month is usually when we see the first frosts: gardeners beware!



'Ordinands'...?

What exactly is an ordinand? Our Vicar, Revd Patrick Davies, explains all...

Intil I became one myself in 2017, it was a word I had never even heard – but, an 'Ordinand' is someone who is training with a view to being ordained as a deacon or priest in the church. This generally takes around three years, and involves academic study, varied contextual placements in different churches, and significant attention to personal and spiritual development.

Wonderfully, at St Andrew's we currently have two ordinands with us!

Steph Rustom (*left*) - Steph, who many of you will already know from The Café at St Andrew's, began her three years of training with the College of St Martha in Guildford in September.

Whilst she trains, she continues to serve in the many ways she is already doing so at St Andrew's - The Café, All Age Services, our Open the Book team, and many other things! As her training progresses over the coming years, she will widen her experience and be involved in new areas as well.

David Boothby (right) - David joins us on a

placement from All Saints' Church in Ockham, which is his 'home church' where the majority of his training has already taken place.

David will be with us at St Andrew's here in Oxshott until around Easter 2026, and during his time here hopes to experience and soak up as much of what happens at St Andrew's as he can, as he develops and broadens his experience in a church and context a little different from Ockham, which though only a few miles away is distinctly different from Oxshott and St Andrew's in many ways.

It has already been wonderful to get to know David a little in the few weeks he has been here, and if you have not already met David with me at Lunch Club, Esher Manor, ABC, or in services, I do hope that you will have the opportunity to do so in the time he is with us.

November's Services

We usually follow a theme through our Sunday morning church services - but this November we have a month of 'one off's!

On 2 November, we celebrate a combined 'All Saints and All Souls' - with our 10am All Age service reminding us that as Christians we are a part of a big family of faith which stretches back through history.

9 November is Remembrance Sunday: we gather at 10am in church for the service that includes an Act of Remembrance, and at 12 noon at the War Memorial on the Heath for a special Act of Remembrance, joined by the Scout and Guide groups.

On 16 November we will join with churches across the nation in marking 'Safeguarding Sunday'— an opportunity to focus on how we best look after one another in our churches and communities.

On 23 November we will share more about what makes us 'us' at St Andrew's our Vision and Values as a Church. Finally, on **30 November**, we celebrate our own named Saint, Jesus' first disciple, Andrew.

The appointment of Sarah Mullally as the next Archbishop of Canterbury is clearly a significant and historic moment, as the first woman appointed to lead the Church of England, and to head the Anglican Communion.

Though there is a probably fictional account of a female Pope 'Joan' in the 850s, women have spent centuries in the background of church history. But several named women were leaders in the first churches 2,000 years ago: Phoebe was a deacon of the church in Cenchreae: Priscilla was a leader of a church and a teacher; and Junia was described as an apostle by St Paul. And we know of other women who also led house churches. So, Sarah's appointment is significant, but not unprecedented if we look back to the start of church history.

Sarah's leadership as Bishop of London since 2018, and her address given at Canterbury Cathedral as she was announced as Archbishop Designate, give us a helpful indication of the kind of leadership and direction with which she may take the Church of England when she becomes Archbishop on 28 January 2026.

Who was J. N. Todd?

Remembrance Sunday this year is on 9 November, and at the church service at St Andrew's we will as usual read out the names of those who died in the two World Wars. **Brian Cox** looks at just one of those names...

he moment in the Remembrance Sunday service when the names of those who died are read out is very moving. It must have been even more poignant in the years immediately after the two conflicts, because many members of the congregation would have known some of them personally.

The names of those with Oxshott connections are unfamiliar to us now, so I thought I would see what I could discover about just one of them, and picked a name at random to explore...

Listed on both the memorial in church and the War Memorial on the Heath is a "I.N. Todd".

This, I found, was Gunner John Napier Todd 2052774 of the Royal Artillery, who died on 8 August 1942, aged just 26. The connection with Oxshott is that at the start of the War his parents Hugh Armstrong Todd and Maud Beatrice Todd were living on Steels Lane, at Lavender Cottage which is still there today.

