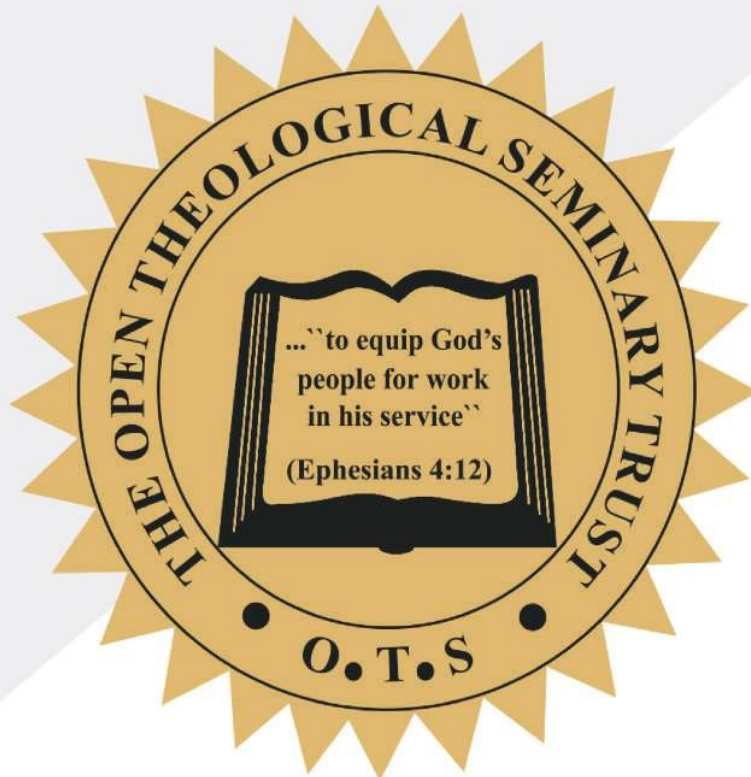


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Director's Note

It is with profound gratitude to God and heartfelt appreciation for your partnership that I present this year's update from OTS. By God's grace, we have made significant progress in fortifying our legal and institutional framework.

We express our gratitude to God for MACS achieving full accreditation by ATA. In response to the ATA VET Report 2023, we submitted our initial response, addressing all notes, observations, and implementing the majority of the recommendations. As a result of our response, ATA has graciously granted full accreditation for the OTS MACS program. A highlight of our year was the staff retreat held in Naran Valley from 2-6 June 2025. This was a meaningful time for the staff team in prayer, reflection, planning, and fellowship. I took Bible study on Ezekiel chapters 1–3, and it was impactful, reminding all of us of the prophetic call and God’s presence amid challenging tasks. This time gave us an opportunity to develop OTS five-year strategic plan, a few of the key highlights are shared in the report.

Through the Theological Education Forum (TEF), we successfully hosted the second Theological Education Expo, featuring 70 institutions and reaching nearly 10,000 individuals. TEF also conducted its annual conference with the theme ‘Rethinking Mission in the context of Pakistan’ on 23-26 March 2025, which brought together 98 participants from 38 institutions. These initiatives continue to promote unity and collaboration within the theological education providers and work together for the quality of theological education in Pakistan. We are also grateful for our expanding partnership with Langham, highlighted recently by a successful facilitator training program that engaged 30 facilitators across Pakistan.

Lastly, we have completed a significant renovation of our ground floor, transforming it into a more inviting and functional space equipped with a modern kitchen, glass doors, and tiled flooring.

We are incredibly thankful for your generous support, steadfast prayers, and unwavering encouragement that make a big difference in the OTS ministry work throughout Pakistan and beyond. We rejoice together in all that God has accomplished — and what is yet to come — through the strategic ministry of OTS.

We have recently completed the admissions process for Cohort 5, where a total of 34 students (28 male and 6 female) have been selected. The dedication and commitment of these students are clearly illustrated in the words of a young couple, Alisha Haroon and Noreen Haroon, who come from an under-developed area of Toba-Tek Singh. Reflecting on their acceptance and enrollment in the MACS program, they shared, “We sold some of our essential household items and postponed our house construction plans to save money for the expenses we will incur over the next two years.” This couple is thrilled to be part of the exceptional education offered by OTS. Their experience is just one of many similar testimonials from this cohort. We are grateful to God for the acceptance and the overwhelmingly positive response from the students.

New Initiatives

Making MACS Available Online

Considering the current demands in education and the insightful recommendations outlined in the ATA VET report 2023, OTS has decided to bring the MACS program online. This initiative will allow us to explore innovative strategies and techniques that would enhance our virtual educational capacity, ensuring that we meet the needs of our students in a rapidly evolving digital landscape. Alongside providing students with written self-study material, MACS facilitators will also provide it online using a Learning Management System.

Curriculum Review

In the light of ATA evaluation, OTS plans to undertake a thorough review and assessment of the current curriculum of MACS program in order to make it more consistent and inline with its holistic learning objectives. Reading reflections will also be shared with the whole class, inviting discussion, rather than merely submitted to the facilitator. Post-intensive assignments and projects will be discussed to create group feedback mechanisms and collaborative learning opportunities.

