c. 1494 - 6 October 1536) was born near Gloucester, and studied at Oxford and Cambridge. He could speak seven languages, and was proficient in ancient Hebrew and Greek. As a priest, his abilities would have taken him a long way, but by 1523 Tyndale's only desire was to translate the Bible, so that English men and women could read it



for themselves. His life's passion is well summed up in words of his mentor. Erasmus: "Christ desires His mysteries to be published abroad as widely as possible. I would that [the Gospels and the epistles] were translated into all languages, of all Christian people, and that they might be read and known."

Tyndale's translation was the first Bible to be published in English, the first to draw directly from Hebrew and Greek texts, and the first English translation to take advantage of the printing press.

It was to cost him his life. For Tyndale's work

was seen as a direct challenge to both the Roman Catholic Church and the laws of England; Tyndale fled to Hamburg, Wittenberg, Cologne, and finally to the city of Worms. There, in 1525, his New Testament emerged. It was quickly smuggled into England, and King Henry VIII, Cardinal Wolsey and others, were furious.

Tyndale moved on to Antwerp, but in May 1535 he was betrayed and imprisoned. Tied to the stake, his dying prayer was that the King of England's eyes would be opened. Sure enough, two years later King Henry authorised the Great Bible for the Church of England, which relied largely on Tyndale's work.

Not only that, but in 1611, the 54 scholars who produced the King James Bible drew very heavily from Tyndale. Even now we honour him: in 2002, Tyndale was placed at number 26 in the BBC's poll of 100 Greatest Britons.

Was it a coincidence or did God play a part?

After a series of conversations, **Hannah Fast** noticed a theme emerging - and this encouraged her to keep a record of the stories that people told her...

Sometimes we look back on a situation and think, thank goodness that happened. Maybe you have had to delay a holiday or miss a train and later you realised that it was a blessing in disguise. Some people call that a lucky coincidence. Christians might call it a 'Godincidence'. I have gathered together some stories that I would like to share with you...

Here is a story a friend tells: "Stopping at the traffic lights, top of Fairoak Lane with Warren Lane I used to pull out of Fairoak Lane as soon as the amber light appeared. One morning I was sat at the traffic lights and a little voice in my head said 'Wait for the green light' several times. Thankfully I listened to that little voice. After the light had gone green I pulled out and a car went into the side of my bonnet and careered into the fence between the poles of the traffic lights. Thankfully no one was hurt, had I not listened to the little voice it would have been a different story."

Another instance is from the leader of one of our life groups, or house groups as they are sometimes called. He struggled with the decision as to whether or not to merge his group with another one. In the end he agreed to the merger. Subsequently a member of the second group shared some information in one of the expanded group meetings. The information related to alternative therapies for cancer. Little did the group leader know then that in the coming months, this information would prove invaluable to one of his family members, and would contribute to saving her life.

Our treasurer tells us that in recent times an unexpected legacy came in. It arrived just a few months before we learned that we were going to need it to cover unexpected expenditure.

Autumn arrives in a woodland painting

With a busy season ahead, the Art & Crafts world looks first at Autumn, as **Miranda Fuller** reports...

ith that extraordinarily good summer now a rather distant memory, OCACS were delighted to meet new demonstrator, Karen Pearson, on 9 September,

who produced for us the charming autumn woodland watercolour, seen here.

Wetting the paper and paints first and with a fat brush, for plenty of paint, for her background Karen applies a very loose wash in gamboge yellow, followed by one in cerulean blue, leaving areas of white paper amongst both. Using a stick with paint from her brush, she then draws the outlines of trees and slender branches, filling in the trunks with colour after.

For foliage she uses dryish, sideways, 'scuffing' strokes with her brush. Putting in the greenery of the background, she brings the trees further forward, adding more detail and branches with painted stick and keeping warm colours for the foreground and leaving the background cooler and muted, for distance.

For the path, she applies a rough yellow wash and finally, places shadows of trunks and treetops across it, leaving us with this warm, uplifting autumn scene.

Looking ahead...

There are a number of upcoming OCACS demonstrations and events for our autumn season which readers might find uplifting: first, *The Colourists*, a debut exhibition by a newly formed group of six local artists, including OCACS (Oxshott & Cobham Art & Crafts Society) members, taking place 1-5 October in Walton (see page 24). Not to be missed! Then our next demonstration, on 14 October, is *Abstract Flower Composition in Acrylic and Collage*, by Kim Page and on Saturday 25 October we have an all-day workshop of printmaking with collage, by Vicky Oldfield.

The Denbies Exhibition *(details opposite)* is later this year, in November, and the AGM and film show are on Tuesday 9 December.

Our demonstrations are friendly and informal and take place at the Oxshott Village Centre on the second Tuesday of the month, from 7.30 to 9.30 – details on our website: oxshottartandcrafts.org

Happy Birthday

...to plastic bag decline in the UK

This year marks ten years since England introduced a 5p charge – on 5 October 2015 - for single-use plastic carrier bags. The charge has had a dramatic effect, with a reduction of 98% in sales.

In 2014, 7.6 billion single-use bags were sold in the UK. By 2023, 133 million single-use bags had been sold in the major supermarkets. The average person in the UK now buys only about two single-use plastic bags per year.

At the election on 21 August, **Andy Burton** (*left*) became the Surrey County Councillor for the Hinchley Wood, Claygate and Oxshott Division, which includes Oxshott, east of the railway line.

Overall, the Conservatives lost control of Surrey County Council, just as it embarks on the upcoming major reorganisation.

The stuff of which history is made...

From porcelain to jewellery to tapestry, **Nicky Orlebar** tells us how ASCO members (our local Arts Society) discovered a wealth of treasures in the Galleries of the Victoria & Albert Museum...

Inside the V&A, an enthusiastic Arts Society group gathered for a morning's guided tour of two of the acclaimed Galleries. The European Galleries display art and culture from AD 300-1600, and contain such riches as French stained glass, Meissen porcelain, Della Robbia roundels and a Leonardo notebook.

The exquisite Becket casket commemorates Archbishop Thomas Becket's murder in Canterbury Cathedral in 1170, when soldiers apparently overheard Henry II mutter "Will no one rid me of this turbulent priest?" The casket, thought to have been made in Limoges ten years later, has a deep blue enamel background showing scenes of the event. It could once have held Becket's relics following his canonisation.

The first floor British Galleries exhibit works from the Tudor to Victorian eras. The huge Devonshire Hunting Tapestries were owned by Bess of Hardwick in the 1490s; their wonderful colours showing people, plants and animals, means their survival is hugely informative about clothing and life at the time. Tapestries woven

in wool and silk were hung on walls by those who could afford them, to insulate against draughts.

The exquisite
yet small oval
Drake Jewel was a
pendant given by a
grateful Elizabeth 1
to Sir Francis
Drake following
his success against



the Spanish Armada in 1588. Delicately ornate with pearls, rubies and diamonds, inside the lid is Nicholas Hilliard's attractive miniature portrait of the Queen.

The 1590 Great Bed of Ware is a handsome oak four-poster from a coaching inn in Ware, Hertfordshire. Carved initials in the dark wood were probably engraved by those staying the night. Shakespeare refers to the bed in *Twelfth Night*.

Furniture, armour, silverware, ceramics, clothing and so much more are all on display. We came away enthralled by the historic treasures found in just two of the V&A's wide-ranging Galleries.