The vast majority of servicemen who died in the War died overseas, but John Todd died in St Andrew's Hospital in Thorpe, near Norwich, probably as a result of a head injury. The records say he was in

the 30 Searchlight Regiment, which explains why he was in the UK, his battery likely being one of those deployed in Spring 1942 to defend airfields in East Anglia.

Place of burial...

Because he died in the UK, he was buried near his home, in this case in Cobham Cemetery, off Tilt Road, possibly because there is no cemetery in Oxshott (St Andrew's has a very high water table).

The narrative at the foot of his tombstone (right) says 'He died for his King and Country'.

At the time of his death, his parents were aged 70 and 65, another aspect of the real-life impact of his passing.

to date with the work they are doing with the communities in Pakistan and Nepal.

Finally, we heard from **Dean Finnie**, about the work that The Gathering church is doing to help people around Firgrove, near Cape Town - including soup kitchens, homework clubs and supporting people to take on community leadership roles.

After the presentations, we experienced the joy of sharing time together over a light lunch in the hall, where we could get to know our mission partners even better.



OTS Compassion Campaign 2025: an update

One of the goals of our mission partner in Pakistan, the Open Theological Seminary (OTS), is to demonstrate the love of Christ by extending help to underprivileged people in Pakistan through need-based support. We asked them for an update on their work...

since 2020, with the rise of Covid-19, OTS started its Compassion Campaign with a slogan 'Putting our Theology into Practice'. In total we have helped more than 5,000 families starting from Covid-19 (2020), flood victims in Sindh (in 2021 & 2022) and the victims of Jaranwala incident, where 26 churches and 100 homes were burnt and destroyed (2023).

As the immediate crises subsided, our mission evolved beyond emergency relief. We are now addressing needs, assisting vulnerable families across Pakistan

with food and financial support tailored to their circumstances. Through sustained efforts, OTS remains committed to bringing hope, dignity, and lasting change to those in need.

During the current campaign, we have reached a total of 202 beneficiaries. Among them, 104 women (including widows, domestic workers, and brick kiln workers), 77 men (labourers, daily wage earners, and brick kiln workers) and 21 orphaned children. We focused on serving humanity through our contributions, supporting underprivileged individuals in various ways, and sharing the love of our Lord Christ without distinction of religion, caste, denomination, gender or class.

OTS is immensely grateful to the Lord Almighty, whose continuous grace enables us to make a source to reach the underprivileged people of different segments of our society. We are humble before God for His guidance, wisdom, and provision throughout this campaign reporting period.

FEDORA AGM: what happened?

FEDORA held a well-attended and lively AGM on 6 October at the Royal Kent School, as **Ian Dilks**, a Director of FEDORA, now reports...

Pormalities were kept to a minimum at this year's AGM, where we were joined by three of our local councillors, and the meeting focussed on just four topics: FEDORA's future, the High Street development, Green Belt developments and the Local Government Reorganisation.

FEDORA's future

Anthony Wolfe, the Chair, explained the everincreasing demands on FEDORA and that without further volunteers to assist its position



will become unsustainable. We also need to plan succession for the current team and the Chair noted he plans to stand down by the next AGM. The Chair also noted the importance of more people becoming paid up members as opposed to simply supporters, and that a campaign to increase membership was planned.

High Street development

The main item of the evening was a Q&A discussion session with Peter Brodnicki based primarily on questions submitted in advance by members, supplemented by a few questions from the floor.

Peter is an Oxshott resident of over ten years who is the investor behind the redevelopment of the High Street, working closely with James Davis. Peter explained that when he first moved to the village it was clear the High Street looked tired, a view shared by many he spoke to . He was introduced to James Davis who had a very exciting vision for the high street and had already done what he could by consulting villagers about bringing in Munch & Wiggles and the Deli. Peter was keen to support James deliver that vision and he spoke passionately about how much he believed in it. He explained the key elements including the need to attract and support local businesses; to provide smaller more affordable flats for local workers and promote sustainable development using modern materials. He noted that the planning authorities would have preferred more flats and fewer parking spaces but

he thought parking provision was important for not only the apartments but also to support the Vic with its plans to provide

accommodation in the village.