Field Department

Field & Rural Impact 2024–2025

Across Pakistan's villages, towns, and cities, the Field & Rural Department of OTS has continued its mission to take God's Word beyond seminary walls. This year, we deepened our presence, strengthened our outreach, and saw lives transformed through discipleship, education, and mentorship. Through 679 field visits, 81 OTS Sundays, and numerous 13 Tutor training workshops, 5 Students workshops, and 4 church and Community Development Trainings. Our dedicated coordinators worked tirelessly to support students, inspire tutors, and build meaningful relationships with pastors and local leaders. Here's how we made a difference.

OTS Student Days – Celebrating Learning and Transformation

Every year, OTS Student Days celebrate dedication, achievement, and spiritual growth. From July 2024 to July 2025, we organized eight Student Days and two Discipleship Level Certificate Ceremonies in ten cities, including Peshawar and Karachi. Over 1,949 students received certificates, diplomas, and degrees — proof of their hard work and faith. These events featured competitions, speeches, testimonies, and brought together students, tutors, and community leaders to honor transformed lives through God's Word.

Class Visits Across Pakistan– Bringing Learning to Life

This year our field coordinators and staff made 405 strategic class visits in urban and rural areas of Pakistan. These visits ensure that each student receives consistent, high-quality training through weekly local study groups led by dedicated volunteer tutors, following the Theological Education by Extension (TEE) model.

OTS Tutors Workshops

Their aim is to equip our tutors with dynamic teaching skills, rooted in the principles of context based learning. To support this initiative, OTS successfully conducted 11 impactful Tutor Training Workshops. These workshops are designed to reinvigorate and strengthen the capabilities of tutors — refreshing their knowledge, sharpening their teaching techniques, and inspiring renewed passion for their role as volunteer tutors.

Educational Seminars - Deepening Faith Through Learning and Fellowship

This year, we enriched our community with a range of events. 3 Educational Seminars covering topics like Christian Response to Suffering, Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the Women Health Awareness were conducted in Faisalabad and Kasur. A total of 186 participants showed up, 52 of them were males and 134 females.

Church and Community Transformation

Throughout 2024–2025, the Field & Rural Department organized 5 trainings for tutors, students, and pastors as part of our ongoing Church and Community Transformation (CCT) in collaboration with Tearfund.



As a youth leader, I have seen the significant impact that the CCT social accountability training has had on the young people in our church. Before the training, many of them felt disillusioned by the corruption and inefficiency in their surroundings. They believed that they had no power to bring about change. 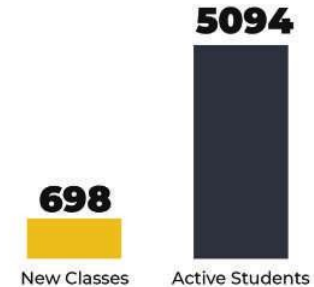

OTS Promotional Visits – Spreading the Flame of Theological Education

This year, the OTS Field and Rural team made 678 visits to churches, schools, and ministry organizations, promoting accessible context-based theological training. Each visit creates awareness of the need for youth discipleship and lay training. These interactions not only raise awareness but also create thirst and hunger for transformation in communities through God’s Word.

Active Classes

Since July 2024, we have experienced significant growth. We launched 698 new classes at 329 different location all over Pakistan, enrolling 5,094 dedicated students eager to deepen their biblical understanding leading to transformation and enhancing their ministry skills.



Active Tutors

We are so pleased to share that OTS has strengthened its team of active tutors to a significant number of 415 committed individuals! 126 of them are female. This reflects the fact that OTS ministry is sustainable because of the involvement of such great number of volunteer tutors.

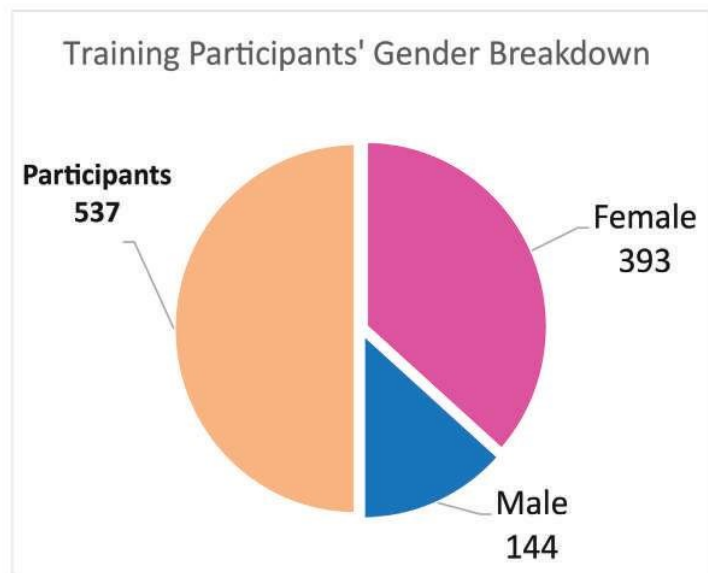
YOUTH DEPARTMENT

The Youth Department is working among Christian Youth aged 11 to 17 through the Christian Education Curriculum for Teenagers (CECT). This Curriculum is comprised of ten courses that provide fabulous help for teenagers to deal with challenges that they are facing spiritually, socially, physically, and psychologically regarding their Christian identity living in the minority context of Pakistan. It is an activities-based curriculum and has been designed in a way that is adaptable and can be taught in church and school settings. We are grateful to our Almighty God for His continuous help and protection during the various activities of the OTS Youth Department. Here are some highlights from these activities.



Tutor Training:

This year, the Youth Department organized 22 tutor training workshops across 15 cities in Pakistan, spanning three provinces. In addition, an online training session was held for international participants, attracting 17 trainees from the USA, Canada, Saudi Arabia, and Pakistan. The primary objective of this training was to equip tutors with the necessary teaching skills to effectively engage teenagers in these interactive courses. Overall, 537 tutors were trained, comprising 144 males and 393 females.

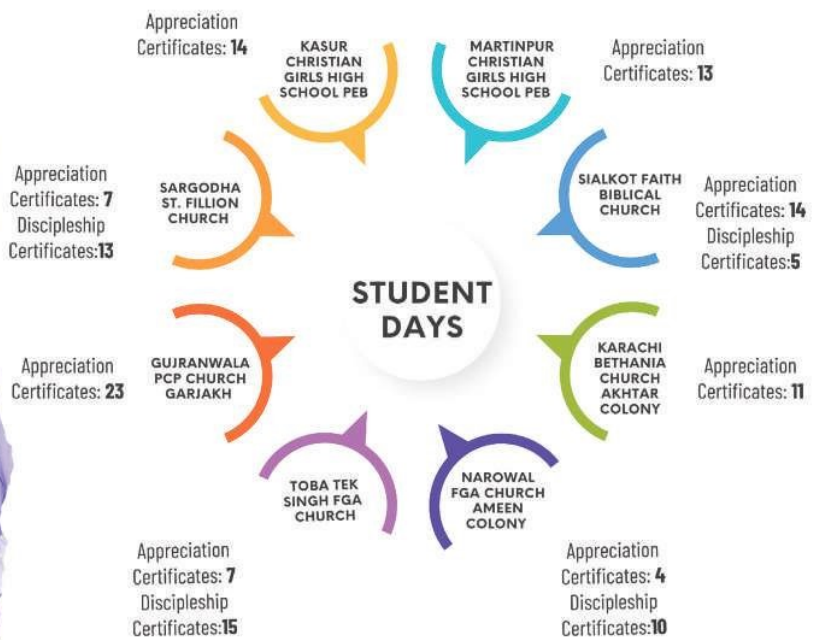


Glimpse of Tutor Training Workshops in different locations

Student Days:

Student Day offers us a wonderful opportunity to uplift and encourage students by presenting certificates and gifts in the presence of community members and church leaders from their cities and regions. The Youth Department successfully organized seven Student Days in various locations, with participation exceeding 2,500 students

A total of 86 students were honored with Appreciation Certificates for their achievements, while 28 students received Discipleship Certificates. Additional details about all the Student Days events are provided below.



Youth Seminars:

The Youth Department organized three seminars focused on the theme **"How Teenagers Can Deal with Temptations."** Our aim is to equip young people with the tools and knowledge necessary to make positive choices and lead fulfilling lives. Navigating temptation is a crucial aspect of life, and we are dedicated to offering opportunities for youth to learn effective strategies for managing their desires and making wise decisions. A total of 194 teenage students participated in these seminars.