It was agreed that communication about the commencement of the work could be improved, with ongoing updates on how work across the three phases was progressing. FEDORA agreed to work with Peter and James to see how this could be done using FEDORA's regular emails to supporters.

Peter spoke very pointedly about the need for residents to use the businesses in the High Street. They deserve support, and only by helping businesses thrive will we see the businesses we want. Peter and James would welcome views from residents who do use local businesses about what new retailers they would want to see.

Peter explained that whilst the development had to be financially viable, this has never been a profit-making project. James and he wanted help make Oxshott a village all residents could enjoy and be proud of, and it was his intention to leave his interest in the commercial units in trust for the village.

Green Belt developments

Ian Dilks outlined the context to development risk as a result of the lack of a Local Plan for Elmbridge and of changes in national policy that have reduced the ability of local authorities to oppose development. Government policy now proposes the redesignation of some green belt as grey belt that has more limited protection from development. Further detail will be in the Autumn FEDORA magazine.

He outlined FEDORA's policy on the response to development, details of which are on the FEDORA website, and what FEDORA is currently doing in relation to possible future and current development proposals.

He then outlined the status of The Paddocks application in Stoke D'Abernon, highlighting the concerns about the Blundel Lane railway bridge, and the new application at Clouds Hill Farm, to be renamed Clarence Park.

FEDORA has retained expert advice to assess the impact on roads-related issues which will affect the whole village. In addition, it is supporting an action group of local residents, Residents Against Clouds Hill Farm Development.

Local Government Reorganisation and devolution

Surrey is in the vanguard of change designed to improve local government efficiency and improve local democracy. In addition, elections to new unitary authorities next May will be based on new ward boundaries which will split Oxshott in two.

The issues are complex and may seem arcane to most residents, but they will be important to residents' ability to shape the future of the village. Further details are in FEDORA's Autumn magazine.

Cathedral commentaries...

From Alfred the Great to a deep-sea diver, ASCO members (our local Arts Society) explored some of the stories in Winchester Cathedral, as revealed by **Nicky Orlebar**...

rriving outside Winchester Cathedral, our Arts Society guide indicated the Anglo-Saxon Old Minster of AD 648, marked out in the grass near today's west door. Between AD 827-1066 Winchester was capital of England, during which time the Minster, later Cathedral, witnessed the crowning of Alfred the Great and burial of Canute.

The present Cathedral dating from 1093, was built using sand-coloured Isle of Wight Quarr Stone. With rounded Norman arches and glazed floor tiles, building work culminated in the spectacular 1340s Perpendicular Gothic style nave making it the longest medieval church in Britain. In 1554 Queen Mary Tudor married the future Philip II of Parliament's opposition to the unpopular marriage.

The huge west window was shattered in 1642 by Cromwell, but luckily the townspeople carefully gathered up the

stained-glass fragments and restored the window as a colourful mosaic.

In 1910 when the Cathedral's stone floor became uneven and wall cracks appeared, experts attributed the cause to a high water table in the peat soil. To the rescue came William Walker, a deep-sea diver who for the next five years worked under the foundations installing bags of concrete. Walker's stupendous efforts are commemorated inside the nave by a bronze statue of him holding his diving helmet.

After lunch in the nearby Refectory, our city walk began outside Jane Austen's lodgings at No 8 College Street, where she died in 1817, aged just 41. Her epitaph in the Cathedral's north transept mentions her "endowments of the mind" – a qualification rarely attributed to women at the time. Walking passed the former Bishop's Palace and ruins of Wolvesey Palace, which date back from the 1100s, we strolled through gardens following the Roman city wall back to our coach. We had learnt and observed so much during our day in historic Winchester.