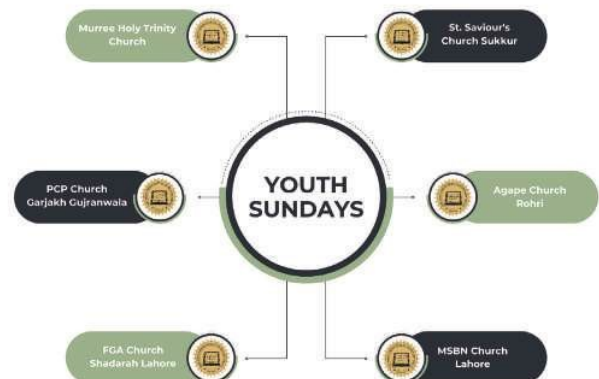

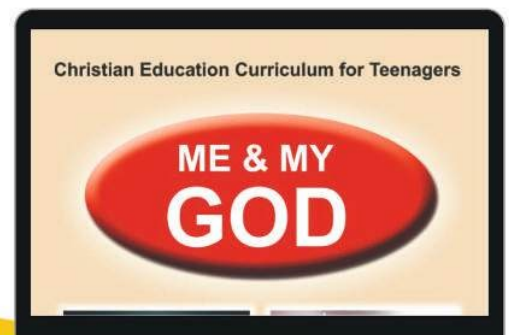
Youth Sunday

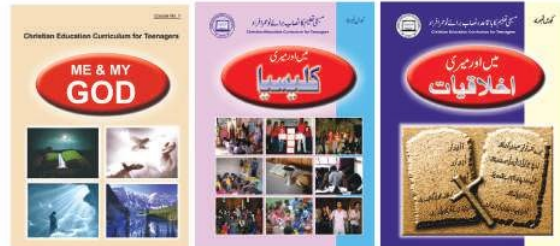


Revision and Reprinting of Courses

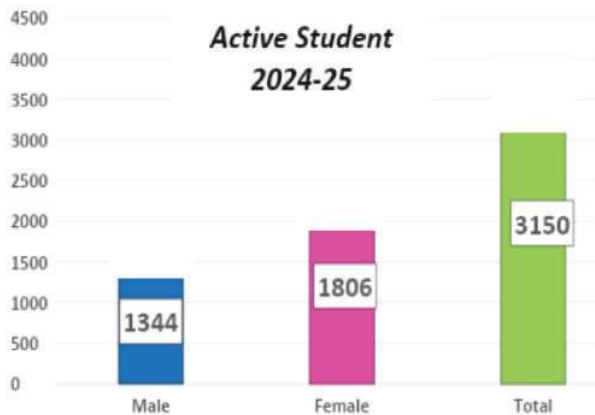

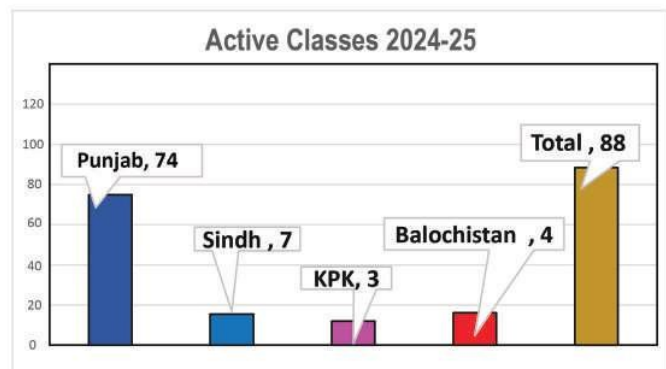

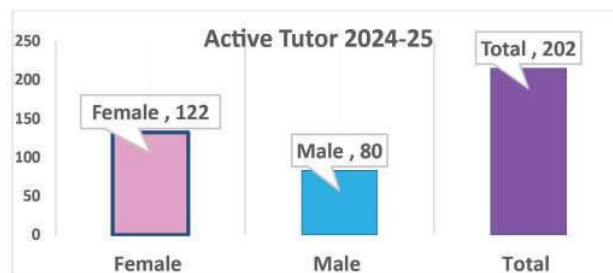


Active Classes

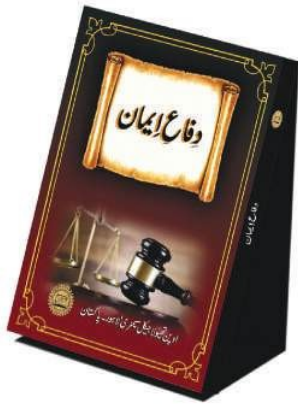
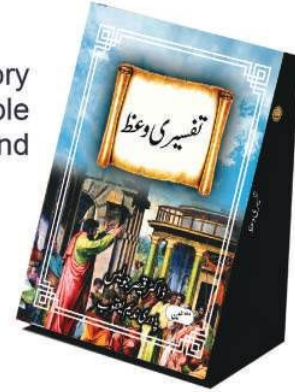
Course Development Department

The Course Development Department plays an essential role in enhancing educational resources within the church by carefully editing, revising, and reprinting existing OTS courses. Alongside updating current material, we are committed to developing new courses specifically designed to meet the evolving needs of our congregations. Our team collaborates closely with other departments, offering vital support for their editorial, printing, and teaching needs. Ahead are some key highlights of accomplishments from our efforts over the past year.



New Courses

- ▶ We are delighted to announce that the highly anticipated Expository Preaching course has been successfully completed and is now available in print. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to Dr. Qaiser Julius and Rev. Nadeem Yaqoob for their tireless efforts in bringing this project to completion. We believe that many students at OTS, as well as other seminaries, pastors, and lay leaders, will greatly benefit from this course and enhance their preaching skills.



- ▶ We are happy to announce that the course on Apologetics is now complete and is available in print. This course will be a great addition to the curriculum and will enable the students to defend their faith effectively.

- ▶ CDD plans to develop a course on Missions, aimed at training theology students in this often-overlooked area. There is a pressing need to prepare effective missionaries who can enter the field and win souls for the Lord. To address this, CDD organized a two-day consultation on February 13-14, 2025.

- ▶ Esteemed theologians and practitioners participated, providing valuable insights that have been thoroughly documented. The theme of TEF's annual conference also focused on Missions, and we received further valuable perspectives on the development of this course from this event.

Revision and Reprinting

In the past six months, we reprinted the following courses after revision and formatting changes, as detailed below:

1. Life of Christ-1

This Certificate level course focuses on the birth of Jesus, His early life, and preparation for ministry, including His death and resurrection. 2000 copies were reprinted.



2. Light of Bible

This Certificate level course is about God's message for our day-to-day life. 3000 copies were printed after proofreading.



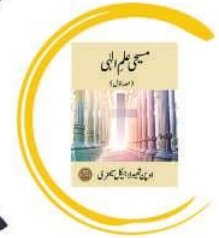
3. Talking with God

This Certificate level course teaches everything a believer needs to pray to God effectively. 3000 copies were printed after proofreading.



4. Christian Theology 1

This Diploma level course covers different aspects of Christian Theology. Proofreading of this course has been completed and it is waiting to be printed.



5. New Testament Survey

This Degree level course gives insight about historical, political, social, cultural and religious context of the New Testament. 1000 copies were reprinted.



6. Members of Christ's Body

This Certificate level course explains the Church as Christ's body, its activities and sacraments, and how fruits of the Spirit manifest within it. 1000 copies were printed after minor revision.



7. Abundant Life

This Certificate level course teaches about abundant life in Christ, basic principles of Christian discipleship, and gives basics of church fellowship and service. 3000 copies were printed after proofreading and graphics enhancement.



8. Christian Family Life

This Certificate level course covers biblical teachings necessary for a strong and healthy marital relationship. 3000 copies were reprinted in May 2025.



Ongoing work on Revision and Reprinting

Work is being done on the following courses before reprinting them. Some need proofreading while others need minor revision.

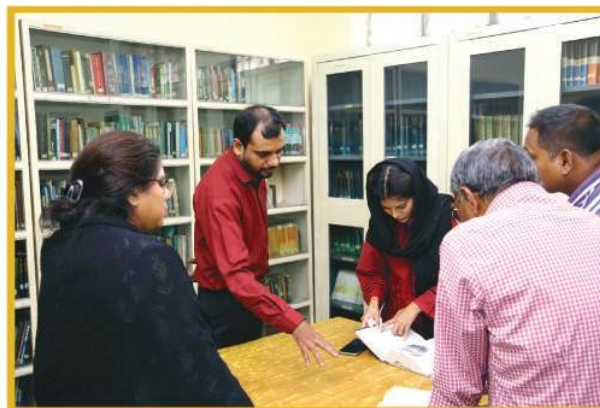

Library Management

Course Development Department staff manages and oversees the OTS library and assists the visitors using it. At present, we have more than eleven thousand books, around 8,000 English books and 3,000 Urdu books, which are not only used by OTS students and tutors, but also students from other Bible colleges and secular universities for their research work. Almost 180 books have been added to the library in the past six months.

We are in the process of cataloguing our extensive collection of digital resources (mainly pdf books) to make them more widely available. We completed a stock check of the library in September 2024.

MEAL Department



In 2025, the Open Theological Seminary (OTS) made a significant leap forward by establishing its Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, and Learning (MEAL) Department to strengthen systems and increase impact. Led by the MEAL Officer, the department introduced regular tracking of key indicators such as student retention, course completion, and community engagement, while launching a new feedback and complaints system to ensure timely responses from stakeholders.

To address field-level reporting gaps, digital attendance sheets were rolled out for seminars and trainings, improving data accuracy and record-keeping. Quarterly MEAL reports now guide departments with clear insights for better planning and use of resources. In collaboration with the HR Department, staff performance-based appraisals were conducted for all OTS staff to promote accountability and professional growth.

The MEAL Department also works closely with all OTS departments, providing practical suggestions to help the department teams to work efficiently, improve reporting, and adopt a systematic approach to planning and monitoring of their respective activities. Theological Educators' Forum (TEF)

Second Theological Education Expo

The Theological Educators Forum (TEF), with the motto “**Let’s Connect and Learn Together,**” convened in December to unite theological institutions from across Pakistan. The event aimed to foster relationships, exchange ideas, and provide mutual support. Under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Kaiser Julius, General Secretary of TEF, the Forum hosted its second Theological Education Expo from December 6–8, 2024, at Forman Christian College University in Lahore. Following the success of the first Expo in 2022, this year’s event was even more vibrant and engaging. Around 60 institutions took part — including 29 Bible colleges and seminaries, 13 printing and media houses, and 18 like-minded organizations — each sharing their unique contribution to theological education. The event welcomed nearly 10,000 visitors from different cities, churches, denominations, and walks of life. The Expo created a special space for theological institutions to showcase how they are serving the Church in Pakistan. The theme of collaboration ran strong throughout the event, seen in the lively atmosphere and wide range of activities. There were beautiful choir performances from local churches, passionate conversations about Scripture among theological students, and a fun quiz competition focused on Christmas passages from both the Old and New Testaments. More than just an event, the Expo became a celebration of faith, unity, and shared purpose — leaving everyone encouraged, connected, and inspired to continue building up theological education in Pakistan.

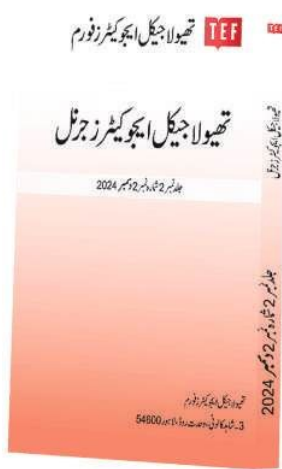

Langham National Preachers' Conference

The Open Theological Seminary and United Council of Churches hosted the first Langham National Preachers' Conference in Islamabad on November 15th and 16th. This two-day event brought together nearly 400 pastors from 27 cities across Pakistan, making it a momentous occasion for the wider church community. Dr. Paul Windsor, the International Director of Langham Preaching, conducted powerful sessions aimed at equipping pastors with the skills necessary for effective expository preaching. In addition, Dr. Qaiser Julius facilitated insightful sessions that not only offered practical knowledge but also nurtured spiritual growth and depth among the participants. A key highlight of the conference was the celebration of 20 years of Langham's ministry in Pakistan. Over the past two decades, Langham has made a profound impact on the Pakistani church by training and equipping leaders, fostering growth, and promoting deeper engagement with Scripture. Special recognition was given to individuals who played a significant role in strengthening and expanding Langham Ministry's impact in Pakistan. They were presented with shields of appreciation to honor their dedication and service. This conference stood as a testament to learning, fellowship, and the work of God through Langham in Pakistan.



Trainings

This year we organized 3 Langham Expository Preaching trainings in Lahore, Faisalabad, and Murree. In Faisalabad, track 1 training was held from January 16-18, 2025. There were 48 participants, 24 of which were male and 24 were female. In Lahore, track 2 was held from February 6-8, 2025. The total number of participants in this training was 44, 28 of which were male and 16 were female.



I was very curious about receiving training for the Langham Track-2, and I talked to my husband multiple times about attending it. I was delighted when I heard that OTS had arranged a Track-2 training at their office in Lahore. My motivation to pursue training for all Langham tracks stemmed from a book by John Stott, where I learned about his purpose for establishing the Langham organization to train leaders. In that book, Stott taught preachers how to effectively convey the Word of God, and I found it to be incredibly insightful and enriching. While attending the sessions, I found myself comparing the vision presented by John Stott in his book with the teachings of Dr. Qaiser. I observed how Dr. Qaiser was embodying Stott's vision through his sessions. We consider ourselves very fortunate to have such a great teacher at Langham in Sir Qaiser. I truly hope that in the future, many preachers in Pakistan will become effective communicators of the Word.

This year, we expanded our facilitation team by introducing co-facilitators. We had 9 lead facilitators and 7 co-facilitators. This approach not only strengthens our facilitation team but also helps develop the skills of the co-facilitators, preparing them to become lead facilitators in the future. Additionally, we emphasized making the sessions more interactive and ensured they followed adult learning principles.

Langham Facilitators’ Training

A Langham Facilitators’ Training was organized in collaboration with The Open Theological Seminary (OTS) at its Lahore office. The training aimed to strengthen existing facilitators by equipping them with updated pedagogical tools, adult learning principles, and core strategies to enhance the quality of expository preaching training nationwide. The three-day training welcomed 30 participants, 23 males and 7 females, from diverse cities, churches, and theological institutions across Pakistan. The sessions were primarily led by Dr. Qaiser Julius, Director of OTS and Regional Coordinator for Langham Preaching South Asia Pacific, who brought significant experience in both training and biblical exposition. This training not only reinforced Langham’s commitment to biblical preaching, but also built momentum for expanding local preaching movements through well-prepared and contextually aware facilitators.

Langham Preaching Clubs

Langham Preaching is experiencing significant growth across Pakistan, not only through trainings but also through preaching clubs. Preaching clubs are small, localized groups that meet regularly, allowing members to practice what they've learned, receive ongoing education, and foster accountability and encouragement among one another. Currently, there are 10 active preaching clubs spread across 9 different cities, with each fellowship consisting of 8 to 21 members who meet on a weekly or monthly basis.

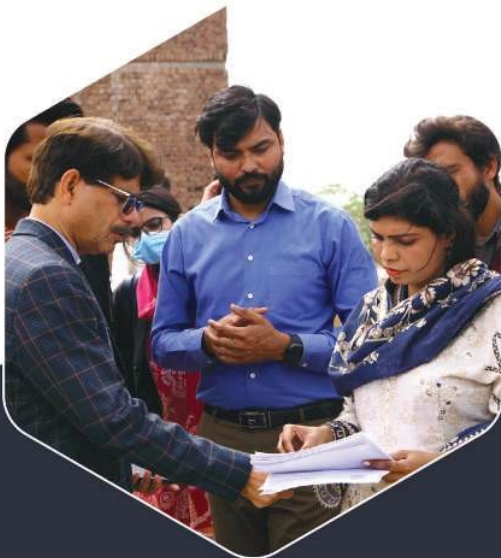
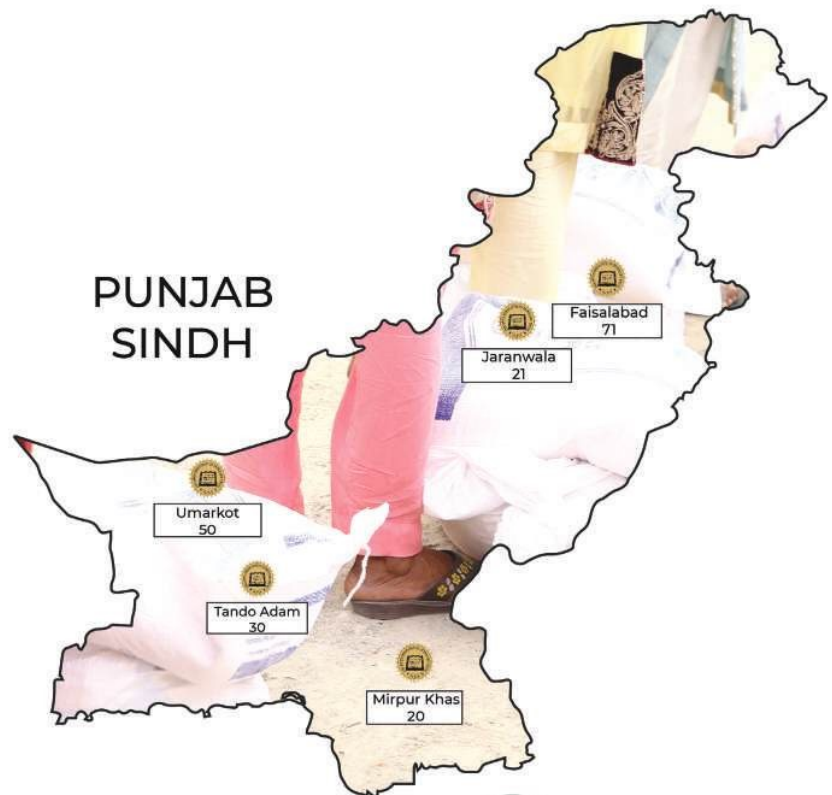

OTS COMPASSION CAMPAIGN

Since 2020, OTS has been actively serving vulnerable communities across Pakistan through its Compassion Campaign — launched with the vision of "Putting our Theology into Practice." From responding to the Covid-19 crisis to supporting flood victims and families affected by tragic incidents like the Jaranwala attacks, we have reached over 5,000 families with relief, regardless of religion, caste, or class. In this reporting period, our focus extended to brick kiln workers, widows, daily wage earners, and flood-affected families in Punjab and Sindh. We are deeply thankful to God, our donors, local coordinators, and volunteers whose collective efforts continue to bring hope and transformation to those in need.

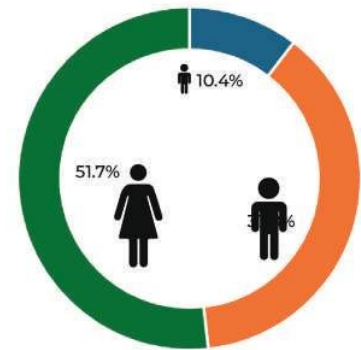
Areas Covered

According to the World Bank, Pakistan's poverty rate rose to 25.3% in 2024, with rural areas hit hardest due to limited economic opportunities. In response, OTS prioritized the most vulnerable regions during this reporting period, reaching rural communities in Sindh-Hajji Qaiser Lajard (Mirpur Khas), Mian Nazam (Tando Adam), Dhoro Morri (Umerkot) and underserved areas in Faisalabad, Punjab.



Beneficiaries

Through this campaign, we have reached a total of 202 beneficiaries. Among them were 104 women (including widows, domestic workers, and Bricklin workers), 77 men (comprising laborers, daily wage earners, and Bricklin workers), and 21 orphaned children. 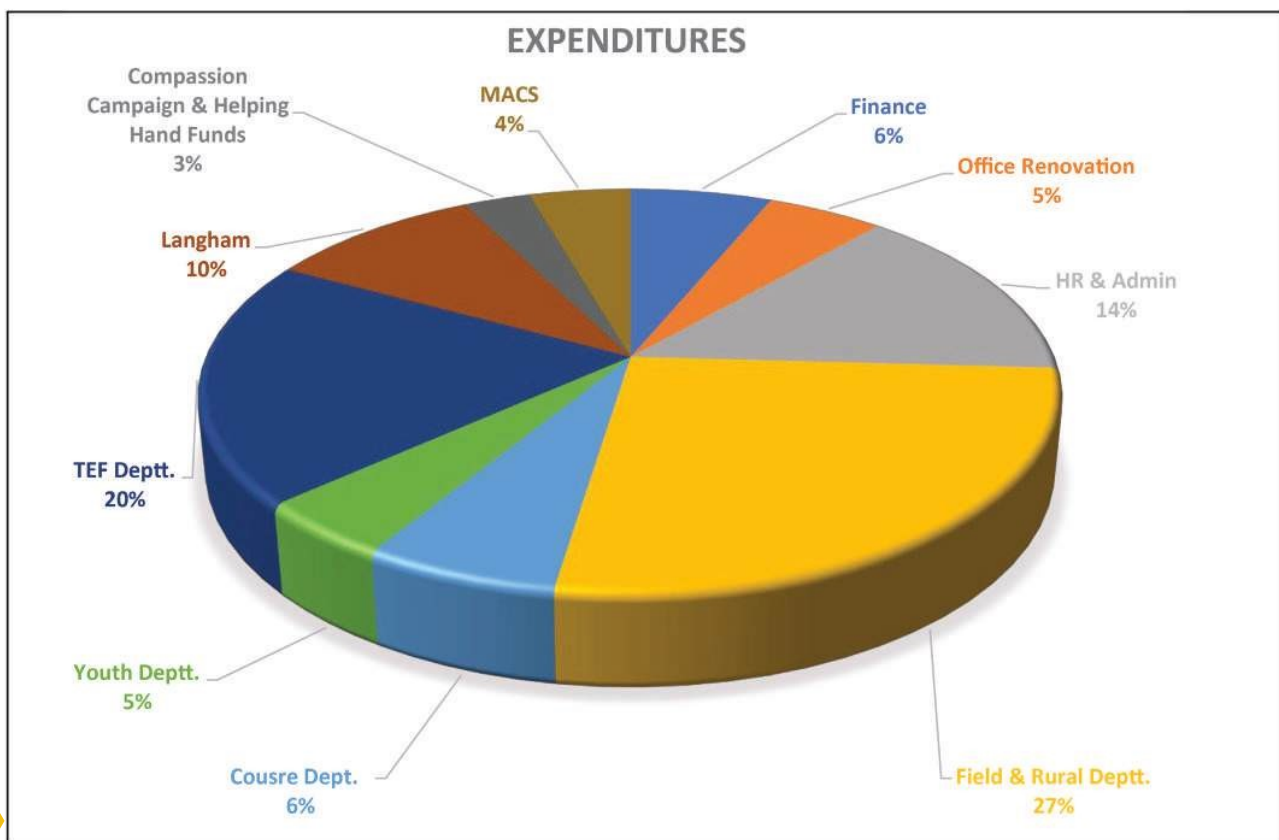
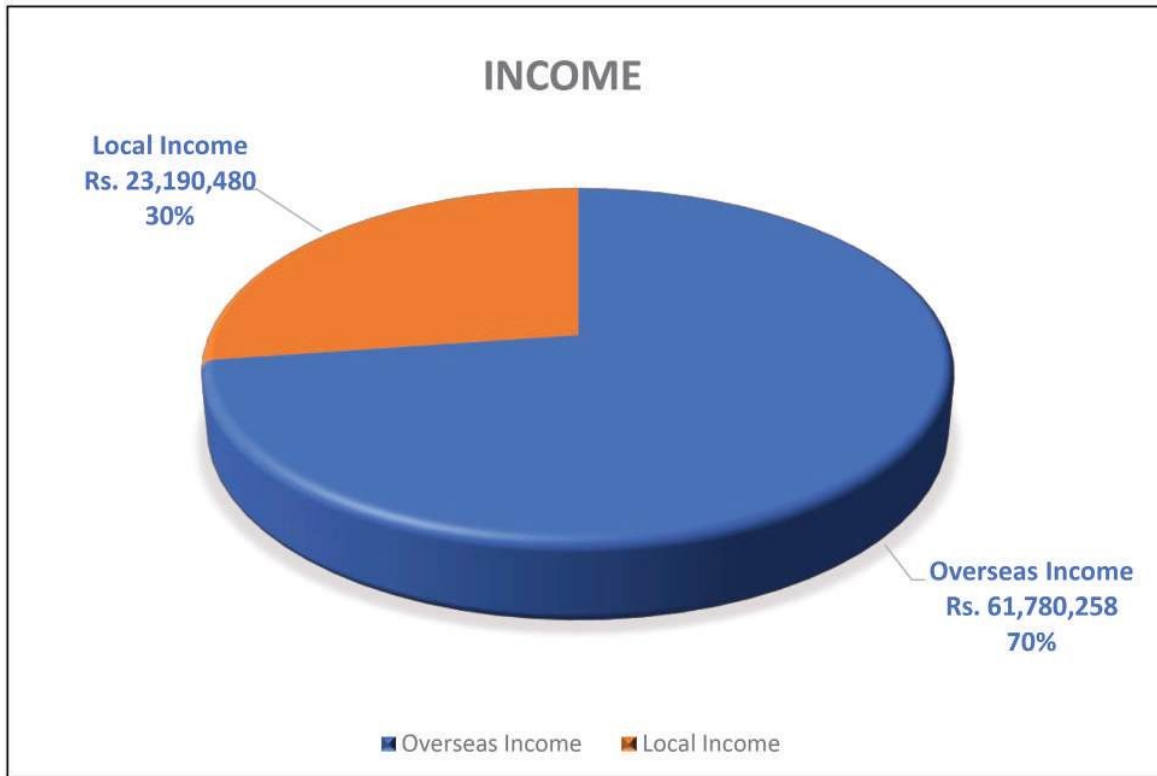

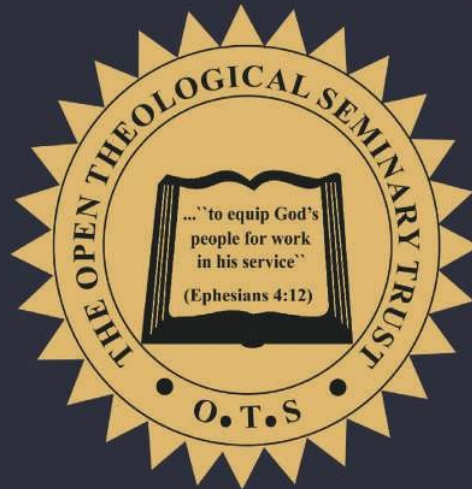
